Ode 1

The Supplicatory Canon to the Theotokos, Tone 8

Irmos: Having crossed the water as though it were dry land and escaped from the wickedness of the Egyptians, the children of Israel cried aloud: Let us sing to our Redeemer and our God.

Refrain: Most Holy Theotokos, save us!

Distressed by many temptations, I flee to thee, seeking salvation. O Virgin and Mother of the Word, deliver me from my burdens and afflictions.

The increase of passions troubles me and fills me with great distress. Calm my soul, O Maiden, by the peace of thy Son and God, O all-blameless one.

I implore thee who gavest birth to our Savior and God, O Virgin, to deliver me from perils, for fleeing now unto thee for refuge, I lift up both my soul and my thoughts before thee.

Ailing am I in body and soul; do thou vouchsafe me the divine visitation and thy care, O thou who alone art the Mother of God, for thou art good and the Mother of the Good One.

The Canon of the Holy Hieromartyr, Tone 2

Irmos: O come, ye people, let us sing a song to Christ our God, who parted the sea and through it led his people whom He had brought out of the bondage of Egypt, for He hath been glorified!

Refrain: Holy hieromartyr John, pray to God for us!

Rejoicing now in the mansions of heaven together with all the new martyrs who suffered under godless oppression, grant, I pray, that I may worthily praise thee, O blessèd father John.

Thou, O blessèd father, an offshoot of the root of piety whose grandfather clove himself to the True Faith, hast shone forth as a confessor of the holy Orthodox Church.

Irmos: O Lord, Creator of the vault of heaven and Founder of the Church, strengthen me in Thy love, for Thou art our supreme desire and the support of the faithful, O Thou who lovest mankind.

I have thee as the protection and intercession of my life, O Virgin, Mother of God. Pilot me to thy haven, O giver of blessings, O support of the faithful, O thou only all-praised one.

I pray thee, O Virgin, to dispel the tumult of my soul and the storm of my grief; for thou, O Bride of God, hast given birth to Christ, the Prince of Peace, O only immaculate one.

Irmos: Establish us in Thee, O Lord, who by the wood of the Cross didst put sin to death, and didst implant the fear of Thee in our hearts, as we sing praises to Thee.

Thou didst chose to live in the cellar of a church rather than in well-appointed rooms, O father, for thou wouldst rather be a servant in the house of God than to dwell in the tents of sinners.

From thy youth thou didst emulate Christ God, who in the flesh labored in the house of the carpenter Joseph, O father John, and didst thyself never shrink from hard labor, saying that work is the best means of warding off evil.

The faithless howled at thee like dogs, unable to bear thy indictments against them, and they subjected thee to horrendous tortures before finally burning thee to death; but thou, O father John, feared neither the pain of torture nor the flames, for thou didst quench them both.

Theotokion: Thou, O Theotokos, gavest birth without knowing man to the Incarnate Word of God, whom the holy hieromartyr John courageously confessed, being a victorious warrior of Christ.

Katavasia: "In thy divine glory, O Theotokos, living and abounding fountain..."

Sessional Hymn, in Tone 1:

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Bearing the threats and accusations the godless made against thee / And the tortures they inflicted on thee, /

Deeply didst thou drink of the cup of martyrdom, /

Suffering for the truth and thy love for the Church. /

O, bestow thy compassion on me, thy servant, out of the depths of thy tender mercy; for thou didst give birth to the compassionate One, the Savior of all those who praise thee.

While delighting in thy gifts, O immaculate one, we sing a song of thanksgiving to thee, knowing thee to be the Mother of God.

As I lie on the bed of my pain and infirmity, do thou help me, as thou art a lover of goodness, O Theotokos, who alone art Ever-virgin.

Having thee as our staff and hope, and as our salvation's unshakable defense, we are delivered from all adversity, O thou all-praised one.

Irmos: I have heard, O Lord, the news of Thy dispensation, and I have glorified Thee who alone lovest mankind.

Thy steadfast heart did not waver under the assaults of the godless, O Passion-bearer John, and the burning fervor of thy faith proved mightier than the flames of fire.

Having rebuilt many temples destroyed by the heretics, O father John, thou didst reveal thyself a living temple of the Holy Spirit.

"Not unto us, O Lord — not unto us, but to the glory of Thy name," thou didst say every day of thy life, O father John, for neither fire, nor sword, nor death, could separate thee from the love of God.

Theotokion: Illumine my darkened soul with thy light, O pure Lady, for thou hast given birth to the everlasting Light.

Ode 5 The Supplicatory Canon to the Theotokos

Irmos: Enlighten us by Thy commandments, O Lord, and by Thine uplifted arm grant us Thy peace, O Lover of mankind.

Fill my heart with gladness, O pure Lady, with thine incorruptible joy, for thou didst bear the Cause of all joy.

Deliver us from dangers, O pure Theotokos, who didst give birth to Eternal Redemption, and to the Peace that doth pass all understanding.

Dispel the darkness of my sins, O Bride of God, by the radiance of thy splendor for thou didst bear the divine and pre-eternal Light.

Heal, O pure one, the infirmity of my soul, when thou hast deemed me worthy of thy visitation, and grant me health by thy blessèd intercessions.

Irmos: O Lord, Bestower of light and Creator of the ages, by the light of Thine ordinances guide Thou us, for we know no other God but Thee.

The cities of Chernigov and Vologdá were blessed to hear thy teachings, O father, and Minsk, Tambov, and Penza also had thee as their pastor; and Riga received thy most holy relics, O father John, and having committed thy body to flames there, thou hast illuminated all the ends of the earth.

Thou wast truly an example of sobriety and fasting, a true monastic, a good shepherd, and a courageous defender of the Church from the godless enemy, O holy hierarch John.

Thy spiritual strength was invincible before the power of the enemy, O hierarch of Christ, John, and the diabolical plan of a certain woman to entice thee came to nought as thou didst prove thyself innocent and righteous before the Lord.

Theotokion: The Ancient of Days descended upon thee like dew upon the fleece, and from thy holy womb came forth the new Adam, the Lover of mankind.

Ode 6 The Supplicatory Canon to the Theotokos

Irmos: I will pour out my prayer before the Lord; I will make known to Him my sorrow, for my soul has been filled with afflictions, and my life has drawn near to hell, and like Jonah I will pray: O God, raise me up from corruption.

My nature, held by corruption and death, hath He saved out of death and corruption; for unto death hath He submitted Himself. Therefore, O Virgin, do thou intercede with Him who is thy Lord and Son, to deliver me from the wickedness of the enemy.

I know thee as the protection of my life, and a most safe fortress, O Virgin; disperse the horde of temptations, and drive away demonic vexation. Unceasingly I pray to thee: Deliver me from the corruption of passions!

We have acquired thee as a wall of refuge, and the perfect salvation of our souls, and a relief in afflictions, O Maiden, and we ever rejoice in thy light. O Sovereign Lady, do thou also now save us from passions and dangers.

Bedridden, I lie supine with sickness now and there is no healing for my flesh; but to thee, O good one who gavest birth to God, the Savior of the world and the Healer of infirmities, I pray: Raise me up from the corruption of illness.

The Canon of the Holy Hieromartyr

Irmos: An abyss of sins has finally encompassed me; but, O Lord, lead my life up from corruption as Thou hast led Joseph.

Thou didst expose the seething hatred of Satan's servants as they burned thee, O holy hierarch John, and thou didst bring thyself as a pure and blameless whole burnt offering unto the Savior of all.

Hierarchs and priests, and all the pious faithful praise thee, O father, who in life served as the pastor of Latvia, gathering all to the Orthodox Church.

Thou didst gird thyself in the simplicity and holiness of the Gospel, O hierarch John, and having thus armed thyself, thou wast revealed as a powerful preacher who destroyed the fortress of heresy.

Theotokion: As thou didst conceive the pure Lamb who taketh away the sin of the world, O immaculate Lady, entreat Him to grant thy servants the remission of all their sins.

Katavasia: "Let us clap our hands in gladness..."

The Kontakion of the Hieromartyr, in Tone 2:

<u>Thou</u> didst accept the divinely inspired con<u>fe</u>ssor John, / Who endured great torments and wast <u>burned</u> to death, / As a <u>pure</u> and whole-burnt <u>offering</u>, O Lord, /// Who alone doth so glorify Thy saints.

Ikos: Enlighten the darkness of my mind, O Christ, as I dare to open my mouth and extol the labors and sufferings of Thy hieromartyr John, who amazed all the visible and invisible powers with his great deeds and sufferings; by protecting the oppressed from the oppressors; by never bowing in fear before the powerful; by exposing the deceit of liars and the godless; and in every way confirming Orthodoxy — who, for all these, was subjected to arrests, slander, oppression, deprivation, and even death by fire, and whom Thou didst glorify, for Thou alone art He who doth so glorify Thy saints.

Ode 7 The Supplicatory Canon to the Theotokos

Irmos: The children of Judæa who dwelt of old in Babylon trampled underfoot the flames of the furnace by their faith in the Trinity, as they sang: Blessèd art Thou, O God of our fathers.

Having willed to accomplish our salvation, O Savior, Thou didst dwell in the womb of the Virgin, and didst show her forth unto the world as its intercessor. Blessèd art Thou, O God of our fathers.

Pray to Him, the Dispenser of mercy whom thou didst bear, O pure Mother, and implore Him to deliver from all transgressions and defilements the souls of those who with faith cry out: Blessèd art Thou, O God of our fathers.

A treasury of salvation and a fountain of incorruption is she who gave Thee birth; a tower of safety and a gate of repentance hast Thou proved her to those who cry: Blessèd art Thou, O God of our fathers.

Grant healing from physical weakness and spiritual infirmities to those who with love draw near to thy protection, O Virgin Theotokos, for thou gavest birth to Christ our Savior.

The Canon of the Holy Hieromartyr

Irmos: The three children trampled upon the ungodly command to adore the golden idol on the field of Dura, and besprinkled with dew in the midst of the fire sang: Blessèd art Thou, O Lord God of our fathers.

By the flames of thy sufferings, O divinely blessèd John, thou didst extinguish the flames of godlessness, and by the copious streams of thy blood thou didst drown the incorporeal enemies, as thou didst sing: Blessèd art Thou, O God of our fathers.

Thou didst arise as sweet-smelling incense, O wise one, to thy Creator, dispersing the foul stench of deceit, as thou didst cry aloud: Blessèd art Thou, O God of our fathers.

Thou didst imitate the three youths in the furnace, O blessèd father John, as thou didst cry out amidst the flames: Blessèd art Thou, O God of our fathers.

Theotokion: Thou alone art the Mother of God, O most pure Virgin Mother who knewest no wedlock, and therefore we piously sing aloud to thee: Blessèd art thou who gavest birth to God in the flesh.

Ode 8

The Supplicatory Canon to the Theotokos

Irmos: The King of heaven whom the hosts of angels praise, let us praise and exalt throughout all ages.

Disdain not those who need thy help, O Virgin, and who hymn and supremely exalt thee unto all ages.

Thou healest the infirmity of my soul and the pains of my body, O Virgin, that I may glorify thee, O pure one, unto all ages.

Thou pourest forth a wealth of healing on those who with faith sing praises unto thee,

O Virgin, and who supremely exalt thine ineffable childbearing.

Thou drivest away the assaults of temptations and the attacks of the passions, O Virgin; Wherefore do we sing thee hymns unto all ages.

The Canon of the Holy Hieromartyr

Irmos: God came down upon the Hebrew children in the fiery furnace and changed the flames into dew. *Praise the works of the Lord and exalt Him throughout all ages.*

Thy pastoral staff, O holy and glorious hierarch, father John, brought many to the Orthodox Church, and we all cry out together with thee: Praise the works of the Lord and exalt Him throughout all ages.

Courageously didst thou face the flames of the fire as did the Hebrew children, and like them didst thou cry aloud: Praise the works of the Lord and exalt Him throughout all ages.

With firm resolve didst thou prove thyself stronger than the unbearable flames, as if it were not thine own body that was set alight, as thou didst sing to the Lord exalting Him forever.

Let us bless the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, the Lord, now and ever...,

Theotokion: A miraculous cloud and pillar of fire led thee to thy heavenly inheritance, O pure Theotokos! Be thou the same to me, O immaculate Virgin, for I wander and am lost in the wilderness.

We praise, bless, and worship the Lord, singing and exalting Him throughout all ages!

Katavasia: "The Offspring of the Theotokos..."

The Magnificat is sung: "My soul magnifies the Lord..."

Ode 9

The Supplicatory Canon to the Theotokos

Irmos: Saved through thee, O pure Virgin, we confess thee to be truly Theotokos, and with the choirs of angels we magnify thee.

- O Virgin who didst give birth to Christ, who doth wipe away every tear from every face: turn not away from the torrent of my tears.
- O Virgin who didst receive the fullness of joy, and didst banish the grief of sin: fill my heart with joy.

Be thou the haven and protection, the unshakable wall, the refuge, the shelter, and the joy of those who flee to thee, O Virgin.

Illumine with the rays of thy light, O Virgin, those who piously confess thee to be the Theotokos, and banish from them the darkness of ignorance.

I am brought low by mine afflictions and infirmities, but do thou, O Virgin, heal me, bringing me from illness into health.

The Canon of the Holy Hieromartyr

Irmos: God the Word from God, who in His ineffable Wisdom came to renew Adam, grievously fallen through food into corruption, and who was made flesh ineffably for our sakes from the Virgin, do ye faithful magnify in hymns with one accord.

While preparing them for the storm, thou didst teach thy flock that the wages of the godless and faithless sins of Israel of old in the wilderness will be visited upon the offspring of the New Israel, for God remaineth the same through all ages; and that a pasture of salvation hath been prepared for the faithful through the grace of God.

Today the city of Riga commemorates thy divine sufferings as being her stalwart protector and defender, together with all who, in every city and land, are protected by thy holy prayers.

Thou dost shine down like the sun, O father John, calling the people of God to unity in Christ, illumining all the Church with thy radiance, O wonder-worthy martyr, and giving us solace through the warmth of thy fervent love as we bless thy holy memory.

Theotokion: O Virgin, being thyself the gateway of the divine Radiance, enlighten my darkened soul with the immaterial rays of thy divine light, and by thy prayers and those of the holy hieromartyr John, deliver me from the eternal fire, that I may ever sing thy praise with faith and love.

Katavasia: "Let every earth-born exult..."

Exapostilarion of the Hieromartyr:

Having been tested as gold both by torture and by fire, thou didst accept the grace of heaven from the hand of God. Cease not to pray for us, O holy hieromartyr, father John. (twice)

Glory..., now and ever.... Theotokion:

By thy mighty protection, O pure Lady, preserve us all of us, thy servants unharmed from the attacks of the enemy; for we have thee as our only refuge in our time of need.

At the Praises, 4 stichera, in Tone 8: To the melody, "O most glorious wonder..."

O most glorious wonder! /

The glorious flower of the Latvian lands /

Is perfuming the Church with its sweet-smelling fragrance, /

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Giving joy to all who celebrate and sing: /
Rejoice, most-wondrous hierarch! /
Rejoice, our heavenly and divine protector! /
And accept from our unworthy lips /
These songs of praise which we offer to thee ///
O thou, who hast been so glorified by God!

Therefore, we entreat thee, O holy father John: ///
Ever pray for us who honor thy holy memory.
Now and ever..., Theotokion, in the same Tone:
Accept, O Sovereign Lady /
The prayers of us, thy servants, ///
And deliver us from every danger and necessity.
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The Great Doxology, the Troparion of the saint, usual Litanies, and the Dismissal.

Liturgy

At the Beatitudes, 8 troparia: 4 from the Third Ode and 4 from the Sixth Ode of the canon of the saint.

- 1. Thou didst chose to live in the cellar of a church rather than in well-appointed rooms, O father, for thou wouldst rather be a servant in the house of God than to dwell in the tents of sinners.
- **2.** From thy youth thou didst emulate Christ God, who in the flesh labored in the house of the carpenter Joseph, O father John, and didst thyself never shrink from hard labor, saying that work is the best means of warding off evil.
- **3.** The faithless howled at thee like dogs, unable to bear thy indictments against them, and they subjected thee to horrendous tortures before finally burning thee to death; but thou, O father John, feared neither the pain of torture nor the flames, for thou didst quench them both.
- **4.** *Theotokion:* Thou, O Theotokos, gavest birth without knowing man to the Incarnate Word of God, whom the holy hieromartyr John courageously confessed, being a victorious warrior of Christ.
- **5.** Thou didst expose the seething hatred of Satan's servants as they burned thee, O holy hierarch John, and thou didst bring thyself as a pure and blameless whole burnt offering unto the Savior of all.
- **6.** Hierarchs and priests, and all the pious faithful praise thee, O father, who in life served as the pastor of Latvia, gathering all to the Orthodox Church.
- **7.** Thou didst gird thyself in the simplicity and holiness of the Gospel, O hierarch John, and having thus armed thyself, thou wast revealed as a powerful preacher who destroyed the fortress of heresy.
- **8.** *Theotokion:* As thou didst conceive the pure Lamb who taketh away the sin of the world, O immaculate Lady, entreat Him to grant thy servants the remission of all their sins.

The Troparion of the Saint, in Tone 4:

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Being filled with the divine grace of <u>go</u>dliness; /
O holy hiero<u>martyr</u> John, /
Thou didst shine forth as the good pastor of the <u>La</u>tvian lands, /
And laid low the powers of <u>go</u>dlessness. /
Having kindled the ember of God's love in thy mind, /
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Courageously didst thou face death by bearing the <u>flames</u> of fire. / And bearing the name proclaiming the <u>grace</u> of God / Thou dost now pour God's grace upon all who <u>call</u> on thy name. / Therefore, we implore thee to beseech <u>Christ</u> God / That He may grant the remission of sins /// To all who lovingly celebrate thy holy memory.

The Kontakion of the Saint, in Tone 2:

<u>Thou</u>, didst accept the divinely inspired con<u>fe</u>ssor John, / Who endured great torments and wast <u>burned</u> to death, / As a <u>pure</u> and whole-burnt <u>offering</u>, O Lord, /// Who alone doth so <u>glorify</u> Thy saints.

The Prokeimenon, in Tone 4: Thou hast tried us with fire / as silver is tried. *Verse:* We went through fire and water, and Thou didst lead us to a place of rest.

The Epistle: (334) Hebrews 13:7-16

The Alleluia, in Tone 2: Thy priests shall be clothed with righteousness, and Thy saints shall rejoice! *Verse:* I waited patiently for the Lord; He inclined to me and heard my prayer.

The Gospel: (67) Luke 12:32-40

Communion Hymn: The righteous shall be in everlasting remembrance. He shall not be afraid of evil tidings. Alleluia....
