Having desired the glory that is without beginning and <u>pa</u>sseth not, / Thou didst scorn the glory that is transitory and <u>pe</u>rishes; / Having <u>taken</u> up thy cross, thou didst follow Him Who had been <u>cru</u>cified, / And thou didst subdue the flesh with ascetic <u>struggles</u>. /// Therefore we celebrate thy <u>me</u>mory, O James.

Having crucified the worldly <u>pa</u>ssions, O James / Thou didst preserve thy soul in purity, untainted by low things, O <u>fa</u>ther; / And thou didst <u>soar</u> to the heavens with mystical <u>vi</u>sions / Thou didst foresee thy life in these visions, O <u>ve</u>n'rable one /// O most faithful and sincere <u>friend</u> of Christ.
