O di<u>vine</u>ly-wise father <u>Theo</u>phanes, / Named for the <u>Theo</u>phany of Christ, / Thou didst follow in His <u>life</u>-bearing <u>foo</u>tsteps / And abandoning all the beautiful <u>things</u> of this life / Thou didst come to look upon Him with di<u>vine</u> zeal /// As the greatest inspi<u>ra</u>tion of thy life.

O di<u>vinely-wise father Theophanes</u>, / Thou didst endure the bitterness of exile and <u>poverty</u> / Not sparing thy body for the sake of defending the <u>precious icons</u>. / And being shut in prison by Leo in his <u>fury</u>, Thou didst make feeble his vain counsels and malicious thoughts, /// O all-praised <u>Theophanes</u>.

Rejoice, O receptacle of the <u>light</u> divine, / For His Light hath risen upon us from thy <u>most</u>-pure womb! / Rejoice, O brilliant star and <u>veil</u> of <u>ho</u>liness, / For thy radiance illumines all the ends of the <u>earth</u> with thy grace! / Rejoice, O pure beginning of our sal<u>va</u>tion, /// For thou art an awesome mystery, beyond all words, to those who <u>hope</u> in thee!

Or the Stavrotheotokion: *(in the same Tone)*

"<u>What</u> is this <u>sight</u> that I see, / What do mine eyes behold, O <u>Ma</u>ster? / Thou, Who sustainest all creation, lifted <u>up on</u> the Tree, /

12 MARCH

Dost die granting <u>life</u> to all," / Cried the Theotokos, weeping, when she be<u>held</u> up<u>on</u> the Cross /// The God-man Who had ineffably shone <u>forth</u> from her.
