Commemoration of the Miracle of the Archangel Michael at Colossæ in Chone; also, the Commemoration of the Martyr Eudoxius and those with him; and our Venerable Father Archippus of Hierapolis.

Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 6 stichera of the Archangel, in Tone 4: To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."

O Archangel Michael, / Most radiant commander of the Powers of the Threefold Sun, / Thou hast shown thyself rejoicing with the heavenly host and crying out: / Holy art Thou, O Father! / Holy art Thou, O co-eternal Word! / Holy art Thou, O Holy Spirit! /// One Dominion, One Glory, One Nature, One Divinity and One Power! (twice) Fiery is thy visage and wondrous is thy goodness, / O Michael, thou foremost of the angels, / For in thine immaterial nature thou dost traverse all the ends of the earth / Fulfilling all the commands of the Creator! / Thou art known for thy power and strength! /// And the holy temple dedicated to thy name is become a source of healing! (twice) As it is written in the Scripture, / Thou makest Thine angels spirits and Thy ministers a flaming fire! / Thou hast revealed Thy champion, Michael, O Lord, / As the commander of the ranks of the archangels, / For he obeys Thine every command, O Word, /// And ever singing the Thrice-holy hymn he proclaims Thy glorious majesty. (twice)

Glory..., in Tone 6: In the regular melody. The composition of Byzantius

Rejoice together with us ye ranks of angels, /
For the chief commander of the archangels, Michael,
Who is the foremost of your hosts, and our great defender, /
Today sanctifies the temple of God named in his honor /
By revealing himself to us. /
Therefore, we worthily praise him and we cry aloud: ///

Shelter us under the shadow of thy wings, O most glorious Archangel Michael!

6 SEPTEMBER

Now and ever..., Theotokion in the same Tone:

Rejoice with us, ye choirs of <u>virgins</u> /
For our great protectress and inter<u>cessor</u> /
Comforts all the sorrowing on this <u>festive</u> day. /
Therefore, we faithfully cry a<u>loud</u> to her: ///
Cover us with thy divine protection, O most pure Lady, the Mother of God.

Or the Dogmatic Theotokion in the Tone of the Week if the Sunday Before.

The Aposticha is from the Octoechos, and:

Glory..., now and ever..., in Tone 8: *In the Regular Melody, the composition of Monk John*

As thou art champion and chief commander of the angels /
Free from all necessity, sorrows, illness and evil sins /
Those who faithfully sing and beseech thee, O glorious one; /
For clearly thou who art immaterial /
Dost behold the Immaterial One /
And art illumined with the immaterial light of the Master's glory. /
For He in His love for mankind received our flesh from the Virgin ///
Desiring to save mankind.

The Troparion of the Archangel, in Tone 4:

O foremost leader of the heavenly hosts /
We who are unworthy beseech thee /
By thy prayers to encompass us /
With the shadow of thine immaterial glory. /
We fall down before thee, and cry out ceaselessly: /
Deliver us from all danger! ///
Since thou art the prince of the ranks of dominions on-High!
