*Theotokion:* In Wisdom didst Thou make Thine abode within the Virgin's womb, making it the temple of God, that in the richness of Thy goodness, Thou mightest restore Thine image which had become dim through the passions of men, and come to dwell amongst mankind and save all the world, O Compassionate Lord.

The whole Church of the faithful honors thee as a great hierarch and successor to the apostles, O Averkius, /

Preserve her invincible, unharmed and unshaken by any <u>he</u>resy /// Through thy prayers, O ever-<u>me</u>m'rable one.

**Prokeimenon, Tone 8:** My mouth shall speak wisdom and the meditation of my heart shall be understanding. *Verse:* Hear this, all nations! Give ear, all inhabitants of the earth!

**The Epistle:** (318) Hebrews 7:26-8:2

**The Alleluia, Tone 2:** The mouth of the righteous shall meditate wisdom and his tongue shall speak of judgment. *Verse:* The Law of God is in his heart and his steps shall not falter.

**The Gospel:** (36) John 10:9-17

**The Communion Hymn:** The righteous shall be in everlasting remembrance. He shall not be afraid of evil tidings.

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
