The 29th Day of March Holy Hieromartyr Mark, Bishop of Arethusa, Cyril the Deacon, and the others who suffered under Julian the Apostate.

Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 3 stichera, in Tone 8: To the melody, "O most glorious wonder...."

O <u>ve</u>n'rable martyr <u>Bishop Mark</u>, / Being fully illumined with the sacred light of <u>prie</u>sthood, / Thou didst shine with unwavering <u>brightness</u> through thy <u>tor</u>ture. / Now, having passed over to eternal <u>ra</u>diance, / In which the choirs of <u>ma</u>rtyrs make glad / And the <u>ranks</u> of <u>angels</u> rejoice, /// Together with them, remember us always, O blessèd one, re<u>ceived</u> by God.

O passion-bearing martyr Cyril / Truly a divine minister, thou didst minister to Christ, / Presenting thy<u>self</u>, a pure offering, And sacrificed at the divine altar, O divinely <u>ble</u>ssed one. Thus becoming a saint both by <u>calling</u> and by deed / Thou didst receive a <u>pre</u>cious in<u>he</u>ritance, /// Ever abiding in the brightness of <u>ho</u>liness.

O <u>all</u>-praised <u>martyrs</u> of Christ, / You passed through the furnace of <u>torments</u> / And were left unharmed through the <u>dew</u> of divine grace, / And having received the rewards of your <u>vi</u>ctories / You were vouchsafed to dwell at the <u>waters</u> of rest. / Therefore on this <u>day</u> as we <u>glorify</u> Christ / We celebrate your sacred <u>me</u>mory.

Glory..., now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone: (and melody)

We be<u>seech</u> thee, our benefactress and most-pure <u>La</u>dy: / Spurn not thy servants un<u>til</u> the end, / That we not perish <u>sha</u>ken by <u>so</u>rrows. / But come and quickly rescue us from the present danger and af<u>fli</u>ction / O Most Holy one, rejoicing in God, /// For thou art our haven and invincible pro<u>te</u>ction.

Or the Stavrotheotokion, in the same Tone: (and melody)

Beholding Thee, O Jesus, nailed to the Cross /

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And accepting suffering of Thine <u>own</u> will, / The Virgin, Thy Mother, O <u>Master, cried</u> aloud: / "Woe is me, O my <u>sweet</u> Child! / How is it that Thou dost endure unjust <u>wounding</u>, / O Physician who healeth the in<u>fi</u>rmities of <u>mankind</u> /// And by Thy loving-kindness dost deliver all from corruption?"

Note: No Troparion or Kontakion for the Saints given in the Slav Menaion.

The Troparion of the Saints, in Tone 3:

As thou didst prepare for thy witnessing in the arena, / Thou didst anoint the company of martyrs assembled with thee, / And thou didst finish thy course together with them O glorious Bishop Mark, / And were found worthy of attaining the joys of <u>heaven</u> with them. /// O righteous father, entreat Christ God to grant us all His great <u>mercy</u>.

The Canon of the Saints, in Tone 8,

having the acrostic: "I honor the godly Mark and Cyril," the composition of Joseph. — incomplete as of 1/18/2014

After the Third Kathisma, the Sessional Hymn of the Saints, in Tone 4: *To the melody, "Thou hast appeared today...."*

O holy hiero<u>mar</u>tyrs, / Being illumined with <u>true</u> grace / You <u>pi</u>ously enlighten all the <u>ends</u> of the earth /// Therefore with faith we call you blessèd.

Glory..., now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone:

O Virgin Mother / Stretch for thine <u>all</u>-pure hands And protect all those who place their <u>hope</u> in thee, /// Who cry out to thy Son: 'Grant unto all thy <u>mercy</u>, O Christ!"

Or the Stavrotheotokion, in the same Tone: (and melody)

Beholding Thee, O Jesus, <u>nailed</u> to the Cross, / With maternal <u>sor</u>row / The Most-pure <u>Lady piteously cried</u> aloud: / "Woe is me, my e<u>ter</u>nal Light, /// How is it that Thou art setting into <u>dark</u>ness?"
