# At "Lord, I call...," 3 stichera, in Tone 1: To the melody, "O all-praised martyrs...."

O most-<u>wise</u> ones, by words of divine <u>reason</u> / You delivered the senseless <u>people</u>, / And <u>brought</u> to them the <u>saving word</u> / Of Him who shone from the unbegotten <u>Fa</u>ther, O a<u>po</u>stles. /// Beseech Him to grant our souls peace and great <u>me</u>rcy.

Let us <u>praise</u>, as true <u>prea</u>chers of Christ, / Pudens and Aristarchus, with divine Tro<u>phi</u>mus, / For by the <u>warmth</u> of divine grace, they resolved the winter of de<u>ception</u>, / Now they abide in the never-<u>setting radiance</u>, / Having re<u>ceiv</u>ed the reward of their <u>labors</u>, /// Deified by ineffable com<u>munion</u>.

O <u>glo</u>rious ones, following after Paul the glorious di<u>sciple</u>, / You raised up your <u>sufferings</u>: / By <u>being shut in prisons and made subject to torturing</u>, / And be<u>hea</u>ded at the <u>end</u> by a sword. /// Beseech Christ to grant our souls peace and great <u>mercy</u>.

# Glory..., now and ever..., Theotokion, in Tone 1:

<u>Woe</u> is me! What shall I <u>do</u>? / My mind and soul and body are defiled by my trans<u>gre</u>ssions! / What shall I <u>do</u>? How shall I avoid the un<u>bea</u>rable flames / And the eternal and un<u>brea</u>kable chains? / <u>Yet</u>, before the end, O all-im<u>ma</u>culate one, /// Beseech thy Son to grant me re<u>mi</u>ssion of my sins.

## Or the Stavrotheotokion, in the same Tone:

When the un<u>ble</u>mished Virgin beheld upon the tree, / Him whom she bore in her womb with<u>out</u> seed, / Not able to en<u>dure</u> her maternal pain, she tore her <u>hair</u> and cried: "How art Thou, who by a gesture, dost up<u>hold</u> all cre<u>a</u>tion, / Raised upon the Cross as <u>one</u> condemned, /// In Thine absolute desire to <u>save</u> mankind?"
