## At "Lord, I call...," 6 stichera:

3 stichera, in Tone 2: To the melody, "Down from the tree..."

As God and Bene<u>fa</u>ctor / Christ has given thee to the world as a rich gift, O <u>Theodore</u> / In re<u>turn</u> for the gift of thy precious blood which thou didst <u>offer</u> to Him; / Zealously <u>shed</u> for His sake. / And standing now before Him with pious boldness, O <u>martyr</u>, /// Pray for the salvation of all who come be<u>fore</u> thee.

Like as a steadfast <u>pillar</u> / Repelling the assaults of the <u>a</u>dversaries; / Thou art an in<u>vi</u>ncible champ'ion of them that <u>ho</u>nor thee: / A speedy helper, fervent advocate, and sure de<u>li</u>verance; / An aide in times of trouble, and a prayerful inter<u>ce</u>ssor /// Who delivereth all who entreat thee with faith, O blessèd <u>The</u>odore.

**B**eing a true witness of the <u>Goo</u>dness of Christ, / The waters of redemption flow from thee in torrents of <u>swee</u>tness. / So de<u>liver me from the <u>torrents</u> of my sins, / Calm the troubled waters for me, and still the tempest of temp<u>ta</u>tions, / And guide me to the tranquil haven on high, O right-blessèd <u>The</u>odore.</u>

And 3 stichera, in Tone 4: To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs..."

Moved by divine zeal, O <u>glo</u>rious one, / Thy soul enflamed with love for Christ the <u>Sa</u>vior, / Thou didst re<u>duce</u> to ashes the false goddess and her <u>temple</u>, / Proclaiming the name of the true <u>God</u> and Lord, / Thou didst shame the arrogance of the tor<u>mentors</u> /// And hast attained to everlasting joy, O passion-bearer <u>The</u>odore.

Having ascended, O <u>The</u>odore, / To the summit of the <u>kno</u>wledge of Christ. / Thou didst <u>pass</u> beyond things visible, and didst <u>seek</u> only Him, /

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And having found Him, thou didst <u>love</u> only Him. / And thou didst suffer for His sake with a <u>va</u>liant soul. / Him do <u>thou</u> beseech, / That we who celebrate thy most glorious <u>me</u>mory /// Be delivered from corruption and misfortune.

Graced with divine power and covered with the wounds of thy <u>struggle</u> / O passion-bearer <u>Theodore</u>, / Thou didst <u>come</u> to stand before <u>Christ</u> God, The King of Cre<u>a</u>tion, / And received crowns of <u>ho</u>nor from Him, / Him do <u>thou</u> beseech, / That we who celebrate with faith thy most glorious <u>me</u>mory /// Be delivered from corruption and misfortune.

## **Glory..., in Tone 6:**

Thou didst appear to the world, O <u>Theodore</u> / As a gift of sanctification, and a treasury of <u>go</u>dly life; / For Christ hath glorified thy memory, O <u>wise</u> one, / Therefore, we the faithful, rejoice to<u>ge</u>ther, /// And praise the pódvig of thy <u>su</u>fferings.

## **Now and ever..., Theotokion, or the Stavrotheokion:** *To the melody, "Having set all aside..."*

A sword has <u>pierced</u> thy heart, / As Simeon said, O most-pure <u>Lady</u>, / When thou didst behold Him Who shone forth ineffably from thee / Condemned by the lawless and lifted upon the Cross, / Given gall to eat and <u>vinegar</u> to drink, / His hand and feet pierced with nails, His side run through with a spear, / Thou didst cry out to Him with a mother's <u>so</u>rrow: /// What is this new mystery, O my sweetest Child?

## At the Aposticha, the stichera from the Octoechos.

## **Glory..., in Tone 8:**

Having <u>armed</u> thyself with the pious courage of a <u>mar</u>tyr / O passion-<u>bea</u>rer of Christ, / And mystically uniting thy<u>self</u> to His <u>power</u> / Thou didst reveal the false nature of i<u>do</u>latry / And the tormentors' <u>impotent threats</u>; /

#### GREATMARTYR THEODORE THE RECRUIT (TYRO)

Dismissing their tortures and the <u>flames</u> of their fires. / For both in truth and name, thou are rightly called a "<u>Gift</u> from God" /// And all who celebrate thy memory are delivered from every ad<u>ve</u>rsity.

## **Now and ever..., Theotokion; or the Stavrotheotokion:** *To the melody, "O most glorious wonder ..."*

Beholding her <u>Child</u> upon the Tree / As a willing <u>sa</u>crifice, / The unblemished <u>Mai</u>den wept <u>bitterly</u> / And she cried la<u>menting</u>: / "Woe is me, my belovèd Child / What hath the ungrateful <u>people done</u> to Thee? /// Wishing to leave me childless, O my belovèd One."

### The Troparion of the Martyr, in Tone 2:

Great are the accomplishments of faith! / The martyred saint Theodore rejoiced in the flames as though in the <u>waters</u> of rest; / Being <u>burned</u> by the fire, he was offered as sweet bread to the <u>Trinity</u>, /// By his prayers, O Christ God, <u>save</u> our souls.

## We sing both Canons from the Octoechos, and that of the Martyr, in Tone 8, having the acrostic: "Save them that call upon thee, O blessèd one." — incomplete as of 1/2013

### The Kontakion of the Martyr, in Tone 8:

Having received the faith of Christ within thy <u>heart</u> as a shield, / Thou didst trample down the hosts of the enemy, O longsuffering one; / And didst receive a heavenly crown of everlasting <u>glo</u>ry /// O martyr Theodore, as thou art in<u>vi</u>ncible.

### At the Aposticha, the stichera from the Octoechos, and:

### **Glory..., in Tone 2:**

O thrice-blessèd Theodore, we <u>ho</u>nor thee, / Rightly art thou named "<u>Gift</u> from God" / For thou hast <u>shown</u> thyself a never-setting star of di<u>vine</u> light, / And through thy sufferings thou dost shine on <u>all</u> the world /

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Proving thyself stronger than fire /

Thou hast <u>quenched</u> the flames; and hast crushed the head of the deceitful <u>serpent</u>. /

Therefore, in the midst of thy sufferings, Christ came and set a crown upon thy <u>ho</u>ly head. /

O greatmartyr, who hast boldness before God ///

Do thou offer fervent intercession for our souls.

**Now and ever..., Theotokion, or the Stavrotheokion:** *To the melody, "Down from the tree..."* 

The pure <u>La</u>dy, when she beheld Thee hanging <u>on</u> the Tree, / The Blameless Fruit which she didst <u>ca</u>rry in her womb, / She cried out, la<u>menting</u>: / O my Child, pour forth Thy <u>sweetness</u>, / Through <u>which</u> the droughts of passion are <u>wa</u>shed away. ///

For the sake of her who gave birth to Thee, grant us this great mercy, O Good One!

# At the Beatitudes, 8 Troparia: 4 from the Octoechos, and 4 from the Third Ode of the Canon of the Martyr.

**The Prokeimenon in Tone 7:** The righteous one shall rejoice in the Lord, / and shall set his hope in Him. *Verse:* Hear my voice, O God, when I pray into Thee!

**The Epistle:** (292) 2 Tim. 2:1-10

**The Alleluia in Tone 4,** The righteous shall flourish like a palm tree and shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon. *Verse:* They that are planted in the house of the Lord shall flourish in the courts of our God.

**The Gospel:** (52) John 15:17-16:2

**The Communion Hymn:** The righteous shall be in everlasting remembrance. He shall not be afraid of evil tidings.

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
