But come quickly and take pity on me ///
And release me from the harm and enmity of the evvil one.
Or the Stavrotheotokion, in the same Tone:
Seeing Thee the Lamb and Shepherd on the tree, /
The ewe-lamb who gave birth to Thee lamented, /

And as a mother cried out to Thee: /
"O desired Son, how art Thou hung on the Tree of the Cross, /
O Longsuffering One? /
How art Thy hands and feet nailed by the transgressors, O Word? /
How dost Thou shed Thy Blood, O Master?
The General Troparion of the Martyrs, in Tone 4: (No Troparion of the Saints
given in the Menaion)
Thy holy martyrs, O Lord, /
Through their sufferings received their incorruptible crowns from Thee, our God /
For having Thy strength they laid low their enemies /
And shattered the powerless boldness of demons ///
Through their intercessions, O Christ God, save our souls.

After the third Ode, the Sessional Hymn of the Saints, in Tone 4: To the melody, "Having been lifted up...."
The forty-one passion-bearers of Christ, /
Armed only by His power /
Defeated the horde of demons by their faith, /
And dying, they passed over to eternal life, rejoicing ///
And they ever pray for the remission of sins for us who celebrate their victory.
Glory..., now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone:
Though I am enamored by my sin, /
Yet do I beseech thee, O most pure Lady, /
Who gave birth to the sinless God: /
Take pity on my sinful soul /
And cleanse me from my many transgressions, ///
For thou art the purification, help and salvation of the faithful.
Or the Stavrotheotokion, in the same Tone:

After the Sixth Ode, the Kontakion of the Martyrs, in Tone 2: To the melody, "The Theotokos, who is ever vigilant..."
Today we honor the precious memory / Of the martyr Terence the wise, and his forty companions. /
Let us gather together and worthily rejoice /
That we may receive the gift of healing; /
For they have received from God the grace of the Holy Spirit ///
For healing the infirmities of our souls.
