Eve of the Theophany of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ

First Hour

About the second hour of the day — eight o'clock in the Morning on the Eve of the Theophany of Christ. If The Eve of the Theophany falls on a Saturday or a Sunday, the Royal Hours are read on the preceding Friday. In such a case, the Divine Liturgy is not celebrated on Friday.
