Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 3 stichera, in Tone 8: To the melody, "O most glorious wonder...."

Let us <u>bless</u> the glorious Athe<u>nog</u>enēs, / Robed in the bright vestments of the <u>prie</u>sthood / Made more hon'rable by the <u>pu</u>rple <u>of</u> his blood. / For being thus adorned, he entered into the heavenly <u>temple</u> / Coming before the Lord who <u>kno</u>west all things, / There to serve Him together with the <u>bo</u>diless <u>angels</u> /// And be illumined by communion divine.

Through <u>faith</u>, the wise hierarch Athe<u>nog</u>enēs, / Led a company of <u>ma</u>rtyrs to Christ / Who suffered courageously and <u>fi</u>nished the <u>course</u> of their race. / Together with them, he triumphed over the <u>evil</u> one / And was joined to the choirs of the martyrs in <u>heaven</u> / Where being sanctified by communion, they inter<u>cede</u> on be<u>half</u> of those /// Who ceaselessly glorify their holy <u>me</u>mory.

The <u>ten</u> divinely chosen di<u>sciples</u> / Fought in the ascetic arena and mastered the <u>passions</u>, / And having Athanogenēs as their holy instructor and <u>by</u> the <u>po</u>wer of God / They put the <u>se</u>rpent to death. / Through their prayers, O compassionate One, ///

Save us, who always hope in Thee and Thy great goodness.

Glory..., now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone: (and melody)

<u>Save</u> me, O most pure sovereign <u>Lady</u>, / Who ineffably bore Christ our <u>Savior</u>! / For I have thee as my invincible <u>wall</u> and protection; / O mediatrix, joy and divine consolation of my soul, / Thou alone can deliver me from the gnawing of the <u>worm</u> that never sleeps /// And from the eternal fire, O Mother of <u>Christ</u> God.

Or this Stavrotheotokion, in the same Tone: (and melody)

"<u>What</u> is this <u>sight</u> that I see, / What do mine eyes behold, O <u>Ma</u>ster? /

16 JULY

Thou, who sustainest all creation, lifted <u>up on</u> the Tree, / Dost die granting <u>life</u> to all," / Cried the Theotokos, weeping, when she be<u>held</u> upon the Cross /// The God-man who had ineffably shone <u>forth</u> from her.

The General Troparion of a Hieromartyr, in Tone 4: (None given in the Menaion)

Like the apostles in <u>cha</u>racter, / A successor on their throne, O divinely-in<u>spi</u>red one / Through visions thou didst <u>find</u> thy work / Rightly dividing the <u>word</u> of truth. / Thou didst suffer for the <u>sake</u> of the faith / Even to the <u>she</u>dding of thy blood /// O Hieromartyr Athanogenēs, pray to Christ God that our souls may be saved.

The Canon of the Saint and his 10 disciples in Tone 8,

having the acrostic: "I praise and glorify thy martyrs," the composition of Joseph, —incomplete as of 3/28/2017

After the Sixth Ode, the Kontakion, in Tone 4:

Having great love for the <u>Ma</u>ster, /

Like a good shepherd, thou didst lay down thy life for the <u>sheep</u> of Christ. / For this we <u>praise</u> thee /

And the ten disciples whom thou didst instruct in the fear of God and who suffered with thee. /

Thus having pleased the Master

He gave you each a crown of victory with His <u>life</u>-creating hand. /// Therefore, pray to Him on be<u>half</u> of us all.

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
