# Vespers

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At "Lord, I call...," 6 stichera,
3 stichera, in Tone 8: To the melody, "O most glorious wonder...."
O Stephen, first to suffer among the martyrs /
Foundation of the ministry /
And chosen apostle, /
Illumine us who are celebrating thy radiant festival /
With the splendor of the never-waning light, /
Dispelling the darkness of our transgressions, O martyr, /
Granting mercy and grace upon thy servants, ///
And guiding them, by thy prayers, to everlasting life.
Taking up a crown of grace upon thy head, O Stephen, /
Martyr of Christ, /
Thou wast shown to be worthy of thy name, /
For the crown of thy head became adorned with the gold of virtue, /
And wisely didst thou become an abode of Wisdom, /
Whom thou didst cherish transforming thyself with love. ///
Therefore thou hast been honored with glory and grace.
Thou didst offer to our God and King, O apostle, /
A crown more precious than gold and precious stones, /
But one fashioned out of rational wisdom. /
O all-honorable Stephen, first among the martyrs, /
Crowned with glory and grace, /
Sweet are thy deeds and sweet is thy name. ///
Remember us all in thy holy intercessions.
And 3 stichera in Tone 2: In the usual melody, the composition of Anatolius.
First among deacons and first among the martyrs /
O most-holy Stephen, /
Thou didst show the way to be followed by the saints, /
Leading a countless number of martyrs to the Lord. /
The heavens opened and God Himself appeared to thee. ///
Intercede with Him for the salvation of our souls.
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#### 2 AUGUST

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Clothing thyself in holiness, /
O blessèd companion of the angels,
Protodeacon and protomartyr Stephen, /
Intercede with the only Sinless One, our Savior and Lord, ///
For the salvation of our souls
Let us worthily honor the first martyr and noble favorite of Christ, /
Stephen the protodeacon and protomartyr, /
For standing in the midst of the impious ///
He beheld the Son of God standing at the right hand of the Father.
Glory..., in Tone 6: also, the composition of Anatolius.
O holy Apostle Stephen, /
First among deacons and the first among the martyrs, /
The glory of the righteous, the confirmation of the faithful, /
And the adornment of all who suffer for the Lord, /
As thou standest now before the throne of Christ the King of all /
Entreat the remission of sins for all the faithful who celebrate thy holy memory, ///
And that we may be counted worthy of the heavenly kingdom. ///
Now and ever..., Theotokion, in Tone 6, or the Stavrotheotokion, in the same
Tone: To the melody "On the third day...."
Beholding Thee crucified, O Christ /
She who gave Thee birth cried out to Thee: /
"What is this strange mystery I see, my Son? /
How, being hung in the flesh, the Giver of Life, ///
Dost Thou die on the Tree?"
Or Dogmatic Theotokion in the Tone of the Week if a Resurrection service.
At the Aposticha, the stichera from the Octoechos, and
Glory..., of the Saint, in Tone 8: the composition of Cyprian.
Rejoice in the Lord, O crown-bearer Stephen, /
Emulator of the Master, /
For thou wast the first martyr of Christ the King. /
By thy suffering thou didst triumph over the errors of the impious, ///
And art ever praying for us before the Lord.

#### RELICS PROTOMARTYR STEPHEN

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Beholding Thee, O Jesus, nailed to the Cross /
And accepting suffering of Thine own will, /
The Virgin, Thy Mother, O Master, cried aloud: /
"Woe is me, O my sweet Child! /
How is it that Thou dost endure unjust wounding, /
O Physician who healeth the infirmities of mankind ///
And by Thy loving-kindness dost deliver all from corruption?"
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## The Troparion of the Saint, in Tone 4:

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O protomartyr <u>Stephen</u>, /
Thy head was adorned with a royal crown for thy suffering for <u>Christ</u> our God; /
For having denounced the outrage of the <u>impious</u> /
Thou didst behold thy Savior at the right hand of the <u>Fa</u>ther. ///
Entreat Him now for the salvation of our souls.
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**Note:** Following the dismissal of Vespers, the priest, vested in his phelonion, accompanied by the deacon in his sticharion and by the candle-bearers with the censor, carries the precious Cross back into the sanctuary, to the singing of the Troparion and Kontakion of the Cross, where it is placed upon the altar.

#### The Canon

Both Canons from the Octoechos, with 8 Troparia (excluding those for martyrs), and that of the Saint, with 6 Troparia, in Tone 8,

having the acrostic: "I crown the protomartyr with hymns of praise," the composition of Theophanes.

### The Kontakion of the Saint in Tone 8:

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O blessèd protomartyr Stephen, worthy of <u>all</u> praise, /
Thou wast the first to be planted in the earth by the divine <u>Gardener</u>. /
And being the very first to have shed his <u>blood</u> for Him ///
Thou didst become the first to receive the crown of victory from Christ in <u>hea</u>ven.
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At the Praises, 4 stichera, in Tone 4: To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."

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Having mystically as<u>sem</u>bled today, /
O ye lovers of the <u>feasts</u> of the Church /
Let us <u>cel</u>ebrate the solemn and honorable <u>me</u>mory /
Of the protomartyr [<u>Stephen</u>], /
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And through his precious gifts, let us receive healing, /
And let us cry aloud: /
O all-praised martyr [of the Lord], /
Beseech Him that those who celebrate thy holy memory may [be saved].

Like the steps on the stairway leading to heaven /
Were the stones that were cast at thee /
And having ascended upon them thou didst behold the Lord /
Standing at the right hand of the Father, /
Stretching forth His Life-creating hand to thee /
Awarding thee the crown worthy of thy name. /
Now thou standest before Him as a victorious champion, ///
The very first among all them that have suffered.
Thy mind was enlightened by spiritual grace /
And thou didst appear as an angel: /
Thy body shone with inner radiance, O Stephen, /
And thy face was aglow with a spiritual splendor that all could see,
For thou didst receive the Light when the heavens were gloriously opened to thee ///
O first and great boast among all the martyrs.
Glory..., of the Saint, in the same Tone: In the usual melody
Stephen, the splendid first-fruit of all the martyrs, /
Filled with grace and power [of God] /
Working wondrous miracles and signs among the people
Was slain at the hands of the impious;
And his face shone like that of an angel, /
And he beheld Thy glory, [O Christ God], /
Who was crucified for our sake, standing at the right hand of Power, /
And he was taken up into heaven by the Spirit of Grace. ///
Therefore, together with the choir of angels, he prays that our souls may be saved.

melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."
Seeing Thee the Lamb and Shepherd on the tree, /
The ewe-lamb who gave birth to Thee lamented, /
And as a mother cried out to Thee: /
"O desired Son, how art Thou hung on the Tree of the Cross, /
O Longsuffering One? /
How art Thy hands and feet nailed by the transgressors, O Word? /

O protomartyr, protodeacon and apostle, /

**The Epistle:** (17) Acts 6:8-7:5,47-60

The Alleluia is in Tone 1: The heavens shall confess Thy wonders, O Lord, and Thy truth in the congregation of the saints! *Verse*: God is glorified in the council of the saints!

**The Gospel:** (87) Matthew 21:33-42

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**The Communion Hymn:** Their proclamation is gone out into all the earth / and their words to the ends of the universe!
