Robed in the vestments of the priest of the Law, /

And we praise thee, who, in thine old age begat the Forerunner, John. ///
And entreat thee to be eech God that He may save our souls.

melody, "O most glorious wonder...."
"What is this sight that I see, /
What do mine eyes behold, O Master? /

Thou, Who sustainest all creation, lifted <u>up on</u> the Tree, /
Dost die granting <u>life</u> to all," /

Beholding Thee, her Lamb being voluntarily led to the slaughter / The chaste ewe-lamb wept and cried aloud: / "What dost thou do, striving to make me childless, O Christ, / Who gave birth to Thee, the Deliverer of all? / Yet I glorify Thine ineffable grace past all understanding, O Lover of mankind.

The Troparion of the Prophet Zachariah, in Tone 4:

Robed in the garments of the priesthood, O truly <u>wise</u> one, /
Thou didst offer whole-burnt offerings to God in ac<u>cordance</u> with the Law, /
And thou didst become a shining light and beholder of the <u>My</u>steries /
Bearing within thyself the signs of grace, O all-<u>wise</u> one. /
Slain by the sword in the temple of God, O <u>prophet</u> of Christ, ///
Intercede together with the Fore<u>runner</u>, John, ///
