# Hieromartyr Nikon and 200 of his disciples martyred with him in Sicily.

## Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 3 stichera, in Tone 4: To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."

By grace, thou didst subjugate bodily pleasures, / And thy disobedient flesh / With the bridle of abstinence, O blessed one; / Having bravely vanquished the power of the enemy / By the power of the Spirit, / Thou didst become a commander of monastics /// Who always followed thy most wise and divine preaching. O father Nikon.

Having shone like the sun from the East /

O all-glorious one, /

Thou didst enlighten the whole universe with the brightness of thy miracles, /

Leading the ranks of thy disciples, bright like the stars. /

With strength thou didst suffer together with them, /

Having been cut down with the sword ///

And having placed thy soul in the hands of the master and King of all.

Neither hunger nor nakedness, / Nor wounds, nor misfortunes, nor truly imminent death / Were able to separate you from the love of God, / O wonder-worthy ones, / But like lambs led to the slaughter / Following after the Shepherd from the sunset to the never-waning rest of the heavenly kingdom /// You thereby reached it, O crown-bearing martyrs

# **Glory...** now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone: (and melody)

Keep me from evil transgressions / That I be not condemned, O Most Holy bride of God, / And through thy <u>prayers</u> deliver my humble <u>soul</u> from death; / That I may receive justification on the Day of Judgment / Which the assembly of the saints have already gained, / And show me cleansed through my tears and repentance /// Before the coming of the end.

#### 23 MARCH

### **Or the Stavrotheotokion, in the same Tone:** (and melody)

Seeing Thee nailed to the <u>Cross</u>, O Lord, / The ewe-lamb, Thy Mother, cried out in a<u>ma</u>zement: / '<u>What</u> is this sight, O Most-de<u>sired</u> Son? / What has the ungrateful assembly <u>done</u> to Thee / Having once delighted themselves in Thy many <u>mi</u>racles? /// But I glorify Thy ineffable condescension, O <u>Ma</u>ster!'

Or Dogmatic Theotokion if a Resurrection service.

### **The General Troparion of the Martyr, in Tone 4:** (None given in the Menaion)

Thy holy <u>ma</u>rtyrs, O Lord, / Through their sufferings received their incorruptible crowns from <u>Thee</u>, our God / For having Thy strength they laid low their <u>enemies</u> / And shattered the powerless boldness of <u>demons</u> /// Through their intercessions, O Christ God, <u>save</u> our souls.

### The Canon for the Saint, Tone 4,

having the acrostic: "I hymn thee, the namesake of victory, O blessèd one," the composition of Joseph. — incomplete as of 12/2013.
