### Vespers

# At "Lord, I call...," 3 stichera, in Tone 2: To the melody, "When from the tree...."

When the <u>chief</u> of the disciples traveled the world <u>stre</u>ngthening all, /

He discovered thee, O father, as a precious stone /

And installed thee as one of the foun<u>da</u>tions of the Church, /

To destroy the pillars and the temples of idolatry ///

By the divine power of the Word who condescended for our sake to become incarnate.

<u>Dri</u>ving away the wickedness of evil spirits <u>by</u> thy words /

Thou didst make men spiritual by the grace of the Spirit, /

Cultivating the field of their hearts and planting the <u>di</u>vine seed. /

By these deeds thou didst attain to heaven, O Pancratius, ///

Praying for those who with faith glorify thee.

Thou didst bear, O Pancratius, the Sun of the knowledge of God /

Who ineffably shone forth upon us from the Virgin's womb, /

And the western sky was lit, following thy steps, with the rising glory of the East, /

And when it was darkened by thy suffering, O father, thou didst shine in the glory of the never-waning Light /

And <u>now</u>, as though having passed through a <u>loo</u>king glass, ///

Thou dost behold the Inspiration of thine accomplishments.

## Glory..., now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone: (and melody)

Thou alone didst bear within thy womb /

The uncontainable God without confining Him, /

Who in His goodness became a man. /

Therefore, I beseech thee, O All-holy Bride of God, /

Set me free of the passions which confine me ///

That walking the straight and narrow path I may reach that which leads to Life, O <u>La</u>dy.

# **Or this Stavrotheotokion in the same Tone:** (and melody)

Beholding thee nailed to the wood of the Cross, O Jesus /

She who know not wedlock cried out weeping: /

"O sweet Child, Thou Unapproachable Light of the All-unoriginate Father, /

Why hast Thou left me alone, who gave birth to Thee?

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But <u>hasten Thou and glorify Thyself</u> ///
That they who glorify Thy divine sufferings may receive divine <u>glory!</u>"

Or Dogmatic Theotokion if a Resurrection service.

### The Troparion of the Saint, in Tone 4:

Like the apostles in <u>character</u>, /
A successor on their throne, O divinely-in<u>spi</u>red one /
Through visions thou didst <u>find</u> thy work /
Rightly dividing the <u>word</u> of truth. /
Thou didst suffer for the <u>sake</u> of the faith /
Even to the <u>she</u>dding of thy blood ///
O hieromartyr Pancratius, pray to Christ God that our souls may be saved.

### After the Sixth Ode, the Kontakion of the Saint, in Tone 4:

Thou didst shine like a brilliant star for the people of Taormina / And thou didst suffer for the <u>sake</u> of Christ. ///
Standing now before Him, pray for them that honor thee, O blessèd Pancratius.

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
