Commemoration of the Hieromartyr Cyprian, and the Holy Virgin Martyr Justina; and the Holy and Blessèd Andrew, the Fool-for-Christ.

Note: The Service to St. Andrew is served at Compline. - incomplete 7/2016

Vespers

At "Lord I call...," 6 stichera, in Tone 4: To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."

Anointed with the chrism of <u>prie</u>sthood / And the blood of <u>martyrdom</u>, / Thou didst draw <u>near</u> to God in perfection, O glorious <u>Cyprian</u>, / Thou manifestation of eloquence, and full blossoming of our <u>nature</u>, / Thou summit of wisdom, and right measure of Orthodox <u>teachings</u>, / Thou harmonious composer of liturgical <u>canons</u>, /// And the magnificence of the Church. *(twice)*

Writing of the Wisdom of God /

Who is the glory of those suffering and the crown of <u>martyrs</u> / Thy <u>words</u> encouraged them to prevail against all <u>torments</u>, / Being bound, stripped naked, and suffering through <u>bitter cold</u>, / Being wounded, and cast in prison, enduring <u>even unto death</u>, /// O most noble and hon'rable <u>Cyp</u>rian. (twice)

And this sticheron to the Martyr Justina, in the same Tone: (and melody)

With the Sign of the Cross and the hymns of the <u>Spi</u>rit / Thou didst oppose the enchantments of <u>demons</u>, / And didst pre<u>serve</u> thy virginity and presented thy<u>self</u> to Christ / As an invincible martyr; a sacred, most-holy <u>sacrifice</u>. / From Him thou didst receive thy crown of <u>vi</u>ctory, /// O Justina, thou glory of martyrs and <u>vi</u>rgins. (twice)

Glory..., in Tone 2:

Truly renouncing the teachings of <u>error</u> / And the knowledge of <u>de</u>mons / Thou didst <u>arm</u> thyself with the Cross of sal<u>va</u>tion / O blessèd <u>Cy</u>prian. / And having discarded the books of magic thou didst discard the <u>old</u> man; / Then the <u>kno</u>wledge of God in Trinity, One in Essence, came to <u>dwell</u> in thee. /// Beseech Him, O holy hierarch, together with the angels, that our <u>souls</u> may be saved.

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Now and ever..., Theotokion, or this Stavrotheotokion, in Tone 2:

Beholding thee nailed to the wood of the Cross, O Jesus / She who knew not wedlock cried out weeping: / "O sweet <u>Child</u>, Thou Unapproachable Light of the All-unoriginate <u>Fa</u>ther, / Why hast Thou left me alone, who gave <u>birth</u> to Thee? But hasten Thou and <u>glo</u>rify Thyself /// That they who glorify Thy divine sufferings may receive divine <u>glory</u>!"

Or Dogmatic Theotokion in the Tone of the Week if a Resurrection service.

The Apostikha from the Octoechos.

Glory..., in Tone 2:

Let us praise the hierarch <u>Cy</u>prian, / The lamp of the <u>ra</u>diance of God, / Who by his <u>words</u> and deeds became a <u>se</u>cond Paul, / Who now rejoices with the <u>angels</u>, / And having received his crown of incorruption from the One God in <u>Tri</u>nity /// He ever prays that our <u>souls</u> may be saved.

Now and ever..., Theotokion, or the Stavrotheokion, in the Same Tone: *To the melody, "When from the tree...."*

Beholding Thee, her Lamb being voluntarily led to the <u>slaughter</u> / The caste ewe-lamb wept and <u>cried</u> aloud: / "What dost thou <u>do</u>, striving to make me <u>childless</u>, O Christ, / Who gave birth to Thee, the De<u>li</u>verer of all? / Yet I glorify Thine ineffable grace past all understanding, O Lover of <u>ma</u>nkind.

The Troparion of the Hieromartyr, in Tone 4:

Like the Apostles in <u>char</u>acter, / A successor on their throne, O divinely-in<u>spi</u>red One / Through visions thou didst <u>find</u> thy work / Rightly dividing the <u>word</u> of truth. / Thou didst suffer for the <u>sake</u> of the faith / Even to the <u>she</u>dding of thy blood /// O Hieromartyr Cyprian, pray to Christ God that our <u>souls</u> may be saved.

The Kontakion of Ss. Cyprian and Justina, Tone 1:

Thou wast converted from the art of <u>sorcery</u> / To the knowledge of God, O divinely-<u>wise</u> one, / And was made <u>manifest</u> to the world as a phy<u>si</u>cian most wise / Granting healing to <u>those</u> who <u>honor</u> thee. / O <u>Cy</u>prian together with Jus<u>ti</u>na, /// Entreat the Master and Lover of mankind that He may <u>save</u> our souls.
