The 1st Day of February

Example 3 Forefeast of the Meeting of our Lord; The Martyr Tryphon of Campsada near Apamea in Syria.

Vespers

Note: If this day falls on the **Sunday Before the Meeting**, 4 stikhera of the Resurrection are first sung, then 3 of the Forefeast, followed by 3 of St. Tryphon. Otherwise:

At "Lord, I call...," 6 stichera:

3 stichera of the Forefeast in Tone 4: *To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."*

The holy Church prepares to receive within herself /

The Lord, coming as an infant. /

Through <u>grace</u>, she spiritually illumines the faithful and God-loving congregation / And she <u>cries</u> aloud: /

Thou art my glory, my praise, and the adornment of my fulfillment, ///

O Word, who became an infant in the flesh for my sake!

The most-splendid bridal <u>cha</u>mber / The fair <u>pa</u>lace of the King / The most-<u>ho</u>ly and spacious <u>san</u>ctuary of the Lord / Leads Him into His holy <u>temple</u>, / Where He betroths Himself to His <u>pre</u>cious Church. / And His Mother earnestly <u>prays</u> that we / Be delivered from corruption and mis<u>fortune</u> /// Who in faith ceaselessly glorify her as the true Theotokos.

Let us now offer to our <u>praises</u> to Christ / In advance of the <u>co</u>ming feast, / And <u>glo</u>rify His conde<u>sce</u>nsion, / For by the Virgin's hands He comes carried as an <u>infant</u> / And is about to rest in <u>Sy</u>meon's hands, / Who will make a proclamation to all <u>mankind</u> /// That, as Benefactor and Lord, He is come to deify our human <u>na</u>ture.

And 3 stichera of the Martyr, in Tone 1: *To the melody, "O all-praised martyrs...."* O all-praised Tryphon, /

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Valiantly didst thou suffer in thy <u>labors</u>, / And didst be<u>come</u> a witness for the Truth, O <u>glo</u>rious one, / Now thou dost partake of the sweetness of incor<u>ruption</u> in <u>heaven</u>. /// Entreat Christ that He grant our souls peace and great <u>mercy</u>.

O all-<u>glo</u>rious <u>Try</u>phon, / Thou didst become radiant with the rays of the <u>ete</u>rnal Light, / Sweeping a<u>way</u> the darkness of spiritual de<u>lu</u>sion / Thou didst cast down the <u>prince</u> of <u>da</u>rkness. /// Therefore, pray to Christ that He grant our souls peace and great <u>me</u>rcy.

O all-<u>ble</u>ssed <u>Try</u>phon, /

With great spiritual strength didst thou renounce the <u>plea</u>sures of this life, / And <u>counting</u> them all as having no <u>value</u>, / Courageously didst thou complete thy <u>course</u>, O <u>martyr</u>, / And wast found <u>wo</u>rthy to rejoice together with the <u>angels</u>, /// And to beseech Christ on behalf of our souls.

Glory..., now and ever..., in Tone 2: The composition of Cyprian

Scorning the things of this world, O most-blessèd and honored <u>Try</u>phon, / Courageously didst thou stand be<u>fore</u> thy trial / And in thy <u>bloo</u>dy struggle, O <u>ma</u>rtyr, / Thou didst defeat the <u>ty</u>rant's pride, / And didst receive the crown of <u>vi</u>ctory. /// Cease not to pray, O passion-bearing cham'pion, for the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls.

Now and ever..., in the same Tone: The composition of Germanus

Today Symeon receives in his arms the Lord of <u>Glory</u> / Whom Moses once beheld in the shadows on Mt. <u>Sinai</u> / When he received from Him the <u>tablets</u> of the Law. / This is He whom the <u>prophets</u> foretold; / This is He who cre<u>ated the Law;</u> / This is <u>He</u> whom David announced, who is <u>awe</u>some to all, /// Who hath great and rich mercy.

Or the Dogmatic Theotokion in the Tone of the Week if the Sunday Before.

At the Aposticha, these stichera, in Tone 2: To the melody, "O House of Ephratha...." (except on the Sunday Before — see below)

FOREFEAST OF THE MEETING; MARTYR TRYPHON

Receive, O <u>Symeon</u>, / The Lord of <u>Glo</u>ry, / Behold, He <u>comes</u>, as was fore<u>told</u> to thee /// By the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit!

Verse: Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant depart in peace.

Behold, the most-pure <u>Mo</u>ther of God, / Bears the Master and Creator as an <u>infant in her arms</u> /// As she enters into the <u>temple</u>!

Verse: A light to enlighten the Gentiles, and the glory of Thy people Israel.

O great and awesome <u>my</u>stery! / O most-<u>glo</u>rious sight! / He who en<u>co</u>mpasses all things and creates all <u>infants Himself</u> /// Is borne as an infant carried in the arms of His <u>Mo</u>ther.

Glory..., now and ever..., in the same Tone: In the Regular Melody

The holy Virgin brings the <u>Ho</u>ly One / Into the Holy of <u>Ho</u>lies, / And Symeon <u>stre</u>tches forth his hands to re<u>ceive</u> Him / And he cries a<u>loud</u> with joy: / Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant de<u>part</u> in peace /// A<u>ccording to</u> Thy Word!

Note: However, if it be the Sunday Before, then,

At the Litya, the stichera are from the Apostikha of Vespers *(see above):* Receive, O <u>Sy</u>meon...,

Glory..., now and ever..., of the Forefeast, from the stikhera of Vespers *(see above):* Today Simeon receives in his arms the Lord of <u>Glo</u>ry....

And, the Apostikha is all from the Octoechos, then,

Glory..., now and ever..., of the Forefeast, in Tone 2: *(see above):* The holy Virgin brings the <u>Holy</u> One

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The Troparion of the Martyr, in Tone 4:

Thy holy martyr <u>Try</u>phon, O Lord, / Through his sufferings received his incorruptible crown from <u>Thee</u>, our God / For having Thy strength he laid low his <u>enemies</u> / And shattered the powerless boldness of <u>demons</u> /// Through his intercessions, O Christ God, <u>save</u> our souls.

The Troparion of the Forefeast, in Tone 1: To the melody, "The choir of angels...."

The <u>choir</u> of angels look down from <u>heaven</u> / To behold on earth the First-fruit of all cre<u>a</u>tion / As He is <u>car</u>ried into the <u>temple</u>, / A new-born infant in the arms of His <u>Mo</u>ther all-pure. / Together with us they sing with joy /// A hymn in prepa<u>ra</u>tion of the Feast.

Matins

—incomplete as of 12/2014

At "God is the Lord...," the Troparion of the Forefeast, twice; Glory..., that of the Martyr; Now and ever..., that of the Forefeast, once.

The Kontakion of the Saint, in Tone 8: To the melody "As the first-fruits "

Thou didst abolish the pagan gods from the earth by the power of the <u>Trinity</u>, / And through thy faith in Christ didst thou defeat the tyrant's pride, O <u>glo</u>rious one. / Thou didst receive thy martyr's crown and the gift of healing from Christ the <u>Sa</u>vior /// In that thou art in<u>vi</u>ncible.

The Kontakion of the Forefeast, in Tone 6:

The Word who is invisible with the <u>Fa</u>ther / Now is <u>seen</u> in the flesh / Having been ineffably born of the <u>Vi</u>rgin / He is now given into the priestly arms of an <u>E</u>lder. / Let us all bow down in <u>wo</u>rship to Him, /// For He is our <u>True</u> God.

At the Aposticha, these stichera, in Tone 2: To the melody, "O House of Ephratha "

Christ the Son, who from before the <u>morning star</u> / Was ineffably begotten of the <u>Fa</u>ther /

FOREFEAST OF THE MEETING; MARTYR TRYPHON

Is now <u>born</u> from the all-pure <u>Virgin</u> /// By this delivering Adam from cor<u>ru</u>ption.

Verse: Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant depart in peace.

Open wide, ye gates of <u>heaven</u>, / For behold, Christ the Babe is brought into the temple as an <u>offering</u> /// To God the Father by His Most-pure <u>Mo</u>ther!

Verse: A light to enlighten the Gentiles, and the glory of Thy people Israel.

Receive, O Symeon, / The Lord of <u>Glo</u>ry, / Behold, He <u>comes</u>, as was fore<u>told</u> to thee /// By the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit!

Glory..., now and ever..., in Tone 2: (in the Regular Melody)

Today the Creator <u>heaven and earth</u> / Is carried in the arms of the holy elder <u>Sy</u>meon, / And <u>moved</u> by the Holy Spirit he cries <u>out</u> with joy: /// Behold, now am I delivered, for mine eyes have seen my <u>Sa</u>vior!

Note: However, if it be the Sunday Before, then

at **the Praises**, 5 stichera of the Resurrection, and 3 of the Forefeast from the Matins Aposticha with their verses (see above):

Christ the Son, who from before the morning star...

Liturgy

At the Beatitudes, 8 Troparia: 4 from the Third Ode of the Canon of the Forefeast, and 4 from the Sixth Ode of the Canon of the Martyr. — incomplete as of 12/2014

The Prokeimenon of the Martyr, in Tone 7: The righteous one shall rejoice in the Lord, and shall set his hope on Him. *Verse:* Hear my voice, O God, when I pray unto Thee!

The Epistle: (99) Romans 8:28-39

The Alleluia of the Martyr, in Tone 4: The righteous shall flourish like a palm tree and shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon. *Verse:* They that are planted in the house of the Lord shall flourish in the courts of our God.

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The Gospel (51-ctr) Luke 10:19-21.

The Communion Hymn of the Feast, and also for the Saints: The righteous shall be in everlasting remembrance. He shall not be afraid of evil tidings.

Note: If it be **the Sunday Before**, the Prokeimenon, Alleluia verses and the Lectionary Readings are for the Day.

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
