# Vespers

# At "Lord, I call...," 6 stichera:

3 stichera of the Feast in Tone 1: To the melody, "Joy of the ranks of heavens...."

The Cre<u>a</u>tor of all and our De<u>li</u>verer / Is borne into the temple by His Virgin <u>Mo</u>ther, / And re<u>cei</u>ving Him the elder cries a<u>loud</u> in joy / Now lettest Thou thy servant depart in <u>peace</u>, O <u>Good</u> One; /// Let this be done ac<u>cor</u>ding to Thy will!

<u>Si</u>meon receives the Creator of all from the arms of the <u>Virgin</u>, / The Savior of all who was begotten before all <u>ages</u>; / And he <u>cries</u> aloud <u>saying</u>: / I have beheld Thy brilliant <u>radiance shi</u>ning forth, / Now <u>lettest</u> Thou thy servant depart in peace, O <u>Good</u> One; /// For mine eyes have be<u>held</u> Thee today.

<u>Si</u>meon bears in his arms the <u>Sav</u>ior / Who, in the fullness of time was born for the salvation of <u>mankind</u>; / And he <u>cries</u> aloud rejoicing: / I have seen the light of the nations and the <u>glo</u>ry of <u>I</u>srael / Now <u>lettest</u> Thou thy servant depart from among those <u>here</u> in peace /// According to Thy command, for <u>Thou</u> art God!

And 3 stichera, in Tone 4: To the melody, "Thou hast given a sign...."

O divinely-in<u>spired</u> one, / As one righteous, perfected, and <u>glo</u>rious in all, / Thou didst take <u>up</u> in thine arms the One <u>Pe</u>rfect God / Who didst come, Incarnate, to justify the world. / And thou didst cry out to Him that thou mightiest be released from thy <u>bo</u>dy: / Now lettest Thou thy servant de<u>part</u> in peace, / For I have be<u>held</u> Thee today /// O Thou who lovest <u>mankind</u>.

Young in spirit, yet elderly in body, O <u>Si</u>meon / Thou wast given a promise not to see death until thou didst be<u>hold</u> in thine arms /

The Righteous God-bearer Simeon and Anna the Prophetess; and the Equal-to-the-Apostle Nikolai, Archbishop of Tokyo and Apostle to Japan, whose service is provided separately after this. — not completed, as of 1/2013.

## 3 FEBRUARY

The young <u>Babe</u> who before time is the God and Cre<u>a</u>tor of all / Who had humbled Himself to take <u>on</u> our flesh / And beholding Him thou didst cry out rejoicing: /// Asking to be released from that same flesh and so come into the divine <u>mansions</u>.

The divinely-inspired <u>Anna</u> /

And the all-rich Simeon, resplendent in <u>prophecy</u>, / Are <u>manifest as blameless according to the Law /</u> Beholding the Bestower of the Law manifest among us as a <u>little Babe.</u> / Therefore, let us bow down in worship be<u>fore</u> Him / And joyously celebrate today their <u>me</u>mory /// Glorifying, as is meet, the Lord Jesus, who loveth mankind.

# Glory..., now and ever..., in Tone 5: The composition of Germanus

The <u>Ancient of Days, having become a Babe /</u> Is borne into the temple by His Virgin <u>Mother /</u> Ful<u>filling the promise of His own Law; /</u> And <u>Simeon, receiving Him, said: /</u> O Holy One, now lettest Thou thy servant de<u>part in peace ///</u> For mine eyes have <u>seen Thy salvation</u>.

# At the Aposticha, these stichera, in Tone 1: To the melody, "Joy of the ranks of heaven...."

Let us <u>ce</u>lebrate today the saving grace of the ineffable manifes<u>ta</u>tion of God: / For Christ God, having without change became a Babe through the Virgin <u>Mai</u>den, Is <u>borne</u> by His Mother into the temple of God His <u>Fa</u>ther /// And receiving Him, Simeon embraces <u>Him</u> in his arms.

*Verse:* Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant depart in peace.

Thou wast <u>seen</u> by the <u>prophets</u> of old / Insofar as they were able, O <u>Je</u>sus; / But <u>now</u>, Thou hast revealed Thyself of Thine own will, O <u>Word</u> of God, / In the flesh through the <u>Virgin Mary</u>, O Christ, / And hath made <u>ma</u>nifest to all Thy sal<u>va</u>tion, / O Thou, who art descended from <u>A</u>dam, /// For Thou art the lover of <u>ma</u>nkind.

*Verse:* A light to enlighten the Gentiles, and the glory of Thy people Israel.

**O** <u>Christ</u>, who of old laid down the Law upon Mount <u>Si</u>nai / Now fulfills the Law upon Mount <u>Zi</u>on; /

#### RIGHTEOUS SIMEON AND ANNA THE PROPHETESS

Thou hast de<u>sired</u> to be carried forth into the temple in the arms of the Theo<u>tokos</u>, / And be given in to the <u>arms</u> of <u>Si</u>meon. /// Together with the doves of <u>sac</u>rifice.

## Glory..., now and ever..., in Tone 1: The composition of Monk John

To<u>day</u>, He who gave the Law to Moses upon Mount <u>Si</u>nai / Submits Himself to the com<u>mands</u> of the Law, For <u>in</u> His loving kindness He has become <u>likened</u> to us. / And now our Pure God, having opened the <u>womb</u> of the <u>pure</u> one, / Is <u>offered</u> to Himself, as <u>God</u>, /// Freeing us from the curse of the Law and en<u>lightening</u> our souls.

#### The Troparion of the Feast, in Tone 1:

Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, full of <u>grace!</u> / From thee hast risen the Sun of Righteousness, <u>Christ</u> our God, / Who gives <u>light</u> to those in <u>da</u>rkness. / Rejoice, also, O righteous <u>elder</u>; / Thou didst ac<u>cept</u> in thine arms the Re<u>dee</u>mer of our souls /// Who grants us the resur<u>re</u>ction.

#### Matins

## At "God is the Lord...," the Troparion of the Feast, thrice.

The Kontakion of the Saint, in Tone 4: To the melody, "Thou hast appeared today...."

Today the elder <u>asked</u> to be loosed / From the bonds of this life of cor<u>ruption</u> /// Receiving in his arms Christ, the Cre<u>a</u>tor and Lord.

#### The Kontakion of the Feast, in Tone 1:

By Thy Nativity, Thou didst sanctify the <u>Vi</u>rgin's womb, / And didst bless Simeon's hands, O <u>Christ</u> God. / <u>Now</u> Thou hast come and saved us through <u>love</u>. /// Grant peace to all Orthodox Christians, O only Lover of <u>mankind</u>!

At the Aposticha, these stichera, in Tone 6: To the melody, "On the third day...."

Take up in thine arms, O <u>Si</u>meon, / Take up the Cre<u>a</u>tor of all; / O Elder, take up Christ to whom the Virgin Maiden gave <u>birth</u> without seed /// Unto the joy of our race.

#### **3 FEBRUARY**

*Verse:* Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant depart in peace.

Let us praise the <u>Gi</u>ver of the Law, / Before whom the hosts of angels <u>tre</u>mble; / Come all ye people as<u>se</u>mbled / And let us praise the only Bene<u>factor</u>, /// Unto the sal<u>va</u>tion of our souls.

*Verse:* A light to enlighten the Gentiles, and the glory of Thy people Israel.

Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant de<u>part</u> in peace, / From the bonds of cor<u>ruption</u> / As thou didst <u>pro</u>mise, / For I have be<u>held</u> Thee, O Christ /// The pre-eternal Light which enlightens the Gentiles and Israel.

# Glory..., now and ever..., in Tone 2:

Today the Holy Virgin brought the Holy One to the priest in the <u>temple</u>, / And stretching for his hands, Simeon re<u>ceived</u> Him; / And rejoicing, he <u>cried</u> aloud: / Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant de<u>part</u> in peace / Let this be according to Thy word!

# Liturgy

At the Beatitudes, 8 Troparia: 4 from the First Ode of the Canon of the Feast, and 4 from the Fourth Ode of the Canon of the Saint.

The Prokeimenon of the Feast, and one for the Saints, in Tone 7: The righteous one shall rejoice in the Lord, and shall set his hope in Him.

The Epistle: (321-ctr) Hebrews 7:7-17

The Alleluia of the Feast, and one for the Saints in Tone 7: Light dawns for the righteous, and joy for the upright in heart.

**The Gospel ( 8)** Luke 2:25-38

**The Communion Hymn of the Feast, and also for the Saints:** The righteous shall be in everlasting remembrance. He shall not be afraid of evil tidings.

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
