Translation of the Relics of our Father among the Saints Nicephorus (Nikiphorus), Patriarch of Constantinople.

Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 3 stichera, in Tone 1: To the melody, "Joy of the ranks of heaven...."

The billowing <u>clouds</u> of thy <u>wisdom</u> /
Shower down upon the earth a <u>fountain</u> of truth /
From which <u>we</u> the faithful draw <u>sweetness</u> /
Spurning the pol<u>lution</u> of <u>heresies</u>, ///
Like the waters at the fountain of Meribah.

Thy most pure <u>body</u> in the <u>grave</u> / Did not suffer cor<u>ruption</u> / But appeared <u>whole</u>, O all blessèd Ni<u>ki</u>phorus, / Presenting it with care the <u>O</u>rthodox <u>fai</u>thful rejoiced /// As they blessed thee, O divinely <u>wise</u> one.

By thy divine <u>deeds</u> thou didst become a <u>temple</u> of God, /
And now the Church named after the Apostles has re<u>ceived</u> thee /
Who wast <u>called</u> to share in the apostolic honor, O all-<u>blessèd</u> one ///
For in a sacred manner thou didst bury the foul deceit of <u>he</u>resy.

Glory..., now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone: (and melody)

I am <u>tossed</u> about on the sea of trans<u>gressions</u> / And with recourse to the calm <u>harbor</u> of thy prayers / I cry <u>out</u> to thee, O <u>Mo</u>ther of God: / Stretch out the right hand of thy <u>might</u> to thy <u>servant</u>, /// O all-pure one, and <u>save</u> me.

Or the Stavrotheotokion: (in the same Tone)

When she be<u>held</u> the Lamb lifted up up<u>on</u> the Cross, /
The most pure Virgin cried out la<u>me</u>nting: /
O my <u>Sweet</u> Child /
What is this new and all-<u>glo</u>rious <u>won</u>der? /
How is it that Thou who holdest all things in the <u>ho</u>llow of Thy hand, ///
Art nailed to the tree in the flesh?

13 MARCH

The General Troparion of the Hierarchs, in Tone 4: (none given in the Menaion)

In truth thou wast revealed to thy flock as a <u>rule</u> of faith, / A model of humility and teacher of <u>abstinence</u>, / So thou didst win the heights of humility, riches by <u>po</u>verty; / O holy hierarch, father Ni<u>ki</u>phorus, / Intercede with Christ our God to save our souls

The Kontakion of the Saint, in Tone 1: To the melody, "The choir of angels...."

The assembly of patriarchs honors thy holy memory, / With hymns of praise, O Ni<u>ki</u>phorus, / For it welcomed thy soul at thy repose, O glorious one. / Together with them the holy Church magnifies Christ the King /// Glorifying Him who alone loveth mankind.
