5:15 But the righteous live for evermore; their reward also is with the Lord, and the care of them is with the most High. <sup>16</sup>Therefore shall they receive a glorious kingdom and a beautiful crown from the Lord's hand; for with His right hand shall He cover them, and with His arm shall He protect them. <sup>17</sup>He shall take to him His zeal for complete armor and make the creation His weapon for revenge upon his enemies. <sup>18</sup>He shall put on righteousness as a breastplate and indifferent judgment instead of a helmet. <sup>19</sup>He shall take holiness for an invincible shield. <sup>20</sup>His severe wrath shall he sharpen for a sword, and the creation shall fight with him against the unwise. <sup>21</sup>Then shall the right aiming

# The Reading from the First General Epistle of John (4:1-6):

<sup>4:1</sup> Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits, whether they are of God; because many false prophets have gone out into the world. <sup>2</sup>By this you

know the Spirit of God: Every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh, is of God, <sup>3</sup> and every spirit that does not confess that Jesus Christ

is come in the flesh is not of God. And this is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard was coming, and is now already in the world. <sup>4</sup>Ye are of God, little children, and have overcome them: because He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world.

the children of God, when we love God and keep His commandments. <sup>3</sup>For this is the love of God that we keep His commandments. And His commandments are not burdensome. <sup>4</sup>For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world. And this is the victory that overcometh the world, our faith. <sup>5</sup>Who is he that overcometh the world, but he who believeth that Jesus is the Son of God?

## Ode 1

## The Supplicatory Canon to the Theotokos, Tone 8

Irmos: **H**aving crossed the water as though it were dry land and escaped from the wickedness of the Egyptians, the children of Israel cried aloud: Let us sing to our Redeemer and our God.

Refrain: Most Holy Theotokos, save us!

Distressed by many temptations, I flee to thee, seeking salvation. O Virgin and Mother of the Word, deliver me from my burdens and afflictions.

The increase of passions troubles me and fills me with great distress. Calm my soul, O Maiden, by the peace of thy Son and God, O all-blameless one.

I implore thee who gavest birth to our Savior and God, O Virgin: deliver me from perils, for, fleeing now unto thee for refuge, I lift up both my soul and my thoughts before thee.

Ailing am I in body and soul; do thou vouchsafe me the divine visitation and thy care, O thou who alone art the Mother of God, for thou art good and the Mother of the Good One.

As I lie on the bed of my pain and infirmity, do thou help me, as thou art a lover of goodness, O Theotokos, who alone art Ever-Virgin.

Having thee as our staff and hope, and as our salvation's unshakable defense, we are then delivered from all adversity, O thou all-praised one.

Filled with the Holy Spirit, O blessèd father Jacob, thou didst drive evil spirits away from men, making them to cry aloud to God: "Glory to Thy power, O bountiful Lord!"

Rejoice, ye hierarchs and priests! Sing for joy, ye deacons and pious faithful. Join

Thou didst instruct thy flock, O father Jacob, teaching them the doctrine of the Holy Trinity, the divine unity of three Persons, God, One in essence and undivided, ever adored by the Orthodox faithful who cry aloud to God: "Glory to Thy Power, O Lover of man!"

**Theotokion:** O All-holy Lady Theotokos, who gavest birth in the flesh to the Onlybegotten One, intercede for our people and our land and entreat Him that He may deliver from every danger all who piously call on thee.

# Ode 5 The Supplicatory Canon to the Theotokos

Irmos:<sup>2</sup> Why hast Thou cast me away from Thy face, O never setting Light? Why has this dismal darkness covered me, the wretched one? Guide me in return to the light of Thy commandments, I pray Thee.

Fill my heart with gladness, O pure one, with thine incorruptible joy, O thou who didst bear the Cause of all Joy.

Deliver us from dangers, O pure Theotokos, who didst give birth to Eternal Redemption, and the Peace that doth pass all understanding.

Dispel the darkness of my sins, O Bride of God, by the radiance of thy splendor, for thou didst bear the divine and pre-eternal Light.

Heal, O pure one, the infirmity of my soul, when thou hast deemed me worthy of thy visitation, and grant me health by thine intercessions.

#### The Canon of the Saint

having the same Irmos: "Why hast Thou cast me away..."

Piously fulfilling thy sacred office, thou didst approach all things with a pure mind, bringing honor to the priesthood by being a blameless minister of grace, O most righteous and holy father Jacob.

Being called by the grace of God thou didst abolish the lawlessness of the impious; by the fervent grace of thy words, like a river flowing with living water, thou didst thaw the frozen hearts of pagan people.

Desiring to attain the peace that passes all understanding, thou didst become a maker of peace. By uniting those who had been enemies thou wast shown to be a true child of God. Now, bring peace to the hearts of those who honor thee.

The Irmos differs from the "standard' Paraklesis. The Troparia, however, are the same.

**Theotokion:** O immaculate and Most Holy Virgin, thou didst give birth to the Prince of Peace and remained virgin. Entreat Him, we beseech thee, to grant peace to the world and salvation to our souls.

# Ode 6 The Supplicatory Canon to the Theotokos

*Irmos:* I pour forth my prayer to the Lord; and I lift up my sorrows before Him, how my soul is become full of evil and how my life draweth near to Hades, and like Jonah I pray: Deliver me, O God, from corruption.

My nature, held by corruption and death, hath He saved out of death and corruption; for unto death hath He submitted Himself. Wherefore, O Virgin, do thou intercede with Him who is thy Lord and Son, to deliver me from the wickedness of the enemy.

I know thee as the protection of my life, and most safe fortress, O Virgin; disperse the horde of temptations, and drive away demonic vexation. Unceasingly I pray to thee: Deliver me from the corruption of passions!

We have acquired thee as a wall of refuge, and the perfect salvation of our souls, and a relief in afflictions, O Maiden, and we ever rejoice in thy light. O Sovereign Lady, do thou also now save us from passions and dangers.

Bedridden, I lie supine with sickness now and there is no healing for my flesh; but to thee, O good one who gavest birth to God and the Savior of the world and the Healer of infirmities, I pray: Raise me up from the corruption of illness.

having the same Irmos: "I pour forth my prayer to the Lord..."

Alaska resounds with thy teachings, O trumpet of God. The saving commandments of Christ are set forth inscribed, not on tablets of stone, but on the hearts of men, who glorify thee, O father Jacob.

Exchanging the security of hearth and home for the dangers of the wilderness, thou wast revealed to be like the great merchant obtaining for thyself and countless others, the Priceless Pearl, Christ the Lord.

Standing by the river's edge and offering baptism to all who believed, thou didst hold forth the precious Cross of Christ as a trophy of peace and salvation, and the source of many miracles.

*Theotokion:* The Word of God Himself hath shown thee to be a wondrous and lifegiving fountain, O Lady, overflowing with healing waters for all who cry: "Most Holy Theotokos, save us!"

*Katavasia*: "Let us clap our hands in gladness..."

*Ikos:* Hearing the voice of the Savior, O saint, thou didst wisely follow Him into the wilderness. Taking no thought for the comforts of life, thou didst receive heavenly grace, wisdom and understanding. Now we ask that thou mayest send down those same gifts upon us who praise thee, O righteous one, and that thou pray to Christ our God on our behalf, that He grant us peace and great mercy.

# Ode 7 The Supplicatory Canon to the Theotokos

Irmos: The children of Judæa who dwelt of old in Babylon trampled underfoot the flames of the furnace by their faith in the Trinity, as they sang: Blessèd art Thou, O God of our fathers.

Having willed to accomplish our salvation, O Savior, Thou didst dwell in the womb of the Virgin, and didst show her forth unto the world as its intercessor. Blessèd art Thou, O God of our fathers.

Pray to Him, the dispenser of mercy whom thou didst bear, O pure Mother, and implore Him to deliver from all transgressions and defilements the souls of those who with faith cry out: Blessèd art Thou, O God of our fathers.

A treasury of salvation and a fountain of incorruption is she who gave Thee birth; a tower of safety, and a gate of repentance hast Thou proved her to those who cry: Blessèd art Thou, O God of our fathers.

Grant healing from physical weakness and spiritual infirmities to those who with love draw near to thy protection, O Virgin Theotokos, for thou gavest birth to Christ our Savior.

Thou art a bright and shining star enlightening all Alaska, resplendent with the grace of God and radiant with the Holy Spirit, and illumining all who sing: Blessèd

*Irmos:* The King of heaven whom the hosts of angels praise, let us praise and exalt throughout all ages.

Disdain not those who need thy help, O Virgin, and who hymn and supremely exalt thee unto all ages.

Thou healest the infirmity of my soul and the pains of my body, O Virgin, that I may glorify thee, O pure one, unto all ages.

Thou pourest forth a wealth of healing, on those who with faith sing praises unto thee, O Virgin, and who supremely exalt thine ineffable Childbearing.

Thou drivest away the assaults of temptations, and the attacks of the passions, O Virgin; wherefore do we sing thee hymns unto all ages.

- **3.** Deliver thy people, O saint of God, and thy native land from all the assaults of the visible and invisible enemies, and grant peace to all who faithfully celebrate thy memory with joy.
- **4.** *Theotokion:* The holy Church cries out to thee: "Rejoice, O Mother of God!" for thou gavest birth in time to the Timeless One, granting joy to all mankind.
- **5.** Alaska resounds with thy teachings, O trumpet of God. The saving commandments of Christ are set forth inscribed, not on tablets of stone, but on the hearts of men, who glorify thee, O father Jacob.
- **6.** Exchanging the security of hearth and home for the dangers of the wilderness, thou wast revealed to be like the great merchant obtaining for thyself and countless others, the Priceless Pearl, Christ the Lord.
- 7. Standing by the river's edge and offering baptism to all who believed, thou didst hold forth the precious Cross of Christ as a trophy of peace and salvation, and the source of many miracles.
