At "Lord, I call...," 3 stichera, in Tone 4: To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."

Strengthened in the <u>Law</u> of God, /

With the <u>so</u>vereignty of thy thoughts, O <u>blessèd</u> one, /
And in holiness wast thou worthily a<u>nointed</u>, /
To become the ruler of thy rational sheep, O glorious one, ///

A divine intercessor and the adornment of hierarchs and martyrs.

Thou wast separated like a ram from thy flock, O blessèd <u>Ba</u>sil, / For preaching that Christ the King and our God /

Was sacrificed like an innocent lamb; /

And the evil emperor had thee unjustly slain /

And commanded that thou be cast in the sea ///

Thus bequeathing thee the kingdom of heaven and everlasting glory.

Being beheaded and cast into the sea, O blessèd Basil, /

And arriving whole at thy city of Amase-ia /

Do not disdain me, O all-pure one, in my sorrow. /

Seeing Thee the Lamb and <u>Shepherd</u> on the tree, /

26 APRIL

The ewe-lamb who gave birth to Thee lamented, /

O Longsuffering One? /
How art Thy hands and feet nailed by the transgressors, O Word? /

Like the apostles in <u>character</u>, /

Thou didst suffer for the <u>sake</u> of the faith /
Even to the <u>she</u>dding of thy blood ///
O hieromartyr Basil, pray to Christ God that our souls may be saved.
