The 18th Day of December

Holy Martyr Sebastian and his Companions: the Martyrs Nicostratus, Zoë, Castorius, Tranqillīnus, Marcellīnus, Mark, Claudius, Symphorian, Victorīnus, Tiburtius and Castsulus.

Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 3 stichera, in Tone 1: To the melody, "O all-praised martyrs...."

Thou didst prepare for thyself a costly robe, /
Dyed with the purple of thy precious blood,

And having <u>clothed</u> thyself in it thou dost rightly come to the <u>kingdom</u> on high, / There to stand before <u>God</u> the <u>King</u> of all. ///

Beseech Him now to grant peace to our souls and great mercy.

Zoë, Mark, and Marcellīnus, /
And Tiburtius the divinely-wise, /
Suffered together with the others and Sebastian /
Enduring a great storm of wounds and torments. /
Now, they abide in divine rest free of their pain and afflictions, /
And they pray that peace may be granted to our souls and great mercy.

O ye <u>ble</u>ssed and invincible <u>martyrs</u>, /
Having abandoned all the <u>things</u> of the earth, /
You <u>ha</u>stened to the <u>hea</u>vens /
Adorned with your wounds and the <u>cri</u>mson of your <u>sufferings</u>. /
Pray ye now, that peace may be granted to our souls and great <u>me</u>rcy.

Note: But if we sing "Alleluia" at Matins instead of "God is the Lord," then the following 3 stichera to the Theotokos are sung at Vespers, at "Lord, I call," before the above stichera of the Saint, in the same Tone and melody:

Without cor<u>ruption</u>, thou gavest <u>birth</u> to God /
Who took on our <u>human flesh</u> /
Pouring <u>forth</u> upon it incor<u>ruption</u>, /
O most <u>pure</u> and im<u>ma</u>culate one. /
<u>There</u>fore I be<u>seech</u> thee: /
Renew me through thy prayers, O <u>pure</u> one, /
Though I am <u>riddled</u> with the sores of cor<u>ruption</u> /
That with love I may ever <u>praise</u> and <u>glo</u>rify thee ///
Who raised on high our <u>human race</u>.

18 DECEMBER

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We beseech thee, all-praised Lady, /
The hope and confirmation of all the faithful, /
Our refuge and our helper: /
Preserve us, thy servants from every calamity, /
Who with faith worship Him who was born of thee. ///
Pray to Christ that He grant our souls peace and great mercy.
Oh, woe is me, what shall I do? /
My mind and soul and body are polluted by my transgressions; /
What can I do to avoid the unquenchable flames and the eternal chains? /
But do thou help me, O all-pure one ///
Before the end, beseech thy Son to grant unto me the remission of my sins.
Glory..., now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone: (and melody)
Thou didst bear Christ, the Fire of Divinity, within thy womb, /
O all-pure one. /
Now beseech Him to extinguish the smoldering embers of my passions /
And deliver me from the eternal flames, ///
And grant me the brightness of the righteous when He shall come to judge all
      things.
Or the Stavrotheotokion, in the same Tone: (and melody)
When the unblemished Virgin beheld upon the tree, /
Him whom she bore in her womb without seed, /
Not able to endure her maternal pain, she tore her hair and cried:
"How art Thou, who by a gesture, dost uphold all creation, /
Raised upon the Cross as one condemned, ///
In Thine absolute desire to save mankind?"
The Aposticha is from the Octoechos.
The General Troparion of the Martyrs, in Tone 4:
Thy holy martyrs, O Lord, /
Through their sufferings received their incorruptible crowns from Thee, our God /
For having Thy strength they laid low their enemies /
And shattered the powerless boldness of demons ///
Through their intercessions, O Christ God, save our souls.
