## Vespers At "Lord, I call...," 6 stichera, **3 stichera to the Forerunner, in Tone 4:** (by John, the monk of Damascus) When John was born, he loosed the silence of his father, / For it was not fitting for Zachariah to stay silent when the Voice had come; / But as his tongue was bound because he would not believe, / So, when the Baptist appeared he freed his father / And revealing himself he preached the good tidings to men. / Born was the Voice of the Word and the Forerunner of Light /// Who intercedes for our souls. Today as the Voice of the Word releases the voice of his father, / Which was restrained because of his unbelief / And reveals the blessèd prosperity of the Church / By releasing his mother's bonds of barrenness. / The Candlestick of the Light goes forth before the Sun of Righteousness / Announcing the splendor of His coming /// For the renewal of all and the salvation of our souls. By Anatolius: When the Word of God was to be born of the Virgin / His messenger and the foremost of the prophets, / The greatest man to be ever born, / Sprang forth from the barren loins of an agèd woman, / Heralding the Word, the all-Glorious Beginning of things divine, The Offspring beyond all time conceived without seed. /// O Thou who workest wonders for our salvation, glory to Thee! And 3 stichera to the Martyr, in the same Tone: To the melody, "Thou hast given a sign...."

By mingling the sweat of abstinence with the blood of martyrdom. /

Thou didst endure a double measure of suffering /

In thy contest, O all-glorious Febronia, /

Therefore, the Benefactor of all hath given thee a double crown, /
And thou didst come before Him splendidly adorned ///
As an invincible martyr and blameless virgin.
The beauty of thy body /
Was mingled with the beauty of thy divine soul /

Adorned with royal purple drops of thy blood, /
O thou immaculate bride. /
Therefore, the beautiful Bridegroom hath received thee ///

Behold, Elizabeth speaks to the Virgin Mary: /
"Why is the Mother of my Lord come to me? /
Thou dost carry the King and I, the soldier; /
Thou the Law-giver, and I, the enactor of the Law; ///
Thou, the Word, and I, His voice proclaiming the kingdom of heaven!"
Or Dogmatic Theotokion if a resurrection service.
At the Aposticha, the stichera from the Octoechos, and
Glory..., now and ever..., of the Forerunner, in Tone 6:
Elizabeth conceives the Fore<u>ru</u>nner of grace /
And the Virgin conceives the Lord of Glory, /
Both mothers embrace each other with a kiss, /
And the babe John leaps up within his mother's womb. /
For the servant praises his Master. /
And the mother of the Forerunner, marveling, cries aloud: /
"Why is this granted to me, that the Mother of the Lord should come to me?" ///
That He might save the despairing people, in that He hath great mercy.

## The Troparion of the Forerunner, in Tone 4:

O Prophet and Forerunner of the <u>coming</u> of Christ, / Although we cannot praise thee <u>worthily</u> / We honor thee in love at thy nativity, / For by it thou didst end the silence and break the <u>barrenness</u> /// Preaching to the world the incarnation of the Son of God.

### The Troparion of the Venerable Nun Martyr, in the same Tone:

O Jesus, Thy lamb Feb<u>ro</u>nia /
Cries out to Thee with <u>great</u> love: /
"O my Bridegroom, I <u>long</u> for Thee in pain, /
I am crucified with Thee, and in baptism <u>buried</u> with Thee; /
I suffer for Thy sake in order to <u>reign</u> with Thee, /
I die for Thee in order to <u>live</u> in Thee. /
Accept me as a spotless <u>victim</u> /
Since I am put to death because of my <u>love</u> for Thee." ///
Through her prayers, O Merciful One, <u>save</u> our souls.

Today shé who once before was <u>barren</u> /

Now giveth birth to the Forerunner of Christ. /

He is the fulfillment of every <u>prophecy</u>, /

For as the prophets proclaimed, once he laid his hands upon Him in the <u>Jordan ///</u> He would be revealed as the Prophet, Herald and Forerunner of the Word of God.
