The 3rd Day of December Commemoration of the Holy Prophet Zephaníah (Sophónias).

Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 3 stichera, in Tone 4: To the melody, "Called from on high...."

Thou didst receive the radiance of the <u>light</u> of God / Through the purity of thy mind / And didst become a herald of the words of God, / O all-praised Zaphaniah, / Thou wast, indeed, the mouth of the Holy Spirit / Proclaiming that which was shown to thee by Him, / And revealing to all the nations the salvation of mankind and the kingdom of Christ. /// Beseech Him now to save and enlighten our souls. Illumined by the visions of God and prophetic contemplation, / Thou wast inspired with grace and blessedness / And honored with a chief place among all the prophets. / Since thou art now possessed with mercy and with boldness before the all-gracious Lord, / Cease not to pray for those who in faith praise thee / And honor thee as an eloquent and acceptable prophet pleasing to God /// That He deliver us from all misfortunes and that He save our souls.

Thou hast shown Thy prophet Zepha<u>ni</u>ah, / To be like a life-bearing cloud, O im<u>mo</u>rtal Lord, / Pouring <u>for</u>th the waters of e<u>te</u>rnal life, / And in sending him forth, Thou hast richly endowed him with the All-holy <u>Spi</u>rit / Who is consubstantial with Thee, the Father Al<u>mighty</u> / And Thy Son who shone forth from Thine <u>E</u>ssence; / And through him Thou hast foretold the saving advent of <u>Christ</u> our God /// And announced salvation to all the <u>na</u>tions.

Note: But if we sing "Alleluia" at Matins instead of "God is the Lord," then the following 3 stichera to the Theotokos are sung at Vespers, at "Lord, I call," before the above stichera of the Saint, in the same Tone and melody:

Save us who piously venerate thy birth<u>gi</u>ving / From all the snares of the enemy, O all-chaste <u>Mo</u>ther of God, / For we have acquired thee as our <u>re</u>fuge and help, / Our strength and inter<u>ce</u>ssion; / Thou art the protectress of the <u>hu</u>man race /

3 DECEMBER

Before Christ the Lord and <u>Ma</u>ster. / Beseech Him to grant peace to the world, we <u>pray</u> thee, /// And remission of sins for us who hasten to thy protection.

Behold, I expose to thee the <u>sores</u> of my soul / Brought down upon me by the tumultuous action of the <u>demons</u> / And I <u>show</u> thee the <u>te</u>rrible wounds / Inflicted upon me by my <u>wi</u>cked thoughts, / But pour forth the oil of thy loving-kindness and thy goodness, O most pure <u>La</u>dy, / Who gave birth to the Healer of men's souls and <u>bo</u>dies, /// And grant me healing for my health and the salvation of my soul.

I do not cover up my <u>wi</u>cked deeds, / For, wretch that I am, I have amassed those things <u>ha</u>ted by God: / I have de<u>filed</u> my flesh, my <u>spi</u>rit and mind / By evil thoughts, <u>words</u> and deeds; / With my tongue I condemn sinners, while I myself commit <u>worse</u> things. / But grant me correction of all these, O Theo<u>to</u>kos, / That having rid myself of my <u>evil</u> ways / I may fall down and weep be<u>fore</u> thee /// Over what I have wickedly done in the course of my life.

Glory... now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone:

Accursed, I have fallen into the <u>depths</u> of sin / Because of my despair and <u>la</u>ziness. / <u>Now</u> I am held fast by misery and des<u>pond</u>ency. / But do thou help me, cleanse me, and <u>save</u> me, / Grant unto me thy merciful consolation, O <u>pure</u> one. / I implore thee, take refuge, and fall down be<u>fore</u> thee, / And with faith I cry <u>out</u> to thee: /// Let not the deceiver gloat over me when the <u>end</u> is come.

Or the Stavrotheotokion, in the same Tone:

"Lament me not, O <u>Mo</u>ther, / Seeing thy Son and God <u>hanging</u> on the tree, / Who sus<u>pe</u>nded the earth upon the <u>wa</u>ters / And fashioned all cre<u>a</u>tion. / For I shall arise and be <u>glo</u>rified, / And shall crush the kingdom of <u>Ha</u>des, / Destroying all its <u>po</u>wer, /

HOLY PROPHET ZEPHANIAH (SOPHONIAS).

In that I am com<u>pa</u>ssionate /// And the Lover of <u>mankind</u>."

Or Dogmatic Theotokion if a Resurrection service.

The Aposticha from the Octoechos.

The General Troparion of the Prophet, in Tone 2:

We <u>cél</u>ebrate today the <u>me</u>mory / Of Thy prophet Zepha<u>ni</u>ah; / Through <u>him</u>, we im<u>plore</u> Thee, O Lord, / To <u>save our</u> souls.

Matins

Kontakion for the Prophet, in Tone 4:

Thou wast manifested by the Holy <u>Spirit</u> / As one resplendent with bright <u>rays</u> of light / For thou didst proclaim the Theophany of God, O prophet Zepha<u>ni</u>ah / Having preached "Rejoice greatly, O daughters of Sion and Je<u>ru</u>salem; /// For behold, your King comes to <u>save</u> you!"

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
