Commemoration of the Holy Apostle James (Jacob), the brother of the Lord, Bishop of Jerusalem.

Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 6 stichera, in Tone 4: To the melody, "Thou hast given a sign...."

Come, all ye faithful, <u>wise</u> in God, / And let us piously honor the memory of the <u>bro</u>ther of God! / For, having <u>ea</u>rnestly taken up the <u>yoke</u> of Christ, / He became a preacher of the Gospel and the <u>kingdom of His grace</u> / Ever teaching us of His ineffable <u>pro</u>vidence. / Therefore, grant to us the <u>cleansing</u> of our sins /// Through his prayers, O Al<u>mighty Lord</u>. *(twice)*

The proclamation of thy words hath re<u>sounded</u> / To the very ends of the <u>universe</u>, / And through <u>them</u> we have been enlightened in every good and divine <u>vi</u>rtue, / Instructed in faith toward knowledge of the Holy <u>Tri</u>nity. / Therefore, we entreat thee as thou art a <u>hi</u>erarch, / To beseech Christ, the <u>Lo</u>ver of mankind, /// That He may <u>save</u> our souls. *(twice)*

Foreseeing thy holy life from afar, O <u>ble</u>ssed James, / Christ, the All-knowing <u>Lo</u>ver of mankind, / <u>Chose</u> thee to be His <u>bro</u>ther / And ordained thee a holy <u>hi</u>erarch / To be the first shepherd of Je<u>ru</u>salem, / There to celebrate the ineffable and sacred <u>mys</u>teries. / Beseech Him now that He may <u>save</u> our souls. *(twice)*

Glory..., in Tone 6: (To the usual melody)

Thy priesthood is adorned with the blood of thy <u>suffering</u> / O hieromartyr and apostle James, the <u>bro</u>ther of the Lord: / Thou didst stand on the highest tower of the <u>Temple</u> / Preaching God the Word, the Cre<u>a</u>tor of all, / And for this the impious people cast thee <u>down</u> from that height. / Thus thou didst attain to the heavenly <u>mansions</u>, /// Beseech Christ our God that He may <u>save</u> our souls.

Dogmatic Theotokion, in the same Tone:

Who will not bless thee, O Most Holy <u>Virgin</u>? / Who will not sing of thy most pure child-<u>bea</u>ring? / The Only-begotten Son shone timelessly from the <u>Fa</u>ther, / But from thee He was ineffably in<u>ca</u>rnate; / God by nature, yet <u>man</u> for our sake; / Not two persons, but one in two <u>na</u>tures. / Entreat Him, O pure and all-blessèd <u>La</u>dy /// To have <u>me</u>rcy on our souls.

Or Dogmatic Theotokion in the Tone of the Week if a Resurrection service.

At the Aposticha, these stichera, in Tone 1: To the melody, "Joy of the ranks of heaven...."

A <u>multitude</u> of the pious <u>fai</u>thful / Joyfully cry aloud as they now <u>ce</u>lebrate / The sacred <u>fe</u>stival of the brother and di<u>sci</u>ple of the Lord, / Glorifying him with sacred <u>hymns</u> and <u>songs</u> of praise. / For he ever prays that we <u>may</u> be saved

Verse: Their proclamation has gone out into all the earth, and their words to the ends of the universe!

Thou wast the <u>bro</u>ther of the Lord in the flesh by His own command, O <u>wise</u> one, / As well as His disciple and an eye-witness of the divine <u>my</u>steries, / And thou didst <u>flee</u> with Him to Egypt together with Joseph and the Mother of <u>Je</u>sus. /// With them pray that our <u>souls</u> may be saved.

Verse: The heavens are telling the Glory of God, and the firmament proclaims His handiwork!

The assembly of the apostles / Chose thee to be the first bishop in holy Sion / To serve <u>Christ</u>, the Bene<u>fa</u>ctor of all, For thou wast His brother and kinsman ac<u>co</u>rding to the flesh, /// And His companion following in His steps, O <u>ble</u>ssed James.

Glory..., in Tone 8:

<u>Thou</u> wast the brother and successor of Christ, the Chief <u>Shepherd</u>, / And renowned among the a<u>po</u>stles / For thou didst not fear torment and wast pleased to die for Him whom thou didst love. / O <u>glo</u>rious James, /// Ceaselessly beseech Him to <u>save</u> our souls.

Now and ever..., Theotokion, in the Same Tone:

Ac<u>cept</u> these prayers of thy servants, O <u>La</u>dy, /// And deliver us from every danger and mis<u>fo</u>rtune.

The Troparion of St. James, in Tone 2:

Thou didst receive the Gospel as a disciple of the Lord, O <u>righteous</u> one; / And as a martyr thou dwellest now in indescribable <u>glory</u>; / As the <u>bro</u>ther of the Lord, thou hast great boldness be<u>fore</u> Him; / And as a hierarch thou canst pray and en<u>treat</u> Him. /// So, beseech Christ <u>God</u> that our <u>souls</u> may be saved.

At "God is the Lord...," the Troparion of the Apostle *(twice)*, Glory..., now and ever, Resurrectional Theotokion, Tone 2:

Beyond all thought and exceedingly <u>glo</u>rious / Are thy mysteries, O <u>Mo</u>ther of God; / <u>Sealed</u> in purity and preserved in virginity / Thou art truly acknowledged as the Mother who gave birth to the <u>true</u> God /// Supplicate <u>Him</u> to <u>save</u> our souls.

After the 1st Kathisma, the Sessional Hymn, in Tone 1: *To the melody, "Thy tomb, O Savior...."*

O apostle, eye-witness and <u>martyr</u> of Christ, / James the wise, the blessed <u>bro</u>ther of God, / Through thy <u>prayers</u>, free those who celebrate thy memory from the <u>bo</u>ndage of sin /// That by the power of the Spirit they may inherit the kingdom of <u>hea</u>ven. (twice)

Glory..., now and ever.... Theotokion

Let us <u>praise</u> thee, O <u>Virgin</u>, / The bush unconsumed by fire which <u>Moses</u> beheld; / The radiant <u>cloud</u>, the ark and the <u>mountain</u> of God; The great vessel and spiritual <u>banquet</u> well-<u>plea</u>sing to God; / The most <u>sple</u>ndid and im<u>passible</u> gate; /// And the palace of the <u>King</u> on high.

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After the 2nd Kathisma, the Sessional Hymn, in Tone 5: To the melody: The counoriginate Word..."

O disciple of the Word and preacher of the truth, / Thou wast sent, like a flaming arrow to illumine those bound by the <u>da</u>rkness of sin, / To drive a<u>way</u> the fog of ungodliness <u>from</u> the world / That the <u>fai</u>thful may shine forth as the <u>chi</u>ldren of the day, /// O holy James, the eye-<u>wi</u>tness of God. (twice)

Glory..., now and ever.... Theotokion, in the same Tone:

In <u>thee</u> we place our hope, O most pure <u>Virgin</u>, / Having the firm assurance of thy pro<u>tection</u>: / De<u>liver us from every danger and misfortune</u>, / And from the <u>evil attacks of the enemy</u>, / And save us, as we entreat thy <u>Son</u> and God, /// And together with the apostles <u>sing</u> thy <u>praises</u>.

After the 3rd Ode, the Sessional Hymn, in Tone 8: To the melody, "Of Wisdom...."

<u>Thou</u> wast a kinsman of the Lord ac<u>co</u>rding to the flesh, / O wise a<u>po</u>stle James, / And from Him thou didst receive <u>many blessings</u>: / Instructing all with the light of under<u>standing</u> / Thou didst uproot the falsehood of i<u>do</u>latry, / For which cause the minions of darkness slew thee, the <u>prea</u>cher of the <u>Sa</u>vior. / And now, we cry <u>out</u> to thee: / Beseech Christ God to grant re<u>mi</u>ssion of sins /// To those who lovingly honor thy holy <u>me</u>mory. *(twice)*

Glory..., now and ever.... Theotokion

O golden <u>lamp</u> of the divine Light and cloud of the <u>spi</u>ritual Sun, / O chaste and immaculate <u>La</u>dy, most pure, / Illumine the darkness of my soul with the <u>rays</u> of dis<u>pa</u>ssion, / And cleanse my filthy heart with the streams of com<u>pu</u>nction, / That I may wash my evil deeds away with tears of re<u>pe</u>ntance, / So that I may cry out to thee with love: O Ever-<u>vi</u>rgin <u>Mo</u>ther of God, / Beseech Christ God to grant me remission of my trans<u>gre</u>ssions, /// For I, thy servant, have placed my <u>hope</u> in thee.

After the 6th Ode, the Kontakion, of the Apostle, in Tone 4:

The only-begotten Word of God the <u>Fa</u>ther / Having come to us in these latter times, O divine one, / Showed thee to be the first shepherd and teacher of Jerusalem / And a faithful steward of the spiritual <u>my</u>steries. /// Therefore, we honor thee, O a<u>po</u>stle James.

After the 9th Ode, the Exapostilarion

We the faithful praise thee as the brother of the Lord, O blessèd James inspired by God, and we glorify thy bright, all-honorable, and radiant memory. Earnestly pray then, for those who honor thee. *(twice)*

Glory..., now and ever.... Theotokion:

Let us, the faithful worthily come before Thee with Thy most pure Mother as our intercessor and fervent supplicant. Grant us, Thy servants, to be participants in Thy glory, that we may receive the portion of the righteous, partake in the sweetness of paradise, and obtain the kingdom of heaven.

On the Praises, 4 stichera, in Tone 8: *To the melody, "Standing before the Tribunal...."*

As he <u>stood</u> upon the tower of the <u>temple</u> / With boldness James cried out and <u>lou</u>dly proclaimed / That Thou art God the Word, the Creator of all, who had <u>come</u> in<u>to</u> the world. /// Through his prayers, en<u>lig</u>hten our souls.

<u>Even as the head of the apostle was crushed by a bludgeon of wood</u>, O Lord, / In paradise the Tree of Life was <u>given to him</u> / For he was removed from temporal things and is <u>now</u> rejoicing. /// Through his prayers, send down Thy peace up<u>on</u> Thy Church.

James, the ever-memorable <u>bro</u>ther of God, / Valiantly confessed Thee, the Son of <u>God</u> Most High. / By so doing, he shamed and subdued the <u>impious enemy</u>. /// Having suffered for this, he rejoices now, standing before Thee.

The <u>impious</u> people cast the righteous one <u>down</u> from the heights / And joyfully, he was vouchsafed to dwell in the heavenly <u>mansions</u> /

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Where he worthily delights in the <u>food</u> of <u>pa</u>radise. /// Through his prayers, grant peace and <u>me</u>rcy to our souls.

Glory..., in Tone 1: (*The composition of Byzantius*)

Illumined by the fire of the Divine Spirit , / O James thou <u>bro</u>ther of the Lord, / Thou wast revealed to be a zealot of divine <u>piety</u> / And in His mercy, He accepted thee into the lawful brotherhood <u>of</u> the <u>prie</u>sthood / And like <u>Aa</u>ron of old He clothed thee in sacred vestments of <u>honor</u>. /// Beseech Him now, O boast of the apostles, that our <u>souls</u> may be saved.

Now and ever.... the Theotokion, in the same Tone;

The Great Doxology and the Dismissal.
