The Commemoration of the Holy Apostles Bartholomew and Barnabas.

Vespers

After the Introductory Psalm, "Blessèd is the man...," the first Kathisma.

At "Lord, I call...," 8 stichera, in Tone 4: To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."

Those drowning in the depths of folly and <u>vanity</u> / Were pulled from the depths of <u>disbelief</u> / By the <u>net</u> of thy words, O all-blessèd a<u>postle</u>, / And through faith thou didst lead them to <u>Christ</u> God, / Who hath given thee <u>such</u> grace /// As a divine disciple and speaker of the mysteries, O Apostle Bar<u>tho</u>lomew. *(twice)*

The Sun of glory, Jesus <u>Christ</u> our God, / Sent thee forth as a <u>ray</u> of light / For the per<u>fe</u>cting of the world, O <u>glo</u>rious one, / And thou didst mightily dispel the gloom of <u>go</u>dlessness / And enlightened all those sitting in the darkness of <u>ig</u>norance, / Thus making them <u>heirs</u> of the Light, /// O Bartholomew, <u>wise</u> in God. (*twice*)

Submitting to the will of Him whose will all <u>things</u> obey / And faithfully emulating Him as a <u>tea</u>cher of truth, / Rejoicing, thou didst drink of the <u>cup</u> of death / Through thy suffering <u>on</u> the cross. / Now thou standest before Him, the object of thy <u>grea</u>test desire, /// Rejoicing together with the angels and the apostles, O glorious Bar<u>tho</u>lomew.

And 3 stichera of the Apostle Barnabas, in the same Tone: *To the melody, "Thou hast given a sign...."*

Thou hast received invincible authority and <u>power</u> / Over the demons, O Apostle <u>Ba</u>rnabas, / To drive out the princes of darkness in the <u>name</u> of Christ; / Thou didst go about the earth shedding <u>light</u> like the sun, / And being the first of thy company to arrive in the great <u>city</u> of Rome, /// Thou was the first to preach there the salvific <u>a</u>dvent of Christ.

Emulating the pre-eternal <u>goo</u>dness / And the natural and divinely-ordained <u>way</u> of life / Thou didst <u>live</u> thy life in thine essence as a <u>go</u>dly man / And rightly wast thou named, "the son of conso<u>lation</u>," / For by the goodness of character and the <u>pu</u>rity of thy mind / Thou didst reveal thyself to be a true disciple of Christ.

Being an instrument well-tuned by the action of the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit / O Apostle <u>Ba</u>rnabas, / Thou was en<u>tru</u>sted with the calling the Gentiles to the <u>kno</u>wledge of Christ, / Reforming them by thy <u>words</u> and deeds / And illumining all to confess the true divinity of <u>Je</u>sus Christ, /// The <u>Sa</u>vior of our souls.

Glory..., in Tone 6: (By Byzantius)

O all-praised <u>Ba</u>rnabas, /

Thou radiant vessel of the Spirit and son of consolation, / Even before Paul thou wast the foremost of the seventy disciples / And with Paul thou didst preach the Gospel to the <u>ends</u> of the earth. / And completing the course of thy life of <u>good</u> deeds / Thou didst present thyself as a first-fruit offering to thy <u>tea</u>cher, Christ. / Beseech Him ceaselessly we pray thee, O glorious apostle, /// That He may grant our souls peace and great <u>me</u>rcy.

Now and ever..., the Feast, or this Theotokion, in Tone 6:

Who will not bless thee, O Most Holy <u>Virgin?</u> / Who will not sing of thy most pure child-<u>bea</u>ring? / The Only-begotten Son shone timelessly from the <u>Fa</u>ther, / But from thee He was ineffably in<u>ca</u>rnate; / God by nature, yet <u>man</u> for our sake; / Not two persons, but one in two <u>na</u>tures. / Entreat Him, O pure and all-blessèd <u>La</u>dy /// To have mercy on our souls.

Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the king. ¹⁸Servants, be subject to your masters with all fear, not only to the good and gentle, but also to the harsh.

¹⁹For this is commendable, if because of conscience toward God one endures grief, suffering wrongfully. ²⁰For what glory is it if, when you are beaten for your faults, you take it patiently? But when you do good and suffer for it, if you take it patiently, this is acceptable with God. ²¹For even unto this you were called because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow His steps: ²²"who did not sin, neither was guile found in His mouth"; ²³who, when He was reviled, did not revile in return; when He suffered, did not threaten, but committed Himself to Him that judges righteously; ²⁴who Himself bore our sins in His own Body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live unto righteousness.

After the 1st Kathisma, the Sessional Hymn, in Tone 1: *To the melody, "Thy tomb, O Savior*...."

Let us <u>praise</u> thee, O <u>Virgin</u>, / The bush unconsumed by fire which <u>Mo</u>ses beheld; / The radiant <u>cloud</u>, the ark and the <u>mountain of God</u>; The great vessel and spiritual <u>banquet well-pleasing to God</u>; / The most-<u>sple</u>ndid and im<u>pa</u>ssible gate; /// And the palace of the <u>King</u> on high.

After the 2nd Kathisma, the Sessional Hymn, in Tone 4: To the melody, "Thou hast appeared today...."

Like stars you enlighten the <u>ends</u> of the earth / With the splendid radiance of divine <u>do</u>ctrines / Through your <u>ho</u>ly preaching, O ye a<u>po</u>stles of the Lord /// And initiates of the mysteries of <u>heaven</u>. (*twice*)

Glory..., now and ever... Theotokion:

Let us bless the Theotokos, O ye <u>fai</u>thful, / Our speedy deliverance in time of trouble and mis<u>fo</u>rtune, / And our <u>he</u>lper and fervent inter<u>ce</u>ssor before God, /// For through her we have been delivered from co<u>rruption</u>.

We magnify thee, // O holy apostles Bartholomew and Barnabas, / and we honor thy labors and sufferings, / which thou didst endure in proclaiming Christ.

The heavens are telling the glory of God, and the firmament proclaims His handiwork. The heavens shall confess Thy wonders, O Lord, and Thy truth in the assembly of the Saints!

Ode 1

The Canon of the Holy Apostle Bartholomew, in Tone 2

Irmos: In days of old a mighty force sent the armies of Pharaoh into the deep sea; the Word Incarnate hath destroyed pernicious sin, the Most-glorious Lord has been greatly glorified.

Refrain: Holy Apostle of Christ, Bartholomew, pray to God for us!

God, who knoweth all things, having beheld thy mind, chose thee, O all-laudable Bartholomew, and enlisted thee in the ranks of the apostles, thus illumining thy heart with grace.

Ascending to the heights of virtue, as an apostle thou wast then enriched by the tongue of fire breathed forth by the Spirit, and with it thou didst burn up the refuse of impiety and ignorance. O most-richly blessed one.

Thou wast truly shown to be a God-bearing ember afire with the radiance of the divine Spirit, O all-praised Bartholomew, consuming the chaff of falsehood and enlightening the hearts of those who hymn thee with faith.

Theotokion: **O** pure Lady, tell us how didst thou come to be mother, radiant with the seals of thy virginity intact? She replied: "Do not plumb the depths! I gave birth to the One God and Lord of all, who testing me, transcended nature."

The Canon of the Holy Apostle Barnabas, in the same Tone, and having the same Irmos.

Irmos: In days of old a mighty force....

Refrain: Holy Apostle of Christ, Barnabas pray to God for us!

As thou art indeed a good man and revealed as a son of consolation, dispel the affliction of my soul and the soul-destroying grief of sin so that, full of gladness, I may hymn and praise thee.

O richly bless't Barnabas, being of the tribe of Levi, thou wast imbued the with the pure splendor of Christ the King of all who sprang forth from the tribe of Judah, and thou didst proclaim to all the new priesthood of the Law.

Glory...,

Thy splendid life proved thee to be as second only to Him, who by His nature is the first of all Goodness, O all-wise and glorious Barnabas, thou son of divine consolation.

Now and ever...,

Theotokion: The divine choir of maidens praises thee, O Lady Theotokos, as the fairest of all women, for thou hast been adorned with the beauty of divinity, and in a manner past all understanding gavest birth to the Word, the Origin of beauty.

Thou comest like rain from heaven, watering the whole world parched by the darkness of ungodliness and quenching its thirst, O right-wondrous eye-witness of God, Bartholomew.

Thou didst put forth a spring of saving waters, O most honored Bartholomew, bringing forth as abundant fruit, the salvation of the nations.

O glorious Barnabas, we see thee as a welcome cloud bearing rain from the source of grace, causing rivers of nourishment to flow for us.

Seeing thee, O glorious Barnabas, burning like a beacon of divers splendors, the almighty power of the Spirit appointed thee a minister of the mysteries of Christ.

Enlightened by the grace of Thy Cross, O Master, Barnabas and Paul, the divinelywise and right glorious apostles brought the Gentiles to Thee through faith.

Theotokion: Thou art like a pure lily, O most pure Theotokos, shining forth amid the thorns in the radiance of thy virginity.

Katavasia.

The Kontakion of the Apostle Barnabas, in Tone 2: To the melody "Today the Virgin...."

Thou wast a <u>most</u> true servant <u>of</u> the Lord / And as the foremost of the seventy a<u>po</u>stles, / Thou didst shine forth in thy <u>prea</u>ching with Paul, / Proclaiming Christ the Savior <u>unto all</u>; /// Therefore, O Barnabas, we celebrate thy <u>me</u>m'ry with <u>so</u>ngs of praise.

Ikos: The Son of God, who is equally eternal with the Spirit, who in His good pleasure

became incarnate on earth as a man, granting dispassion through His honorable suffering, ordained thee an apostle, a herald of the Faith wise in discourse and rightwondrous, and a true worshiper of the Trinity, O blessèd Barnabas. Therefore, the precious and radiant morning star hath shone forth, illumining the faithful, as we worthily celebrate thy blessèd memory.

Sessional Hymn of the Apostle Bartholomew, in Tone 8: *To the melody "Of Wisdom...."*

Now and ever... from the Pentecostarion, or this Theotokion, in the same Tone: *(and melody)*

As the pure <u>bride</u> of the Cre<u>a</u>tor, / And the Mother of the <u>Savior</u>, / As one who <u>knew</u> not <u>we</u>dlock: / The all-praised receptacle of the essence of the <u>Co</u>mforter, / Hasten to deliver me who has become the abode of <u>e</u>vil, / The plaything of <u>de</u>mons and their <u>e</u>vil spite; / And make me the bright dwelling place of <u>vi</u>rtues, / O radiant and incor<u>ruptible one!</u> / Drive away the <u>clouds</u> of my <u>pa</u>ssions, /// And through thy prayers, make me worthy to partake of the things of <u>heaven</u>.

The Canon of the Holy Apostle Bartholomew

Irmos: Thou hast come from a virgin, not as a minister nor an angel, but as the Lord Himself incarnate; to me a human Thou hast brought salvation; so that I cry to Thee: Glory to Thy power, O Lord!

Protected by the Cross of the Lord, O most-excellent Bartholomew, thou didst destroy the savage pride of the demons, and by thy preaching thou didst dispel their souldestroying deceit.

Christ showed thee forth as a light to the world shining with divine glory, enlightening all Creation with divine knowledge, O Bartholomew, most-pleasing to God.

As a glorious steed pulling the chariot of the Word, didst thou dismay the roiling sea of idolatry, extinguishing the bitter vestiges of godlessness.

Theotokion: Healing the ancient transgression of Eve, O immaculate and all-pure one, the All-glorious God took up His abode within thee and restored me, a fallen man.

The Canon of the Holy Apostle Barnabas

Irmos: Thou hast come from a virgin....

Following the commandments of the Master, O all-praised apostle Barnabas, thou didst distribute all thy property among the poor and became an eloquent preacher of Christ.

Thou didst attain the utmost beauty of the virtues, and having found Paul an eloquent and godly apostle, thou didst proclaim together with him the unfathomable mysteries of God.

Passing over the ends of the earth in resplendent glory like the sun, O most-honored Barnabas, like Paul thou didst illumine all with thy words of grace.

Having shared in the sufferings of the Savior, O all-praised Barnabas, thou art now glorified with Him in the mansions of heaven, delighting in the gladness past all understanding.

Theotokion: The curse of our first mother Eve was annulled through thee, O mostimmaculate Lady, for thou gavest birth to the eternal Word incarnate, who hath crowned the world with blessings.

Ode 5

The Canon of the Holy Apostle Bartholomew

Irmos: Thou didst come as a mediator between God and man, O Christ our God, for through Thee, O Master, we have found the way from the darkness of ignorance to Thy Father, the source of light.

Coming to Christ, the uncreated Light who appeared among us mortal creatures, thou didst first converse with Him, O apostle, and wast then illumined by the rays of His divine glory.

Thy life was like a divine mist of dew bringing healing to mankind, O all-blessèd Bartholomew, and in the words of the prophet, thou didst lay to waste the land of godlessness.

Thou wast like a radiant candle burning next to the brilliance of the first-created Light, O thou eye-witness of the Word, O Bartholomew most-wise.

Theotokion: Mindful of thy words, we call thee blessèd, for through thee, O pure Lady, have we found blessedness, and have found enrichment in the truly blessèd life.

The Canon of the Holy Apostle Barnabas

Irmos: Thou didst come as a mediator....

Having passed through the shadow of the law shining with grace, thou didst tell of its fulfillment to the Gentiles enlightening them by preaching Christ.

Armed with the power of the Holy Spirit, O apostle, thou didst cast down the spirits of evil, delivering the world from their malice.

Thou didst become like the voice of one crying in the wilderness of barren nations, O richly-bless't Barnabas, proclaiming to all the ineffable mystery of the divine incarnation of God.

Theotokion: **B**ehold, O all-pure Theotokos, beyond all reason and understanding thou hast conceived Christ God in thy womb, as the prophet Isaiah foretold, and beyond all nature thou gavest birth to Him, O Mother of God.

Ode 6

The Canon of the Holy Apostle Bartholomew

Irmos: Compassed about in the depths of sin, I entreat the unfathomable depth of compassion; bring me out of corruption, O Lord.

Receiving the grace of working miracles and enriched with the power to perform healings, O Bartholomew most-wise, thou didst tend to the flock of the Gentiles.

Thy fiery tongue burnt up all deception like withered grass, O most glorious Bartholomew, and hath made the hearts of the faithful to shine with thy preaching divine.

Having the unoriginate Word and the well-spring of Wisdom as thy Teacher, O glorious preacher of God, through grace didst thou confound the wisdom of the world.

Theotokion: Thou gavest birth in a manner transcending nature, O Virgin, and didst remain eternally virgin, revealing by thine image and example the true divinity of thy Son and God.

The Canon of the Holy Apostle Barnabas

Irmos: Compassed about in the depths of sin....

When thou, O Christ God, didst rise upon the earth as the Sun of Righteousness, thou didst illumine Barnabas and Paul with the rays of Thy glory, O Master.

Thou wast like a blade wondrously severing the withered weeds of delusion at their root, O divinely-eloquent Barnabas.

Ikos: Thou wast truly like the heavens declaring through the Holy Spirit the glory of God, O eye-witness and apostle of God, who shone forth like a blazing sun upon the world dispelling the gloominess of deception by divine grace. Therefore, we entreat thee and offer our prayer: Enlighten the blinded eyes of our souls with divine rays of light, O richly-bless't one, and grant to us the words with which to open our mouths and joyously sing the praises of thy memory, O Bartholomew, apostle of the Lord.

Irmos: The profane command of a lawless tyrant made the flames to rise exceedingly, but Christ sent the dew

of the Spirit to the godly youths; blessèd is He and most glorious.

Thou didst reveal to the whole world the great mystery of the divine incarnation, which none can fully understand nor attain to, O Bartholomew, and which, though ineffable, is accessible and credible to the faithful alone.

O Bartholomew, in thy purity, thou didst roll like a stone smashing through the walls of vanity and error, and didst reveal thyself as an immovable foundation for the Church, ever preserving it unshaken.

Thou didst make thyself an image divine, O Bartholomew, using the virtues as thy pen. Therefore, as a divine apostle, didst thou preach to all the great and celebrated advent of Christ.

Theotokion: When she beheld suspended upon the Tree the unplanted Cluster of grapes which had sprouted forth within her womb, the most pure Lady cried aloud: O my sweet child, pour forth the sweet new wine whereby the intoxication of the passions is dispelled.

The Canon of the Holy Apostle Barnabas

Irmos: The profane command....

In holiness didst thou, O Barnabas, declare the One who resteth in the Holies to be the Son of God, co-unoriginate and co-enthroned with the Father, and who, becoming man, wrought our salvation.

Like bolts of lightning flashing with divine splendor did the all-honorable Barnabas and the God-pleasing Paul shine forth as preachers of Christ, illumining the assembly of the nations with the word of grace.

Thy homeland rejoices having nurtured thee, O blessèd Barnabas, for having put thee forth as a shoot for Christ, it has caused the flower of the word of grace to bloom. By thy prayers, deliver her and us from our present captivity.

Theotokion: Direct my life and guide it to thy tranquil haven, O most pure Lady, who gave birth to God, the source of all good things, who granteth abundant goodness to all the faithful.

Irmos: In Babylon of old by the command of God, the fiery furnace worked in a double way: it burned the Chaldeans while it refreshed the faithful who sang: Bless the Lord, all you works of the Lord!

Irmos: In Babylon of old....

O our Benefactor and Giver of life, thou didst summon thy mighty steeds, the glorious Barnabas and the wondrous Paul to stir the sea of the Gentiles, driving away the falsehood of idolatry by the doctrines of divine piety.

O Comforter, Almighty Spirit, Thou as God didst set within Thy Church shining beacons to proclaim Thy power together with the Father and the Son, while crying out: Bless the Lord, all you works of the Lord!

Thou didst shine forth into the world like a radiant sun, O Barnabas well-pleasing to God, for by clearly conversing with the spiritual Sun, thou wast set aflame, and shining with His glory like a second sun, didst thou reveal to mankind the power of His mystery.

Having illumined the whole world with thy teachings, thou didst rightly attain to the ineffable blessedness on high, O all ven'rable Barnabas, and didst receive a splendid crown in the mansions of heaven.

Let us bless the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, the Lord!

Theotokion: Thou wast born of a Virgin Mother, O Word of God, that Thou mightest abolish the primal curse and the condemnation to death of our first mother, Eve, thus granting life eternal and everlasting unto us all.

We praise, bless, and worship the Lord, singing and exalting Him throughout all ages.

Ode 9

Irmos: The Son of the eternal Father, God the Lord incarnate of the Virgin, hath appeared to us to give light to those in darkness and to gather those who had gone astray; so we magnify thee, O Theotokos.

As a servant and eye-witness of the Word, as both His disciple and godly preacher, thou hast been counted worthy to abide now with Him, as the Word and All-good One truthfully promised thee.

Standing now, illuminated by the immaterial light, before the throne of the Master, O divinely-wise Bartholomew, thou keepest watch over those who praise thee, delivering them from all passion and evil circumstance.

Irmos: The Son of the eternal Father....

O apostle Barnabas, thou didst become a bright luminary through thy virtues, and now thou standest before the Light divine in heaven. Beseech the Master to grant peace to the world and to save the Church which thou helped form.

Thou didst truly consume the philosophers' malice with the flame of thy wisdom, O divinely-inspired Barnabas, in that thou hast within thee a well-spring of divine grace. Therefore, we celebrate thine all-holy memory on this festive day.

Theotokion: Thou, O Lady, art like the dawning of the morning, shining with the rays of virginity amidst the night of life, and revealing to us the East and the rising of the Spiritual Sun of Righteousness, O most pure Mother of God.

The Exapostilarion of the apostles:

Come, O ye people, and let us praise the apostles of Christ and preachers of the Faith, the godly Bartholomew and Barnabas the wise, for they pray to Christ on behalf of our souls. *(twice)*

Glory..., now and ever..., the Exapostilarion from the Pentecostarion, or this Theotokion:

O pure and holy Lady, who alone among mothers knew not a man, as thou art our hope and deliverance, entreat thou our Savior who was born of thee, that He save the world from deception, tribulation, and all sorrow.

At the Praises, 4 stichera, in Tone 4: To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."

Jesus our God, the Sun of <u>righteousness</u> / Sent thee forth as a ray of great <u>bri</u>lliance / Unto all the whole <u>world</u>, O divinely-wise a<u>po</u>stle, / To dispel the gloominess of malice and enlighten those hearts darkened by <u>ignorance</u> / And by the assaults of <u>pa</u>ssions, /// O richly-bless't apostle Bart<u>ho</u>lomew. (twice)

Thou wast a pure vessel of the <u>Trinity</u> /

Lustrous with the splendor of the virtues, O <u>Ba</u>rnabas; /

And receiving in thy heart Its radiance and the splendid light of the Sun /

Thou didst reflect them upon all the ends of the earth ///

Illumining those who sat in the darkness of ignorance, O God-pleasing apostle.

Like the clouds from on high, O <u>ble</u>ssed ones, / You shower the rains of heaven upon the <u>ends</u> of the earth / And <u>wa</u>ter the souls of the faithful with <u>grace</u> divine / Drowning the thorns of un<u>go</u>dliness / And making fruitful the <u>souls</u> of men. / Therefore, we honor you and <u>praise</u> you, /// O Bartholomew and Barnabas, apostles of the Lord.

Glory..., in Tone 5: (by Byzantius)

O Apostles, the admiration of <u>all</u> the earth! / You were foretold in the <u>Go</u>spels: / You are the <u>fruit</u> of the true vine of the <u>Wi</u>sdom of God, / Of <u>Him</u> that is God, the Word of the <u>Fa</u>ther, /

O Bartholomew, disciple of the Lord, / Thou didst appear to the world as a shining star / Enlightening with the splendor of thy teachings / And the wonder of thy miracles /// All those who honor thee.

The Prokeimenon, in Tone 8: Their proclamation is gone out into all the earth, / and their words to the ends of the universe! *Verse:* The heavens are telling the glory of God, and the firmament proclaims His handiwork!

The Epistle: (28) Acts 11:19-30

The Alleluia, in Tone 1: The heavens shall confess Thy wonders, O Lord, and Thy truth in the assembly of the saints! *Verse:* God is glorified in the council of the saints.

The Gospel: (51) Luke 10:16-21

Communion Hymn: Their proclamation is gone out into all the earth, and their words to the ends of the universe. Alleluia....
