Irmos: Jonah was caught but not held in the belly of the whale, revealing a sign of Thee, who didst suffer and wast delivered up to burial. He came forth from the monster as from a

chamber and spoke to the watchmen: you that watch keep guard in vain, for you have forsaken the One who is Himself mercy.

Let us honor Archbishop Hilarion together with Tikhon the Patriarch, for together they worthily and courageously defended the Church from the godless foes and ferocious beasts that sought to blaspheme and dishonor her.

Let us worthily praise the holy hierarch Hilarion today, O ye people, for he preserved the honor of the Church from reckless reformation and confirmed the Orthodox Faith.

Theotokion: Rejoice, O Queen of heaven, unshakeable pillar of the Church, the boast of the priesthood and the people, the impregnable bastion of the Orthodox Faith, and the confirmation of every Orthodox habitation, city and land.

Katavasia: "The sea monster cast out Jonah unharmed..."

Thy great spiritual deeds and accomplishments, O hieromartyr, were most well-pleasing unto God. By them, those who sought to destroy the Church of Christ were put to shame, as the faithful cried aloud: Blessèd art Thou, O God our Redeemer.

Thou wast an instructor the monastics at the Monastery of the Meeting in Moscow, and thou didst preserve it from the attacks of the impious. Now the walls of thy monastery protect thy holy relics and the monks whom thou dost teach all cry aloud: Blessèd art Thou, O God our Redeemer.

O holy hierarch Hilarion, thou glory of the Orthodox Church, vouchsafe that by thy prayers, we who are weak and sinful, may be delivered from the flames of

passion and preserved unharmed by temptations, as we cry out to the Lord: Blessèd art Thou, O God our Redeemer.

Theotokion: Who cannot but glorify thee, O Most Holy Virgin? For thou art the spiritual dew of heaven that extinguishes the flame of sin and fills the faithful with grace. Therefore, we cry to thee, O Lady: Deliver us from eternal condemnation, and save our souls.

Irmos: The King of heaven whom the hosts of angels praise, let us praise and exalt throughout all ages.

Disdain not those who need thy help, O Virgin, and who hymn and supremely exalt thee unto all ages.

The Solovétsky Monastery located in the White Sea region of northern Russia, known as "Solovkí," was a major concentration camp in the Soviet Gulag during the years 1929-1939.

The blood-soaked land of the Solovétsky monastery now rejoices and is glad, for thou, O wondrous Hilarion, art honored in the great assembly of new martyrs and confessors in heaven and together with them thou dost glorify the King of glory with the song: You children bless Him; you priests, sing praises; you people exalt Him throughout all ages.

Let us bless the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, the Lord!

Theotokion: O Most Holy Virgin, when thou didst go up to thy Son in heaven, thou didst not abandon us as orphans in this sorrowful world; but kept us, our villages, cities, and holy habitations under thy protecting veil, thus granting eternal life to all who sing thy praises.
