The 19th Day of September The Afterfeast of the Exaltation of the Cross; The Holy Martyrs Trophimus, Sabbatius, and Dorymēdon of Synnada.

Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 6 stichera:

3 stichera of the Feast in Tone 4: *To the melody, "Thou hast given a sign...."*

The all-<u>ho</u>ly Cross / Is the invincible weapon of <u>vi</u>ctory / And is re<u>vealed</u> today, coming <u>forth</u> from the earth / Like a hidden <u>trea</u>sure, / Enriching the whole world with the rays of its universal <u>goo</u>dness, / Therefore, we glorify Thy gracious dispensation, O <u>Christ</u> our God, /// For Thou didst deign to be crucified upon it <u>for</u> our sakes.

The Cross was prefigured in <u>ancient times</u> / By Moses, the faithful divine prophet and eye-<u>wi</u>tness of God / When he <u>routed the armies of Amalek;</u> / Now, it is restored being lifted up by <u>priestly hands</u>, / And it drives away armies of the godless and all the <u>demons</u> /// As it exposes the irreverence of <u>fai</u>thlessness.

The Cross is invincible power to us Christians, O our <u>Sa</u>vior, / Which shatters the might of our <u>e</u>nemies, / And it <u>is</u> the peace of Thy <u>Church</u>, O Christ, / Which is granted to all Orthodox <u>people</u> / Who now venerate it, be<u>see</u>ching Thee, O Lord, /// To be counted worthy to be amongst Thy chosen saints, O Lover of <u>mankind</u>.

And these 3 stichera of the Martyrs, in Tone 8: To the melody, "Thy martyrs...."

Desiring to partake of eternal nourishment in <u>heaven</u>, / Thou wast sated with bodily af<u>fli</u>ctions on earth, / And didst pass over from cor<u>ruption</u> to incor<u>ruption</u>, / O holy Tro<u>phi</u>mus, / And thou art now adorned as a true <u>wi</u>tness for Christ. /// Entreat Him now to grant us His great mercy, O <u>blessed</u> one.

O <u>glor</u>ious Sab<u>ba</u>tius, / Thou didst endure many <u>torments</u>, /

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And wast vouchsafed to celebrate with joy in the <u>courts</u> of <u>heaven</u>, / Where thou hast received honors for the <u>greatness</u> of thy deeds, / And now art numbered among the assemblies of the <u>angels</u>. /// Beseech Christ God, to grant us His great <u>mercy</u>!

Having rejected the counsel of the ungodly ones, / Thou didst strengthen thy mind with divine counsels, O Dorymēdon, / And courageously didst thou complete thy <u>trial</u> of <u>tor</u>ture. / Now, having received thine honors of <u>vi</u>ctory /// Thou art co-reigning with Christ, ever praying <u>for</u> us all.

Glory..., now and ever..., of the Feast, in Tone 4:

Let us make glad today / And sing in honor of the feast, / And with joyful face and tongue openly cry aloud: / O Christ for us Thou hast accepted condemnation, / Being spat upon and scourged; / Thou wast wrapped in a purple robe, / And hast gone up upon the Cross. / Seeing Thee, the sun and the moon hid their light, / And the earth quaked in fear, / And the veil of the temple was rent in twain. / Do Thou Thyself now grant us Thy precious Cross / As Guardian and protector and driver-away of demons, / That by embracing it, we may all <u>cry</u> aloud: / Save us, O Cross, by thy might. / Make us holy by thy splendor, O precious Cross, / And strengthen us though thine Exaltation: /// For thou hast been given to us as the light and salvation of our souls.

Or the Dogmatic Theotokion if a Resurrection Service.

At the Aposticha, these stichera, in Tone 1: To the melody, "Joy of the ranks of heaven...."

The <u>Cross</u> is lifted up and demons are <u>driven</u> away, / The gates of Eden are <u>open</u> to the thief, / Death is put to death and has been <u>emptied</u>, / And <u>Christ</u> is <u>glorified</u>. / Rejoice, therefore, all ye mortals <u>born</u> on earth, /// For the curse is <u>overthrown</u>!

AFTERFEAST OF THE EXALTATION; MARTYRS TROPHIMUS, SABBATIUS, AND DORYMEDON

Verse: Extol the Lord; worship at His footstool for it is holy.

<u>Come</u>, all ye God-loving <u>people</u>, / And let us behold the lifting <u>up</u> of the Cross, / Let us ex<u>alt</u> together, and let us give <u>glory</u>, / And let us cry out to our only De<u>liv</u>erer <u>and</u> our God: / Having been <u>cru</u>cified, O Lord, on the <u>Tree</u> of the Cross, /// Turn not away from us as we entreat mercy of Thee.

Verse: God is our King before the ages: He hath wrought salvation in the midst of the earth.

O God, fulfilled are the words of Thy prophets Isaiah and David, <u>saying</u>: / "All the nations shall come and worship be<u>fore</u> Thee, O Lord." / For be<u>hold</u>, O <u>Thou</u> who art good, / The <u>people</u> filled with Thy grace in Thy courts at Je<u>ru</u>salem. / O Thou who hast endured the <u>Cross</u> for us /// And hast brought us life by Thy Resurrection, <u>guard</u> us and <u>save</u> us.

The Troparion of the Martyr, in Tone 8:

Praising God in Trinity, let us glorify the three <u>martyrs</u>, / Trophimus, Sabbatius, and Dory<u>mē</u>don, / For having believed in the trinity they were put down by the <u>enemy</u>. /// By their prayers, O Christ God, have <u>me</u>rcy on us.

Glory..., now and ever.... The Troparion of the Feast, in Tone 1:

O Lord, save thy people / And bless Thine in<u>he</u>ritance. / <u>Grant</u> victories to the Orthodox <u>Chri</u>stians / Over their <u>a</u>dversaries; / And <u>by vi</u>rtue of Thy Cross /// Pre<u>serve</u> Thy habitation.

The Canon of the Feast, with 8 Troparia, including the Irmos; and that of the Martyrs, with 4 Troparia.

After the Third Ode, the Kontakion of the Martyr, in Tone 8:

The Church honors thee as a founding stone of witnessing and a pillar of <u>pi</u>ety, / And it glorifies thy light-bearing <u>suffering</u>, / O blessed and valiant, glorious martyr Trophimus and those who <u>suffered</u> with thee. / Entreat Christ God for the remission of sins of those who cry <u>out</u> to thee /// As thou art in<u>vi</u>ncible.

After the Sixth Ode, the Kontakion of the Feast, in Tone 4:

As Thou wast voluntarily crucified for <u>our</u> sake, / Grant mercy to those who are <u>called</u> by Thy name. / Make all Orthodox Christians glad by Thy <u>power</u> / Granting them victories over their <u>a</u>dversaries /// By bestowing upon them the invincible trophy, Thy <u>weapon</u> of peace.

At the Apostikha, these stikhera, in Tone 6:¹ To the melody, "On the third day...."

We bow down in worship be<u>fore</u> the place / Where the feet of <u>Christ</u> stood, / And we exalt the thrice-<u>ble</u>ssed Cross / Upon which was the Master <u>shed</u> His blood /// Pouring forth the Resur<u>re</u>ction on the world.

Verse: Extol the Lord; worship at His footstool for it is holy.

Having mortified the passions of the flesh and <u>spi</u>rit / Come, all ye faithful, <u>wise</u> in God, / And let us make haste to <u>el</u>evate ourselves / Above all <u>ea</u>rthly cares / To the resting place of <u>hea</u>ven / Through the exaltation of the <u>Ho</u>ly Cross, /// Having crucified ourselves with Christ the <u>Ma</u>ster.

Verse: God is our King before the ages: He hath wrought salvation in the midst of the earth.

An ever-flowing <u>stream</u> of Life / Issues forth from the divine ribs of the <u>Sa</u>vior, / Watering the souls of those who faithfully worship His divine <u>sufferings</u>, /// His Cross and Resur<u>re</u>ction.

Glory..., now and ever..., in Tone 5:

O God, fulfilled are the words of Thy prophets Isaiah and David, <u>saying</u>: / "All the nations shall come and worship be<u>fore</u> Thee, O Lord." / For be<u>hold</u>, O <u>Thou</u> who art good, / The <u>people</u> filled with Thy grace in Thy courts at Je<u>ru</u>salem. / O Thou who hast endured the <u>Cross</u> for us /// And hast brought us life by Thy Resurrection, <u>guard</u> us and <u>save</u> us.
