Return of the Relics of the Apostle Bartholomew; the Holy Apostle Titus of the Seventy.

Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 6 stichera,

3 stichera of Saint Bartholomew, in Tone 4: *To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."*

Let us fervently bless the glorious Bar<u>tho</u>lomew, / Who is as <u>ra</u>diant as the Sun, / <u>Shi</u>ning as a never-<u>se</u>tting star, / Which animates the heavens proclaiming the saving <u>glo</u>ry of God; / A divine preacher, a light to the <u>na</u>tions / A river flowing with a stream of under<u>standing</u> /// Satisfying the thirst of the <u>fai</u>thful.

Thy journeys took place in the sea, O apostle, / Beyond the under<u>standing of men, /</u> For <u>when</u> thy reliquary was cast into the sea, O Bar<u>tho</u>lomew, / Thou didst make thy way into the West, O <u>glo</u>rious one, / And a stream of holy <u>ma</u>rtyrs from the East / Followed thy passage on both <u>sides</u> of the shore /// Rendering thee homage at the command of the <u>Ma</u>ster of all.

Thy wondrous travels, O apostle Bar<u>tho</u>lomew, / Sanctified the <u>wa</u>ters / And <u>brought</u> thee to the Island of <u>Lipari</u> / Streaming myrrh from thy relics and healing incurable dis<u>eases</u> / Becoming there a haven of salvation for the <u>fai</u>thful, / Their deliverer and inter<u>ce</u>ssor /// Before the King and <u>Sa</u>vior of all.

And 3 stichera of Saint Titus, in the same Tone: *To the melody, "Thou hast given a sign...."*

Thou didst trouble the sea of idolatry O <u>ble</u>ssèd one / By proclaiming One God in three <u>Persons;</u> / And those <u>drowning</u> in the depths of un<u>go</u>dliness / Thou didst guide to the calm <u>haven of faith;</u> / Thereby earning thy reward in heaven, O <u>Ti</u>tus, / Beseeching the <u>Lo</u>ver of man ///

25 AUGUST

On behalf of those who praise thee.

Like the Sun thou didst traverse the earth, O blessèd <u>Ti</u>tus, / Shedding rays of light upon those in gloomy <u>sha</u>dows / For thy <u>mind</u> was illumined with divine <u>ra</u>diance; / And together with the a<u>po</u>stle Paul, / Thou didst deliver the world from the <u>da</u>rkness of night. / Therefore we bless thee as a God-pleasing <u>hi</u>erarch, /// A fervent intercessor and an a<u>po</u>stle divine.

Setting forth from the <u>isle</u> of Crete / And returning <u>home</u> again, / Thou didst establish there the <u>True</u> Faith / Built on an unshakeable foun<u>dation;</u> / And through the divine power of <u>heaven</u> / Thou didst instruct the <u>fai</u>thful, / O blessèd Titus, first hierarch of Crete, and the com<u>pa</u>nion of Paul, /// And the consolation of the <u>fai</u>thful,

Glory..., in Tone 1:

For<u>saking every ea</u>rthly thing, / Thou didst go and <u>fo</u>llow Christ; / And bearing the <u>sign</u> of the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit / Thou wast sent by Him unto the <u>per</u>ishing <u>na</u>tions / To <u>turn</u> the people to the light of the <u>kno</u>wledge of God; / And completing thy course by enduring great suffering and <u>torments</u> / Thou didst co<u>mmend</u> thy soul to <u>Christ</u> God. /// Pray to Him, most blessèd Bartholomew, that He grant us great <u>mercy</u>.

Now and ever..., Theotokion.

Or the Stavrotheotokion, in Tone 2:

Beholding thee nailed to the wood of the Cross, O <u>Je</u>sus / She who knew not wedlock cried out <u>weeping</u>: / "O sweet <u>Child</u>, Thou Unapproachable Light of the All-unoriginate <u>Fa</u>ther, / Why hast Thou left me alone, who gave <u>birth</u> to Thee? But hasten Thou and <u>glo</u>rify Thyself /// That they who glorify Thy divine sufferings may receive divine <u>glory</u>!"

The Troparion of the Apostles, in Tone 3:

RELICS OF APOSTLE ST. BARTHOLOMEW; APOSTLE TITUS

O holy apostles, / Intercede with our <u>me</u>rciful God, / That He may <u>grant to</u> our souls /// The re<u>mission of our</u> trans<u>gre</u>ssions.

The Kontakion of Saint Bartholomew, in Tone 4: *To the melody, "Thou hast appeared today...."*

Thou hast appeared as a great and shining <u>Sun</u> of the Church, / Illumining with divine radiance and wondrous miracles all who sing thy <u>praises</u> /// O Bartholomew, a<u>po</u>stle of the Lord.
