The 5th Day of August

Forefeast of Transfiguration, and the Commemoration of the Holy Martyr Eusignius.

Vespers

At "Lord, I call...," 6 stichera,

3 stichera of the Forefeast, in Tone 4: To the melody, "Thou hast given a sign...."

Come, and let us go up with <u>Je</u>sus / As He ascends the holy <u>mountain</u>. / <u>There</u> let us hear the voice of the <u>Living God</u> — / The Father without be<u>ginning</u>, / In a bright cloud witnessing with the Holy <u>Spi</u>rit / To His relationship of eternal <u>Sonship</u>. / And, with our minds en<u>lightened</u>, /// In the Light let us <u>see</u> Light.

Come, and let us rejoice as we cleanse and pre<u>pare</u> ourselves / To witness the di<u>vine</u> ascent / To the <u>dwel</u>ling-place of the tran<u>sce</u>ndent God, / And let us partake of the <u>glory</u> / Which the chosen apostles were per<u>mitted</u> to behold /// Mystically upon Mount <u>Ta</u>bor.

Come, and let us transform ourselves for the <u>better</u>, / Let us prepare ourselves well for the <u>co</u>ming day / When we shall a<u>scend</u> the holy <u>mountain</u> of God / There to behold the perfect brightness of the <u>glory</u> of Christ / <u>Brighter</u> than the sun / And having been enlightened by the <u>Tri</u>une light, /// Let us glorify His de<u>scent</u> to us.

And 3 stichera of the Martyr, in the same Tone: To the melody, "As one valiant among the martyrs...."

Dyed red with the blood of thy flesh, O <u>glo</u>rious one / And robed with the royal purple of di<u>vine</u> grace / Thou hast re<u>ceíved</u> the crown of incorruption u<u>pon</u> thy head, / And bearing in thy hand a <u>sce</u>pter — / The <u>trophy</u> of the Cross /// Thou dost now reign with Christ, O all-wise martyr Eu<u>signius</u>.

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Thou wast known, O Eu<u>signius</u>, / To be an invincible warrior armed with the <u>weapon</u> of the Cross. / Thou didst go <u>forth</u> to battle against the <u>enemy</u> / And brilliantly waging war against him thou didst <u>cast</u> him down. / Therefore, thou didst receive thy crown of <u>vi</u>ctory / From the One Judge and Master of the <u>contest</u> /// Who reigneth for<u>ever</u>.

Through thine honorable passions, O <u>glo</u>rious one, / Thou didst portray the honored <u>Passion of Christ.</u> / And being vic<u>to</u>rious, O martyr Eu<u>signius</u>, / Thou dwellest now in the <u>ci</u>ty on high, / Ever rejoicing with all the bearers of <u>passions</u> / And becoming God-like through communion with the <u>Go</u>dhead. /// For this cause we celebrate thine honored and holy <u>fe</u>stival.

Glory..., now and ever..., of the Forefeast, in Tone 5:

<u>Come</u>, and let us ascend the <u>mountain of the Lord</u>, / Into the <u>house</u> of God, / And let us <u>gaze</u> upon the glory of His transfigu<u>ration</u> / The <u>glory</u> of the Only-begotten of the <u>Fa</u>ther. / Through Light, let us re<u>ceive</u> the Light / And being <u>exalted</u> in <u>spirit</u>, /// Let us forever hymn the consub<u>stantial Trinity</u>.

Or, **Now and ever...,** *the Dogmatic Theotokion in the Tone of the Week if a Resurrection service.*

At the Aposticha these stichera of the Forefeast, in Tone 2: *To the melody, "O House of Ephratha...."*

Enlightened by the rays of <u>good</u> deeds / Let us ascend the holy <u>mountain</u>, /// That we may behold the divine transfiguration <u>of</u> the Lord!

Verse: Mercy and truth have met. Righteousness and peace have kissed each other

Today Christ is on the mountain <u>shi</u>ning like the sun / Revealing to His di<u>sciples</u> ///

A sign of His divinity before His cruci<u>fi</u>xion.

Verse: Blessèd are the people who know the festal shout!

FOREFEAST OF TRANSFIGURATION; MARTYR EUSIGNIUS

Desiring to transform the nature of <u>A</u>dam / Christ now ascends Mount <u>Ta</u>bor /// To reveal His divinity to His di<u>sci</u>ples.

Glory..., now and ever..., of the Forefeast, in the same Tone: To the regular melody

Thou wast transfigured on Mount Tabor, O <u>Christ</u> God, / Revealing the glory of Thy divinity to Thy disciples. / <u>Illu</u>mine us also with the light of the <u>kno</u>wledge of Thee / And direct us on the path of Thy com<u>mandments</u>, /// For Thou alone art good and lovest <u>mankind</u>.

The Troparion of the Forefeast, in Tone 4:

Let us go forth to meet the Transfigu<u>ra</u>tion of Christ / Let us brightly celebrate the Forefeast, O ye <u>fai</u>thful, and exclaim: / The day of divine gladness is come upon us, / The Master ascends upon Mount <u>Tabor</u> /// To shine forth the beauty of His divinity. *(once)*

Matins

At "God is the Lord..." the Troparion of the Forefeast, "Let us go forth to meet" *(thrice)*

After the 1st Kathisma, the Sessional hymn, in Tone 4: To the melody, "Thou hast appeared...."

The most radiant festival of the Master <u>hath</u> arrived. / Come, all ye people, and let us spiritually <u>cleanse</u> ourselves / And let <u>us</u> ascend upon Mount <u>Tabor</u> /// There to be<u>hold</u> Christ.

Glory..., now and ever..., Repeat above.

After the 2nd Kathisma, the Sessional Hymn, in Tone 4: To the melody: "Joseph was amazed...."

Come, all ye <u>fai</u>thful, / And let us brightly celebrate the Forefeast of the Transfigu<u>ra</u>tion of Christ; / And with one <u>voice</u> let us <u>cry</u> aloud: / Transfigure our nature, O <u>Sa</u>vior, / Illumining it with Thy divine <u>bo</u>dy, / And grant to us its original gift of incor<u>ruption</u> / As Thou art <u>me</u>rciful, /// So that we may all glorify Thee our <u>o</u>nly God!

Glory..., now and ever..., Repeat above.

The Canon

The Canon of the Forefeast, with 6 Troparia including the Irmos, and the Three-ode Canon with 4 Troparia, and one Canon of the Saint, with 4 Troparia. We also sing Odes 8 and 9 following this pattern; but for the rest of the Odes we sing to the Forefeast with 8 Troparia (including the Irmosi), and to the Saint, with 4 Troparia. If we serve the Forefeast on a Sunday, the Three-ode Canon is sung at Compline. — Incomplete as of 3/2018

After the Sixth Ode, the Kontakion of the Forefeast, in Tone 4:

All human nature shines forth di<u>vi</u>nely today / Because of the divine Transfigu<u>ra</u>tion, /// Crying out in gladness: Christ is Transfigured, <u>saving all</u>!

Note: No Troparion or Kontakion is given for the Martyr in the Menaion.

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
