The $5^{\text {th }}$ Day of August Forefeast of Transfiguration, and the Commemoration of the Holy Martyr Eusignius.

## Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 6 stichera,
3 stichera of the Forefeast, in Tone 4: To the melody, "Thou hast given a sign...."
Come, and let us go up with Jesus /
As He ascends the holy mountain. /
There let us hear the voice of the Living God - $/$
The Father without beginning, /
In a bright cloud witnessing with the Holy Spirit /
To His relationship of eternal Sonship. /
And, with our minds enlightened, ///
In the Light let us see Light.
Come, and let us rejoice as we cleanse and prepare ourselves /
To witness the divine ascent /
To the dwelling-place of the transcendent God, /
And let us partake of the glory /
Which the chosen apostles were permitted to behold ///
Mystically upon Mount Tabor.
Come, and let us transform ourselves for the better, /
Let us prepare ourselves well for the coming day /
When we shall ascend the holy mountain of God /
There to behold the perfect brightness of the glory of Christ /
Brighter than the sun /
And having been enlightened by the Triune light, ///
Let us glorify His descent to us.
And 3 stichera of the Martyr, in the same Tone: To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."
Dyed red with the blood of thy flesh, O glorious one /
And robed with the royal purple of divine grace /
Thou hast receíved the crown of incorruption upon thy head, /
And bearing in thy hand a scepter - 1
The trophy of the Cross ///
Thou dost now reign with Christ, O all-wise martyr Eusignius.

Thou wast known, O Eusignius, /
To be an invincible warrior armed with the weapon of the Cross. /
Thou didst go forth to battle against the enemy /
And brilliantly waging war against him thou didst cast him down. /
Therefore, thou didst receive thy crown of victory /
From the One Judge and Master of the contest ///
Who reigneth forever.
Through thine honorable passions, O glorious one,
Thou didst portray the honored Passion of Christ. /
And being victorious, O martyr Eusignius, /
Thou dwellest now in the city on high, /
Ever rejoicing with all the bearers of passions /
And becoming God-like through communion with the Godhead. ///
For this cause we celebrate thine honored and holy festival.
Glory..., now and ever..., of the Forefeast, in Tone 5:
Come, and let us ascend the mountain of the Lord, /
Into the house of God, /
And let us gaze upon the glory of His transfiguration /
The glory of the Only-begotten of the Father. /
Through Light, let us receive the Light /
And being exalted in spirit, ///
Let us forever hymn the consubstantial Trinity.
Or, Now and ever..., the Dogmatic Theotokion in the Tone of the Week if a Resurrection service.

At the Aposticha these stichera of the Forefeast, in Tone 2: To the melody, " $O$ House of Ephratha....,
Enlightened by the rays of good deeds /
Let us ascend the holy mountain, ///
That we may behold the divine transfiguration of the Lord!
Verse: Mercy and truth have met. Righteousness and peace have kissed each other
Today Christ is on the mountain shining like the sun /
Revealing to His disciples ///
A sign of His divinity before His crucifixion.
Verse: Blessèd are the people who know the festal shout!

Desiring to transform the nature of Adam /
Christ now ascends Mount Tabor ///
To reveal His divinity to His disciples.
Glory..., now and ever..., of the Forefeast, in the same Tone: To the regular melody
Thou wast transfigured on Mount Tabor, O Christ God, /
Revealing the glory of Thy divinity to Thy disciples. /
Illumine us also with the light of the knowledge of Thee /
And direct us on the path of Thy commandments, ///
For Thou alone art good and lovest mankind.
The Troparion of the Forefeast, in Tone 4:
Let us go forth to meet the Transfiguration of Christ /
Let us brightly celebrate the Forefeast, O ye faithful, and exclaim: /
The day of divine gladness is come upon us, /
The Master ascends upon Mount Tabor ///
To shine forth the beauty of His divinity. (once)

## Matins

After the $1^{\text {st }}$ Kathisma, the Sessional hymn, in Tone 4: To the melody, "Thou hast appeared...."
The most radiant festival of the Master hath arrived. /
Come, all ye people, and let us spiritually cleanse ourselves /
And let us ascend upon Mount Tabor ///
There to behold Christ.
Glory..., now and ever..., Repeat above.
After the $\mathbf{2}^{\text {nd }}$ Kathisma, the Sessional Hymn, in Tone 4: To the melody: "Joseph was amazed....,

Come, all ye faithful, /
And let us brightly celebrate the Forefeast of the Transfiguration of Christ; /
And with one voice let us cry aloud: /
Transfigure our nature, O Savior, /
Illumining it with Thy divine body, /
And grant to us its original gift of incorruption /

As Thou art merciful, ///
So that we may all glorify Thee our only God!
Glory..., now and ever..., Repeat above.

## The Canon

The Canon of the Forefeast, with 6 Troparia including the Irmos, and the Three-ode Canon with 4 Troparia, and one Canon of the Saint, with 4 Troparia. We also sing Odes 8 and 9 following this pattern; but for the rest of the Odes we sing to the Forefeast with 8 Troparia (including the Irmosi), and to the Saint, with 4 Troparia. If we serve the Forefeast on a Sunday, the Three-ode Canon is sung at Compline.

All human nature shines forth divinely today /
