# The 27<sup>th</sup> Day of April Commemoration of the Holy Hieromartyr Simeon, the Kinsman of the Lord

### Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 6 stichera:

3 from the Pentecostarion,

and 3 for the Hieromartyr, in Tone 4: To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."

Thou hast shone forth, O <u>Si</u>meon, / As a sacred priest and as a martyr con<u>de</u>mned under the law, / A true <u>ki</u>nsman of the Creator and a wondrous worker of <u>mi</u>racles, / A radiant beacon, a <u>guide</u> for the lost, / An unshakable pillar of the <u>Church</u> of Christ, /// And an heir of the heavenly kingdom and an equal of the <u>angels</u>.

After suffering great physical <u>to</u>rment / And bearing great wounds on thy <u>bo</u>dy / Thou didst a<u>pproach</u> thy cross, O wondrous <u>hi</u>erarch / Emulating Christ, who was crucified of His <u>own</u> will. / Wherefore celebrating now thine all-holy <u>memory</u>, /// We receive remission of sins through thy <u>ho</u>ly prayers.

Thou, didst enter the ce<u>le</u>stial Church / In a sacred manner, O <u>ble</u>ssèd one, / Richly a<u>dorned</u> with the red staining <u>of</u> thy blood. / Now thou standest before the Holy <u>Trinity</u> / Shining brightly in its rich splendor and <u>glo</u>ry. / Wherefore celebrating now thine all-radiant <u>memory</u>, /// We illumine the <u>se</u>nses of our souls.

### **Or this Theotokion, in the same Tone:** (and melody)

Shower my thoughts with the dew of the Most Holy <u>Spi</u>rit, / O most pure <u>Mo</u>ther of Christ, / Who in His <u>boundless compassion</u>, / Cleansed the multitude of our transgressions with a <u>drop</u> of dew. / Dry up the source of my <u>passions</u>, / And through thy prayers, O <u>Lady</u>, /// Vouchsafe that I may ever drink at the <u>stream</u> of life.

### **Or this Stavrotheotokion, in the same Tone:** (and melody)

Seeing Thee nailed to the <u>Cross</u>, O Lord, / The ewe-lamb, Thy Mother, cried out in a<u>ma</u>zement: / "<u>What</u> is this sight, O most de<u>sired</u> Son? / What has the ungrateful assembly <u>done</u> to Thee / Having once delighted themselves in Thy many <u>mi</u>racles? /// But I glorify Thy ineffable condescension, O <u>Ma</u>ster!'

### Or Dogmatic Theotokion if a Resurrection service.

#### The Troparion to the Saint, in Tone 1:

We <u>praise</u> thee as a <u>ki</u>nsman of Christ, / A great hierarch and a steadfast martyr, O <u>Si</u>meon, / Who de<u>stroyed</u> deceit and <u>kept</u> the faith; / Wherefore celebrating now thine all-holy <u>me</u>mory, /// We receive remission of <u>sins</u> through thy <u>ho</u>ly prayers.
