The Reading from the General Epistle of James (1:1-12)

^{1:1}James, a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, to the twelve tribes that are scattered abroad: Greetings. ²My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into various temptations, 3knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. ⁴But let patience have its perfect work, that ye may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing. ⁵If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, Who gives to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him. ⁶But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for he who doubts is like a wave of the sea driven and tossed by the wind. ⁷For let not that man suppose that

he will receive anything from the Lord; ⁸he is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways. ⁹Let the lowly brother glory in his exaltation, ¹⁰but the rich in his humiliation, because as a flower of the field he will pass away. ¹¹For no sooner is the sun risen with a burning heat than it withers the grass; its flower falls, and its beautiful appearance perishes. So the rich man also will fade away in his pursuits. ¹²Blessèd is the man who endureth temptation; for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love Him.

The Reading from the General Epistle of James (1:13-27)

^{1:13}Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am tempted by God"; for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither does He tempt anyone. ¹⁴But each one is tempted when he is drawn away by his own desires and enticed. ¹⁵Then, when desire hath conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, brings forth death. ¹⁶Do not be deceived, my beloved brethren. ¹⁷Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow of turning. ¹⁸Of His own will He brought

us forth by the word of truth, that we should be a kind of first fruits of His creatures. ¹⁹So then, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath; ²⁰or the wrath of man worketh not the righteousness of God. ²¹Therefore lay aside all filthiness and overflow of wickedness, and receive with meekness the implanted word, which is able to save your souls. ²²But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves. ²³For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is

like unto a man observing his natural face in a mirror; ²⁴for he observes himself, and goes his way, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was. ²⁵But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one shall be blessed in

what he does. ²⁶If any man among you thinks he is religious, and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his own heart, this man's religion is useless. ²⁷Religion pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep himself unspotted from the world.

The Reading from the General Epistle of James (2:1-13)

^{2:1} My brethren, do not hold the faith of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory, with partiality. ²For if there should come into your assembly a man with gold rings, in fine apparel, and there should also come in a poor man in filthy clothes, ³ and you pay attention to the one wearing the fine clothes and say unto him, "Sit thou here in a good place," and say to the poor man, "Stand thou there," or, "Sit here at my footstool," 4have you not shown partiality among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts? ⁵Listen, my beloved brethren: Hath God not chosen the poor of this world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom which He promised to those who love Him? ⁶But ye have dishonored the poor man. Do not the rich oppress you and drag you into the courts? 7Do they not

blaspheme that noble name by which you are called? 8If ye fulfill the royal law according to the Scripture, "Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself," ye do well; ⁹but if ye show partiality, ye commit sin, and are convicted by the law as transgressors. ¹⁰For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet stumble in one point, he is guilty of all. 11For He who said, "Thou shalt not commit adultery," also said, "Thou shalt not kill." Now if thou commit no adultery, yet if thou kill, thou art become a transgressor of the law. 12So speak ye, and so do, as those who shall be judged by the law of liberty. ¹³For judgment is without mercy to the one who hath shown no mercy; and mercy triumphs over judgment.

James hath transcended the limitations of humanity, O Savior, for arrayed in Thy power as with a garment of light, he discharges rays of healing and miracles which illumine the ends of the earth with faith.

[In place of the Theotokion]: The radiant cloud of the Word, who shone forth as God in glory upon Mount Tabor, covered thee, O blessèd James, as thou wast found worthy to hear the voice of the Father proclaim the divine Sonship of Christ.

Ode 6

Irmos: The abyss of sin and the storm of temptations discomfit me, and I am cast into despair; but stretch forth Thy mighty hand to me as Thou didst to Peter, and save me, O Savior.

Ceaselessly dispensing streams of healing as from a well-spring overflowing with pious teachings of doctrine, thou dost illumine the souls of those who come to thee with faith and love, O wise and all-blessèd one.

The Master found thee to be a vessel brimming with His rich and just blessings, which He pours forth as gifts of the mysteries past all understanding, through thee, O minister of life-everlasting.

Being the true resurrection of the dead, the Master, who chose to assume mortality for our sake, selected thee, O blessèd initiate of His mysteries, to assist Him on the night He was betrayed.

- 7. The tranquility of thy spotless soul was known to the Master even before He called thee, O blessèd James; and thou wast shown forth as most pleasing to Him, becoming a disciple of His providence.
- **8.** Truly thy holy and light-bearing life was adorned by a splendid kinship to Christ, O wise and blessèd one, for thou wast chosen to be His companion, and from thy youth thou didst ever dwell with the Word.
