## The 1<sup>st</sup> Day of December Commemoration of the Holy Prophet Nahum.

### Vespers

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At "Lord, I call...," 3 stichera, in Tone 3: To the melody, "Great are the powers
of Thy Cross...."
The grace of the Holy Spirit came to dwell in thee /
O Nahum, prophet of God /
And with the rays of His own Light /
Made thee into a most-radiant light, /
And through thee preached to Nineveh the Great ///
All the things that were to come.
Like as a cloud filled with brightness and light, /
O divine prophet Nahum, enlightened vessel of the knowledge of God /
Thou didst shower the city of Nineveh /
With the water of divine judgment ///
For it had fallen ill with impiety.
Having attained incorrupt blessedness, /
Ineffable glory, divine sweetness and joy /
O Nahum, thou divinely-inspired prophet of God, ///
Beseech the Master for us all.
Note: But if we sing "Alleluia" at Matins instead of "God is the Lord," then the
following 3 stichera to the Theotokos are sung at Vespers, at "Lord, I call," before
the above stichera of the Saint, in the same Tone and melody:
Heal me speedily, O <u>Lady</u>, /
With the healing grace of thy prayer; /
For I lie barely alive on the bed of despair, /
Sorely wounded by the fangs of the serpent. /
And make a servant of thy Son and God.
Knowing the weakness of my flesh, /
The anger of my heart, and the sickness of my soul, /
Yet grant unto me thy divine visitation,
O immaculate Virgin, I pray ///
And save me, through thine own fervent prayers.
Surpassing all in my transgressions, O Lady, /
Yet I have been cleansed from them all through thy mercy; /
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#### 1 DECEMBER

Entreat now, O pure one, thy <u>Son</u> and God, ///
That I may receive forgiveness at the <u>judgment</u> which <u>is</u> to come

## Glory... now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone:

Beseech thou Him who was <u>born</u> of thee, /
O <u>Virgin</u>, /
To protect thy <u>flock</u> unharmed /
From all temptations of our adversary, the <u>devil</u>; /
That we be strengthened, O <u>Mai</u>den, /
To fulfill the will of thy Son.

### Or the Stavrotheotokion, in the same Tone:

A sword has pierced thine heart, O most pure <u>Lady</u>, /
When thou didst see thy Son up<u>on</u> the Cross; /
And thou didst cry <u>out</u> to Him: /
"Leave me not alone and <u>chi</u>ldless, /
Who hath preserved me Virgin after giving <u>birth</u> to Thee, ///
O my <u>Son and</u> my God."

Or Dogmatic Theotokion if a Resurrection service.
