The Afterfeast of the Exaltation of the Cross; The holy Greatmartyr Eustathius (Eustace) Placidas, his wife, Martyr Theopistes and their children, Martyrs Agapius and Theopistus of Rome.

Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 6 stichera

3 stichera of the Feast in Tone 4:¹ *To the melody, "Thou hast given a sign...."*

Today Thine honorable <u>Cross</u>, O Christ, / Shines more brilliantly <u>than</u> the sun / As it is <u>raised</u> and exalted upon Thy most holy <u>mountain</u> of the skull, / Confirming to all, O Almighty <u>Savior</u>, / That Thou didst lift up our nature to <u>heaven</u>, /// As Thou art the Lover of <u>mankind</u>!

Today, O unap<u>proa</u>chable One /

Thy glory is declared by the heavens to all <u>mankind</u>, / For Thy <u>Cross</u> shines brightly with the radiance of Thine unap<u>proa</u>chable Light / Exposing the cruel and savage nature of those who had <u>slain</u> God. / Therefore, we glorify Thy loving dispen<u>sation</u>, /// O Almighty Jesus, the <u>Savior</u> of our souls!

Moses defeated Amalek /

By stretching out his hands in the <u>form</u> of the cross, / And <u>now</u> we bow down before the <u>Tree</u> of the Cross / Trampling underfoot the traps and schemes of the <u>enemy</u>, / Having Christ as our champion, who was lifted up<u>on</u> it in the flesh, /// Thus slaying the serpent and saving <u>mankind</u>.

And these 3 stichera of the Martyr, in the same Tone: (and melody)

Thou wast called from above and <u>not</u> by man, / O holy martyr Eu<u>sta</u>thius, / For <u>Christ</u> Himself, the Lover of mankind, ap<u>peared</u> to thee / And captured thee in the net of faith, O <u>ble</u>ssed one, / And through baptism washed away <u>all</u> thy sins. / He strengthened thee to endure the supreme <u>trial</u> of thy life, /// And as Master, He made thee victorious.

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Joyfully didst thou train in thy youth in the <u>vi</u>rtues, / O martyr Eus<u>ta</u>thius. / And when thy <u>wife</u> and thy children were taken a<u>way</u> from thee / Thou didst bear the dishonor of thine own cap<u>ti</u>vity. / Courageously didst thou win the battle, O <u>va</u>liant one, /// Earning for thyself esteem and glorious <u>ho</u>nor.

Thou didst present thyself together with thy <u>fa</u>mily / As a fragrance of sweet-smelling <u>incense</u>, / A <u>living and most perfect sacrifice</u> A whole-burnt offering well-<u>pleasing to God</u>, And with them thou dwellest now in the heavenly <u>mansions</u> /// Together with all the companies of the <u>heavenly host</u>.

Glory..., of the Martyr, in Tone 2: *(the composition of Ephraim of Karyes)*

Setting for us the example of a <u>second Job</u> / The martyr Eustathius appears as a pillar of patience and a model of <u>vi</u>rtue. / In his <u>life</u>, he truly equaled Job in the virtues together with his wife and <u>fa</u>mily, / For he was faithful and unshaken by temp<u>ta</u>tions / And victorious in all his <u>struggles</u>. / <u>Now</u> he is our intercessor before <u>Christ</u> the Lord, /// Ever praying that we may be enlightened and that our <u>souls</u> may be saved.

Now and ever..., of the Feast, in the same Tone:

When Jacob the Patriarch crossed his hands as he blessed his <u>chi</u>ldren / He foreshadowed the mighty <u>sign</u> of the Cross. / <u>Now</u> it is our firm defense that cannot be <u>va</u>nquished; / With its invincible might we drive out the demonic <u>legions</u>, / We cast down Belial's <u>arrogance</u>, / And we put to flight the hateful pride of <u>A</u>malek; / And now that it is lifted <u>up</u> on high, We the faithful, piously offer it to Thy goodness, for the <u>cleansing</u> of our sins, / And we cry aloud with many <u>voi</u>ces: / Have mercy on us, O Lord, made flesh from the <u>Virgin</u>, /// And take pity, O Good One, on the works that Thou hast fashioned in Thy <u>Wi</u>sdom.

Or the Dogmatic Theotokion if a Resurrection Service.

At the Aposticha, these stichera, in Tone 2: To the melody "O house of Ephratha"

The Church is <u>brightly</u> adorned /

AFTERFEAST OF THE EXALTATION; GREATMARTYR EUSTATHIUS

With Thy deifying water and <u>blood</u>, O Word, /// And she proclaims the <u>glo</u>ry of the Cross.

Verse: Extol the Lord; worship at His footstool for it is holy.

Lifting high the <u>spear</u> and the nails / Which pierced Thy Life-bearing <u>Bo</u>dy, /// We venerate the precious <u>Cross</u>, O Christ.

Verse: God is our King before the ages: He hath wrought salvation in the midst of the earth.

When Moses defeated <u>A</u>malek, / By raising his arms in the <u>form</u> of the Cross /// He portrayed Thy most pure <u>sufferings</u>, O Christ.

Glory..., of the Greatmartyr, in Tone 6: the composition of Ephraim of Karyes

How shall we praise thee <u>wo</u>rthily, / O Eustathius, with thy <u>stea</u>dfast soul? / For being deprived of thy goods, and thy wife and thy <u>chi</u>ldren, / Thou didst cry out with the blessèd and <u>glo</u>rious Job: / 'The Lord hath given; the Lord hath <u>taken away</u>, / As it was well pleasing to the Lord so it hath <u>come</u> to be!' / But the God whom thou didst so love and fervently <u>che</u>rish / Returned them again to thee, / Foreseeing that they would join thee in thy <u>sufferings</u>. / And with them, after a multitude of <u>to</u>rments / Thou didst attain a <u>ble</u>ssed end, / And having them now as thy companions in <u>heaven</u> /// Intercede together with them before the Lord that we be delivered from our sins.

Now and ever..., of the Feast, in the same Tone:

O <u>Cross</u> of Christ, / Thou hope of <u>Chri</u>stians, / Instructor of those who have <u>gone</u> astray, / Refuge of the storm-tossed and victory in <u>ba</u>ttle, / The confirmation of the <u>u</u>niverse, / Physician of the sick and the resur<u>re</u>ction of the dead, /// Have <u>me</u>rcy on us!

The Troparion of the Martyrs, in Tone 4:

Thy holy <u>ma</u>rtyrs, O Lord / Through their sufferings received their incorruptible crowns from <u>Thee</u> our God. / For having Thy strength they laid low their <u>enemies</u> / And shattered the powerless boldness of <u>d</u>emons. /// Through their intercessions, O Christ God, <u>save</u> our souls.

Glory..., now and ever.... The Troparion of the Feast, in Tone 1:

O Lord, save thy <u>people</u> / And bless Thine in<u>he</u>ritance. / <u>Grant</u> victories to the Orthodox <u>Chri</u>stians / Over their <u>a</u>dversaries; / And by <u>vi</u>rtue of Thy Cross /// Preserve Thy habitation.

At "God is the Lord...," the Troparion of the Feast, O Lord, save Thy people..., twice; Glory..., Martyr: Now and ever..., Feast: O Lord, save Thy people..., *(again)*.

After the Third Ode, the Kontakion of the Feast, in Tone 4:

As Thou wast voluntarily crucified for <u>our</u> sake, / Grant mercy to those who are <u>called</u> by Thy name. / Make all Orthodox Christians glad by Thy <u>po</u>wer / Granting them victories over their <u>a</u>dversaries /// By bestowing upon them the invincible trophy, Thy <u>weapon</u> of peace.

After the Sixth Ode, the Kontakion of the Martyr, in Tone 2: *To the melody, "Seeking the highest...."*

O holy Eu<u>sta</u>thius / Thou wast an imitator of Christ in His <u>pa</u>ssion. / Thou didst <u>drink</u> of His cup with <u>cou</u>rage / And didst become a sharer of His <u>glory</u> /// So the God of us all granted thee the divine power of working <u>wo</u>nders.

At the Aposticha, these stichera, in Tone 2: To the melody, "O house of Ephrata...."

The Cross of Christ, is exalted today; / It is the <u>Tree</u> of life / On which <u>He</u> who re<u>stores</u> mankind /// Was <u>nailed</u> in the flesh. *Verse:* Extol the Lord; worship at His footstool for it is holy.

Rejoice, O <u>Cross</u> of the Lord, / Thou divine guardian of the <u>fai</u>thful, / O thou in<u>vi</u>ncible <u>ra</u>mpart /// Which is raised up from the <u>earth</u> today.

Verse: God is our King before the ages: He hath wrought salvation in the midst of the earth.

Come all ye <u>fai</u>thful, / And let us venerate with joy today, / The Wood of our sal<u>va</u>tion /// On which was stretched out Christ the Re<u>dee</u>mer.

Glory..., of the Martyr, in Tone 8:

Like <u>Paul</u>, thou didst not receive the divine <u>call</u> from men, / O martyr Eu<u>sta</u>thius, / But from God Himself, in whom thou didst believe in the a<u>ssu</u>rance <u>of</u> the Cross; / Thou didst confound the impiety of <u>ty</u>rants / By mocking their cruel <u>to</u>rments; / Thou didst resist the temptation of sin to the <u>she</u>dding <u>of</u> thy blood; / Thou didst fight against the in<u>vi</u>sible foes. / Now thou didst intercede continually before our <u>King</u> and our God /// That He grant peace to the world and sal<u>va</u>tion to our souls.

Now and ever..., of the Feast, in the same Tone:

Today we see the words of Thy prophet Moses fulfilled: /
Behold, you shall see your Life hang before thee! /
And today the Cross is exalted and the world is made free of error.
Today the Church is renewed in the Resurrection of Christ, /
And today the ends of the earth greatly rejoice: /
Like David, with cymbals, they offer their songs of praise to Thee: /
O God, who through the Cross and Resurrection hast wrought salvation in the midst of of the earth.
And through them Thou hast saved us, O Lover of man. ///
O Almighty Lord, glory to Thee!

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
