

TROPARION OF THE FEAST - Tone 7

Thou wast transfigured on the mount, O Christ God, /
Revealing Thy glory to Thy disciples as far as they could bear it. /
Let Thine eternal light shine upon us sinners, /
Through the prayers of the Theotokos, ///
O Giver of Light, glory to Thee!

TROPARION - TONE 4 (St. Dometius)

After disciplining thyself with prayer and fasting on the mountain /
Thou didst destroy the hosts of spiritual enemies /
With the weapon of the Cross,
O all-blessèd one. /
Thou didst bravely arm thyself again for martyrdom, /
Having destroyed the apostate with the sword of Faith. /
For the sake of both thou didst receive a crown from God, /
O venerable martyr, ///
Ever-memorable Dometius.

KONTAKION - TONE 6 (St. Dometius)

Despising the wisdom of earthly glory /
And the thoughts that drag one down /
Thou didst reveal thyself as a great guide for monastics /
Not fearing the wrath of the king who did not worship Christ, the
true God. /
For this, thou didst end thy life with this song on thy lips: ///
God is with me and no one shall be against me!

KONTAKION OF THE FEAST - Tone 7

Thou wast transfigured on the mountain, O Christ God, /
And Thy disciples beheld Thy glory as far as they were able, /
So that when they would behold Thee crucified, /
They would understand that Thou didst suffer of Thine own will, /
And would proclaim to the world ///
That Thou art truly the brightness of the Father.
