Thou wast vouchsafed eternal life / When thou didst preach Christ the Son, the Word and the Giver of life / As consubstantial and co-eternal with God, the unoriginate Father. / Then with thy fiery tongue thou didst burn up the substance of heresies, O glorious one, / Expelling Arius from the Church of Christ / Thus enlightening the hearts of the pious with thy divine words, O wise one, /// To worship the Trinity, One in essence Thou wast like unto a divine river / Filled with the waters of the Spirit. <u>Plan</u>ting the doctrines of <u>O</u>rthodoxy / Thou didst uproot the evil thorns of heresy, O Atha<u>na</u>sius, / And didst <u>multiply</u> the seeds of faith with the water of the <u>Spi</u>rit, /// Therefore we <u>praise</u> thee, O <u>ven</u>'rable one.

At the Praises, 4 stichera, in Tone 4: To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."
