What shall we call thee, O <u>glo</u>rious one? / Soldier of the mighty <u>King</u> and God, / For putting down the daring impiety of <u>demons</u>? / Lamp, for shining brilliantly with <u>spi</u>ritual light? / Most-powerful destroyer of <u>idols</u>? / Most-fervent champion and <u>rightful martyr</u>? /// Pray that our <u>souls</u> may be saved.

What shall we now call thee, O Sabinas? / River of living waters pouring forth torrents <u>spi</u>ritual gifts / Truly-inexhaustible <u>flood</u> of <u>hea</u>lings / For those who are <u>cru</u>elly oppressed? / Cup, giving us a taste of <u>ho</u>liness? / Most-true wonderworker, equal in <u>ho</u>nor with the <u>angels</u>? /// Pray that our souls may be saved.

What shall we proclaim of thee, O holy one? / Guide for the return of those gone astray? / Or intercessor for us sinners? / True physician of those beset by the violence of evil? / Precious and fragrant lily of paradise? / Foundation and confirmation of martyrs? / Ever-flowing fountain of miracles and cha'mpion most-true? /// Pray that our souls may be saved.

Glory..., now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone: (and melody)

Whom art thou emulating, O wretched soul? / One who never rises to repentance? / One not afraid of the fire awaiting the wicked? / Arise, and quickly call on her who is our lone defense, / And cry out: "O Virgin Mother! / Entreat thy Son and our God /// That He deliver my soul from the snare of the deceiver!"

When <u>she</u> be<u>held</u> the Lamb / Stretched out by His own will upon the <u>Tree</u> of the Cross, / With maternal tears the <u>Ewe</u>-lamb <u>cried</u> aloud: / "Oh, my Son, what is this strange <u>sight</u> that I see? / How is it He, Who giveth life to <u>all</u> as Lord, / Is put to <u>death</u> by long<u>suffering, /</u> While granting the earthborn the resur<u>rection</u>? /// O my God, I glorify Thy great conde<u>scension</u>!"

The General Troparion of the Martyrs, in Tone 4: (none given in the Menaion)

Thy holy martyrs, Sabinas and <u>Papas</u>, O Lord, / Through their sufferings received their incorruptible crowns from <u>Thee</u>, our God / For having Thy strength they laid low their <u>enemies</u> / And shattered the powerless boldness of <u>demons</u> /// Through their intercessions, O Christ God, <u>save</u> our souls.
