### **Vespers**

After the Introductory Psalm, "Blessèd is the man...," the first Kathisma. At "Lord, I call...," 8 stichera.

### 3 stichera from the Pentecostarion and

**5 stichera, in Tone 8:** To the melody, "O glorious wonder...."

O blessèd John, the forerunner of Christ,
Thy head hath risen from the earth /
Shining forth more brightly than the Sun. /
It illumines all the faithful /
Who draw from it a wealth of grace /
Thus sanctifying our bodies, minds and souls.
Holding it now as a divine treasure /

# O blessèd forerunner of Christ, /

We <u>ce</u>lebrate the third finding of thy <u>pre</u>cious head / Which was crowned by the Holy <u>Tri</u>nity / When severed for the <u>sake</u> of thy <u>zeal</u>ous love. / And now upon its discovery, O <u>glorious</u> one, / The hosts of angels and the assembly of the <u>martyrs</u>, / The ranks of divine apostles and <u>all</u> the <u>prophets</u> rejoice; / Together with them, remember us, O Fore<u>ru</u>nner of the Lord!

# Glory..., in Tone 6:

Thy divinely preserved head, O Fore<u>runner</u>, / Which hath shone forth from the <u>bosom</u> of the earth; / Is a treasury of divine gifts; /

For we who accept and <u>venerate</u> it with faith, / Are enriched with the most wondrous <u>miracles</u>, / And the forgiveness of our trans<u>gressions</u>, /// O Baptist of Christ our Savior.

## The Entrance and the Prokeimenon of the Day.

# **Three Readings:**

### The Reading from the Prophecy of Isaiah: (Composite 8, Chaps. 40, 41, 45, 48, 54)

IS. 40:1 Thus saith the Lord: "Comfort ye, comfort ye My people, 2"Speak, ye priests, to the heart of Jerusalem; comfort her, for her humiliation is accomplished, her iniquity is put away, for she hath received of the Lord's hand double that of her sins." <sup>3</sup>The voice of one crying in the wilderness: "Prepare ye the way of the Lord; make straight the paths of our God. 9O thou that bringest glad tidings to Sion, get thee up upon the high mountain; lift up thy voice with strength, thou that bringest glad tidings to Jerusalem; lift it up, be not afraid! 41:17I, the Lord God, the God of Israel, will hear and will not forsake them. <sup>18</sup>But I will open rivers on the mountains and fountains in the midst

of plains; I will make the wilderness pools of water and watercourses of a thirsty land. 45:8Let the heavens rejoice from above, and let the clouds rain righteousness; let the earth bring forth and bloom mercy and likewise bring forth righteousness ... 48:20 Declare this with a voice of joy and let this be made known, proclaim it to the ends of the earth; say, 'The Lord hath delivered His servant Jacob.' <sup>21</sup>And if they thirst He shall lead them through the desert; He shall bring forth water out of the rock to them. 54:1Rejoice, thou barren that bearest not; break forth and cry, thou that travailest not, for more are the children of the desolate than of her that hath a husband."

# The Reading from Prophecy of Malachi: (Composite 9, Chapters 3, 4)

MAL.3:1 Thus saith the Lord Almighty: "Behold, I send My messenger, and he shall prepare the way before Me. And the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come into His temple, <sup>2</sup>but who shall with-stand at His appearing? For He cometh in as the fire of a furnace and as

the herb of fullers. <sup>3</sup>He shall sit to melt and purify as it were silver and as it were gold, <sup>5</sup>and He will draw near to you in judgment, and He will be a swift witness against the witches and against the adulteresses and against them that swear falsely by My name and against them that keep back the hireling's wages and them that oppress the widow and afflict the fatherless and that wrest the judgment of the stranger and fear not Me," saith the Lord Almighty. 6"For I am the Lord your God, and I am not changed, but ye the sons of Jacob have not refrained from the iniquities of your fathers. Ye have perverted My statutes and have not kept them. Return unto Me, and I will return unto you," saith the Lord Almighty 12...and all nations shall call you blessèd. And they shall understand that I am the Lord, who 18 discerneth between the righteous

and the wicked on that day, in which I shall act to spare those who love Me. <sup>4:6</sup>"Remember ye the law of My servant Moses accordingly as I charged him in Horeb for all Israel, even the commandments and ordinances. <sup>4:4</sup>And behold, I will send you Elijah the Tishbite before the great and glorious day of the Lord cometh, <sup>5</sup>who shall turn again the heart of the father to the son and the heart of a man to his neighbor, lest I come and smite the earth grievously," saith the Lord Almighty, God, the Holy One of Israel.

### The Reading from the Wisdom of Solomon: (Composite 3, Chapters 4, 5)

The righteous man, though he die early yet shall he be at rest. <sup>16</sup>Thus the righteous that is dead shall condemn the ungodly which are living, <sup>17</sup> for they shall see the end of the wise, and shall not understand what God in His counsel hath decreed for him, <sup>19</sup>For He shall rend them, and cast them down headlong, that they shall be speechless; and He shall shake them from the foundations, and they shall be utterly laid waste and be in sorrow, and their memorial shall perish. <sup>20</sup>And when they cast up the account of their sins they shall come with fear, and their own iniquities shall convict them to their face. 5:1-7 Then shall the righteous man stand in great boldness before the face of such as have afflicted him, and made no account of his labors. <sup>2</sup>When they see it, they shall be troubled with terrible fear, and shall be amazed at the strangeness of his salvation, so far beyond all that they looked for. <sup>3</sup>And they, repenting and groaning for anguish of spirit shall say within themselves, "This was he, whom we held at one time in derision, and a proverb of reproach; 4we fools accountted his life madness, and his end to be without honor: 5how he is numbered among the children of God, and his lot is among the saints! 6Therefore have we erred from the way of truth, and the light of righteousness hath not shined unto us, and the sun of righteousness rose not upon us. <sup>7</sup>We wearied ourselves in the way of wickedness and destruction: yea. we have gone through deserts, where there lay no way; but the way of the Lord, we have not known.

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### The Canon of the Saint

During the season of Pentecost, first the Canon from the Pentecostarion, with 6 Troparia including the Irmosi, and that of the Forerunner, with 8 Troparia, in Tone 8.

But if this day falls during the Apostles' Fast,

then first, the Supplicatory Canon to the Mother of God (*Paraklesis*) with 6 Troparia, followed by the Canon of the Forerunner, with 8 Troparia.
