Vespers

After the Introductory Psalm, "Blessèd is the man...," the first Kathisma. At "Lord, I call...," 8 stichera;

3 from the Pentecostarion, and

5 stichera of Saint Simon, in Tone 4: *To the melody, "Thou hast given a sign...."*

Simon the <u>wondrous</u>, / The boast of the a<u>postles</u>, / Passed over <u>all</u> the earth like a <u>shining star</u> / Driving away the darkness of <u>ido</u>latry / With his saving, divine, and brilliant <u>tea</u>chings, / Enlightening all to worship the One God in Three <u>Persons</u> /// Indivisible and Undivided. (twice)

Simon the A<u>po</u>stle, / Was like unto a <u>cha</u>riot / Tra<u>ve</u>rsing the en<u>tire</u> earth; / Burning away the madness of idolatry from <u>all</u> the land / Shedding the light of piety, illumining the faithful with <u>rays</u> of grace / Enlightening all to worship the One God in Three <u>Pe</u>rsons /// Indivisible and Undivided. *(twice)*

Simon the Apostle, / Most radiant and wondrous, / The <u>tea</u>cher of the <u>nations</u> / God's holy <u>fi</u>sher of men / Catching us up from the depths of perdition with the height of the<u>o</u>logy. / Now the true preacher wisely leads all to the <u>kno</u>wledge of Christ /// Offering to us his instruction as bountiful feast.

Glory..., in Tone 2:

Given a name to mark thy <u>zeal</u> for God, / O right-wondrous <u>Si</u>mon / He re<u>vea</u>led thee as one possessing <u>wo</u>ndrous gifts /

The Entrance and the Prokeimenon of the Day.

Three Readings:

The Reading from the First General Epistle of John (3:21-4:6)

^{3:21}Belovèd, if our heart does not condemn us, we have confidence toward God. ²²And whatever we ask we receive from Him, because we keep His commandments and do those things that are pleasing in His sight. ²³And this is His commandment: that we should believe on the Name of His Son Jesus Christ and love one another, as He gave us commandment. ²⁴And he that keeps His commandments dwells in Him, and He in him. And by this we know that He abides in us, by the Spirit which He hath given us. ^{4:1}Belovèd, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits, whether they are of God; because many false prophets have gone out into the world. ²By this you know the Spirit of

God: Every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh, is of God, ³and every spirit that does not confess that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is not of God. And this is the spirit of the antichrist, which you have heard was coming, and is now already in the world. ⁴Ye are of God, little children, and have overcome them: because He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world. ⁵They are of the world. Therefore they speak as of the world, and the world hears them. ⁶We are of God. He who knows God hears us; he who is not of God does not hear us. By this we know the spirit of truth and the spirit of error.

The Reading from the First General Epistle of John (4:11-4:16)

^{4:11}Belovèd, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. ¹²No one hath seen God at any time. If we love one another, God dwelleth in us, and His love is perfected in us. ¹³By this we know that we abide in Him, and He in us, because He hath given us of His Spirit. ¹⁴And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent the Son to be the Savior of the world. ¹⁵Whosoever shall confess that Jesus is the Son of God, God abideth in him, and he in God. ¹⁶And we have known and believed the love that God hath for us.

God is love, and he that abideth in love abideth in God, and God in him.

The Reading from the First General Epistle of John (4:20-5:5)

^{4:20}If any man says, "I love God," and hateth his brother, he is a liar; for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen? ²¹And this commandment we have from Him: that he who loveth God must also love his brother. ^{5:1}Whosoever believeth that Jesus is the Christ is born of God, and everyone that loveth Him that begat also loveth Him that is begotten of Him. ²By this we know that we love

the children of God, when we love God and keep His commandments. ³For this is the love of God, that we keep His command-ments. And His commandments are not burdensome. ⁴For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world. And this is the victory that overcometh the world; our faith. ⁵Who is he that overcometh the world, but he who believeth that Jesus is the Son of God?

At the Aposticha, these stichera, in Tone 1: To the melody, "O all-praised martyrs...."

Most-<u>me</u>morable Apostle <u>Si</u>mon! / Wisely didst thou drink of the stream of <u>swee</u>tness / And <u>sa</u>ting thyself with the <u>Wi</u>sdom of God / Zealously <u>didst</u> thou <u>e</u>mulate Christ. / Now, having joyfully come unto Him, / Thou art deified by the radiant glory of the Holy <u>Tri</u>nity /// And the peace that passes all understanding.

Verse: Their proclamation is gone out into all the earth, and their words to the ends of the universe!

Most-wondrous Apostle Simon! / In contemplating on the beauty of God / Thou didst gaze upon it as far as thou wast able, / Desiring to attain the enjoyment of a higher union. / Now, having joyously achieved the only object of thy blessed desire, / And being deified by Him /// Thou dost dwell together with the angels, O ever-memorable preacher of Christ. *Verse:* The heavens are telling the glory of God, and the firmament proclaims His handiwork!

Most-<u>ble</u>ssèd Apostle <u>Si</u>mon! /

Thou art revealed as a faithful mediator between <u>God</u> and man, / And <u>now</u>, we pray that through thy bold and fervent inter<u>ces</u>sions / <u>Christ</u> may be <u>mer</u>ciful to us. / Never <u>cease</u> to en<u>treat</u> the Lord /// That He may grant our souls peace and great <u>mercy</u>.

Glory..., Tone 6:

Most-holy Simon, thou disciple and a<u>po</u>stle of Christ, / Thou didst soar over all creation like an <u>eagle</u> / Destroying the lies of idolatry with the fire of thy <u>tea</u>chings, / Leading the nations from the depths of ignorance to the <u>kno</u>wledge of God. / And now, earnestly do thou en<u>treat</u> the Lord /// That He be merciful to us on the Day of <u>Ju</u>dgment.

Now and ever..., from the Pentecostarion.

The Troparion of Saint Simon, in Tone 3:

O holy Apostle Simon / Intercede with our merciful God, / That He may grant to our souls /// The remission of our transgressions.

Glory ..., now and ever..., Troparion from the Pentecostarion.

On the Praises, 4 stichera of the Saint, in Tone 8: *To the melody, "What shall we call thee?..."*

What shall we call thee, O <u>Apostle?</u> / Heaven, for thou declared the <u>glo</u>ry of God? / A river, for thou mystically <u>watered creation?</u> / A star, for illumining the Church? / A cup, overflowing with a draft of <u>holy drink?</u> / A belovèd friend of Christ? / A co-equal of the bodiless <u>angels?</u> /// Pray thou for the salvation of our souls! (twice)

O <u>Si</u>mon, thou boast of the a<u>po</u>stles! / Well have thy adorned feet trod the path of <u>prea</u>ching / Making narrow all the <u>ways</u> of the enemy / By the breadth of divine <u>wisdom</u>, / The Word, who appeared in the <u>ba</u>seness of the flesh, / And chose thee as His di<u>sciple</u>, O <u>ble</u>ssed one. /// Beseech Him for the salvation of our souls!

O <u>Si</u>mon, God's eloquent a<u>pos</u>tle! / Christ sent thee forth as an <u>a</u>rrow of light /

To <u>smite</u> down the <u>enemy</u> / And grant healing to our <u>wounded</u> souls. / Therefore we rightly <u>bless</u> thee / And celebrate today thy <u>holy memory</u>. /// Pray for the salvation of our souls!

Glory..., in Tone 2:

Forsaking the cares of this world, O Apostle <u>Si</u>mon, / Thou didst follow <u>a</u>fter Christ / And being <u>armed</u> with the inspiration of the <u>Ho</u>ly Spirit / Thou wast sent by Him to the perishing <u>nations</u> / To convert them to the light of the <u>kno</u>wledge of God. / And having the com<u>ple</u>ted the godly course of thy struggles and thy <u>sufferings</u> / Thou didst commend thy <u>soul</u> to Christ. /// Beseech Him, O blessèd one, that He may grant us great <u>me</u>rcy.

Now and ever..., Pentecostarion.

Great Doxology, Troparia, Litanies and Dismissal, as usual.

At **the Beatitudes**, 8 Troparia: 4 from the appointed Ode of the Canon from the Pentecostarion; and 4 from the Sixth Ode of the Canon of the Saint.

1-4. From the appointed Canon.

5-6. O right-wondrous Simon, given a name to mark thy zeal for the Almighty God, zealously didst thou strive to emulate the Lord. *(twice)*

7. Thou wast granted authority through the power of divine grace, and revealed by the Savior as a worker of divine miracles.

8. *Theotokion:* Let the mouths of heretics who do not acknowledge thee as Theotokos be stopped, O All-immaculate Lady, and let their faces be covered with shame

The Troparion of the Saint, in Tone 3:

O holy Apostle Simon / Intercede with our merciful God, / That He may grant to our souls /// The remission of our transgressions.

The Kontakion of the Saint, in Tone 3:

Let us all praise and bless Simon, the preacher of God /

The Alleluia (Apostle), Tone 1: The heavens shall confess Thy wonders, O Lord, and Thy truth in the congregation of the saints! *Verse:* God is glorified in the council of the saints!

The Gospel: (56) Matthew 13:54-58

The Communion Hymn: Their proclamation is gone out into all the earth / and their words to the ends of the universe!
