## Vespers

## At "Lord, I call...," 3 stichera, Tone 4: To the melody, "Thou hast given a sign...."

The city of Rome pre<u>sents</u> thee today / As a sweet-smelling and beautifully <u>blo</u>ssoming rose / Per<u>fum</u>ing the thoughts of the faithful with the fragrance of the <u>vi</u>rtues / And dispelling the stench of the <u>passions</u> by grace, / O much suffering martyr Agrip<u>pi</u>na, / Thou adornment of the martyrs and confir<u>mation</u> of the Church, /// Boast of the virgins and sea of <u>mi</u>racles.

Christ our God hath given thee to <u>Si</u>cily / As a pearl of great price, O <u>martyr</u> of Rome . / <u>There</u>, by thy presence, O <u>glo</u>rious one, / Multitudes of evil demons are driven away by thine inter<u>ce</u>ssions. / Therefore, we call thee blessèd and celebrate today thy holy <u>sufferings</u>, /// O virgin martyr Agrip<u>pi</u>na.

Bassa and Paula bore thee upon their <u>shoulders</u> / At the command of Him who <u>bears</u> all things, / <u>Moving thee from place to place, making thy way across</u> the sea / All the while working miracles through divine grace. / And coming to rest at the place God ap<u>pointed for thee, ///</u> Thou givest rest to all the heavy-laden who come to thee, O glorious Agrip<u>pi</u>na.

*Note:* But if we sing "Alleluia" at the morning service instead of "God is the Lord," then the following 3 stichera to the Theotokos are sung at the evening service, at "Lord I call," before the above stichera of the saints, in the same tone and melody:

Rejoice, thou divine <u>ra</u>diance / Rejoice, thou throne of the never-<u>setting Sun /</u> Who shone <u>forth</u> with Its ineffable Light upon the world! / Rejoice, O divine perception, shimmering with <u>kno</u>wledge divine, / Flashing with the lightening that enlightens the ends of the world! / Rejoice, thou good, all-pure and golden <u>ra</u>diance, ///

#### 23 JUNE

That shines the unwaning Light upon us the faithful.

Wash away the filth of the <u>pa</u>ssions of my heart / O all-praised Theotokos / And <u>cleanse</u> all the wounds which come from my sins and their cor<u>ruption</u>, / O <u>pure</u> one; / Set in order my un<u>sta</u>ble mind / So that I who am condemned and am thy worthless <u>se</u>rvant /// May magnify thy power and great protection.
O all-pure Virgin <u>Mo</u>ther of God / Remove all weakness and despondency from my soul / And tran<u>slate</u> it to health and <u>vigor</u> / That I may fulfill the commandments of Christ with <u>love</u> and fear / Hoping to escape the unbearable flames of Ge<u>henna</u> /// And joyfully receive the heavenly portion of life eternal.

## Glory..., now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone:

Take pity upon me, O <u>La</u>dy, / For I am failing under the assaults of the <u>de</u>mons / And am <u>falling</u> into the pit of des<u>truction</u>, / And establish me upon the rock of <u>vi</u>rtues; / And having overturned the designs of the <u>enemy</u> / Grant me to fulfill the commands of thy <u>Son</u> and our God, /// That on the Day of Judgment I may receive re<u>mi</u>ssion of my sins.

#### Or the Stavrotheotokion, in the same Tone:

Beholding Christ, who loveth mankind, <u>cru</u>cified, / His side <u>pierced</u> by a spear, / The all-<u>pure</u> one, cried aloud, la<u>menting</u>: / 'What is this, <u>O</u> my Son? / How have these thankless people re<u>wa</u>rded Thee / For all the good things Thou hast <u>done</u> for them? / Dost Thou hasten to leave me childless, O most be<u>loved Son?</u> /// I marvel, O Compassionate One, at Thy voluntary cruci<u>fi</u>xion!'

*Or, on Friday or Saturday evening the Dogmatic Theotokion in the Tone of the Week.* 

## The Troparion of the Martyr, in Tone 4:

O Jesus, Thy lamb Agrippina /

#### HOLY MARTYR AGRIPPINA

Cries out to Thee with <u>great</u> love: / "O my Bridegroom, I long for <u>Thee</u> in pain, / I am crucified with Thee, and in baptism <u>bu</u>ried with Thee; / I suffer for Thy sake in order to <u>reign</u> with Thee, / I die for Thee in order to <u>live</u> in Thee. / Accept me as a spotless <u>victim</u> / Since I am put to death because of my <u>love</u> for Thee." /// Through her prayers, O Merciful One, save our souls.
