The 22nd Day of May Hieromartyr Basilíscus, Bishop of Comana.

Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 3 stichera, in Tone 4: To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."

Crowned as a king, Basilíscus the <u>glo</u>rious, / Thou wast received into the kingdom that abideth fo<u>re</u>ver / And thou <u>standest</u> now before the <u>King</u> of the ages / Rejoicing together with all the armies of <u>angels</u>, / And with them, O <u>ble</u>ssèd one, / Thou dost ceaselessly sing the Thrice-holy hymn, /// Brightly illumined by communion with the radiance divine.

Thou didst walk, rejoicing, / On the path to thy <u>martyrdom</u> / Shod in <u>i</u>ron sandals with nails driven through the <u>soles</u> of thy feet. / Thus thou didst trample upon the head of the <u>enemy</u> / Utterly destroying it, O most-<u>praised</u> one, / And proceeded with a firm step on thy path to <u>heaven</u>, /// To stand victorious before the Master, O Basilíscus the glorious.

At thy prayer a barren tree <u>sprouted anew</u>, / And a spring began to flow with miraculous <u>waters of life</u>; / The <u>earth</u> was hallowed by the <u>streams</u> of thy blood / And the air was sanctified by the as<u>cent</u> of thy soul, / O Basiliscus, thou art richly <u>bless't</u> by God. / Therefore, on the day on which thou didst suffer <u>under the law</u> /// We joyfully celebrate thy holy memory.

Note: But if we sing "Alleluia" at Matins instead of "God is the Lord," then the 3 stichera to the Theotokos found on May 20^{th} are sung at Vespers at "Lord I call," before the above stichera of the Saints, in the same Tone and melody.

Glory..., now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone: (and melody)

Thousands of times have I <u>prom</u>ised / To repent of my sins, O <u>pure</u> one, / But the de<u>spi</u>sed, yet cherished, habits of mine evil offenses will not de<u>part</u> from me / So I fall down before thee, <u>cry</u>ing out: / Rescue me from their tyranny, O <u>La</u>dy, ///

22 MAY

And instruct me along the higher path which leads to salvation.

Or the Stavrotheotokion, in the same Tone:

Seeing Thee the Lamb and <u>Shepherd on the tree</u>, / The ewe-lamb who gave birth to Thee la<u>mented</u>, / And as a <u>mother cried out</u> to Thee: / "O desired Son, how art Thou hung on the <u>Tree</u> of the Cross, / O Longsuffering One? / How art Thy hands and feet nailed by the transgressors, O Word? / How dost Thou shed Thy Blood, O <u>Ma</u>ster?

The General Troparion of the Hieromartyr, in Tone 4: (None given in the Menaion)

Like the apostles in <u>cha</u>racter, / A successor on their throne, O divinely-in<u>spi</u>red one / Through visions thou didst <u>find</u> thy work / Rightly dividing the <u>word</u> of truth. / Thou didst suffer for the <u>sake</u> of the faith / Even to the <u>she</u>dding of thy blood /// O Hieromartyr Basilíscus, pray to Christ God that our souls may be saved.

Matins

The Canon of the Saint, in Tone 8,

having the acrostic: "I piously praise Basiliscus the Great," the composition of Joseph. — incomplete as of 4/2016

The Kontakion of the Hieromartyr, in Tone 8: *To the melody, "O victorious leader...."*

Thou didst reveal thyself as one strong and mighty in thy <u>struggles</u>, / And a marvelous wonderworking champ'ion bearing the name of Christ for <u>all</u> to see. / By this thou didst put the pride of the tormenting <u>ty</u>rants to shame. / So we honor thee, O glorious Basilíscus, and we cry a<u>loud</u> to thee: /// Rejoice, O radiant glory of the <u>ma</u>rtyrs!
